## A Beacon in the Fog

Free coffee, we assume it; free lunch, we expect it—but a Light in our Disaster Fog? A complete surprise!

Participants at the April Citywide NERT exercise were surprised and excited to receive the first edition of the NERT Field Operations Guide or FOG! Lt. Arteseros chose the April Drill for the roll out of the FOG for the obvious reason: she would have 250 plus NERTs in one place at the same time—what better way to deliver a great book!

The slim, compact booklet packs decades of information and experience into 70 pages. From Acronyms to Utilities Shut Off, it offers guidance throughout the first 72 hours after a disaster, whether you are part of command staff in the staging area or doing search and rescue in your neighborhood.

Thanks are owed to the Woodside Fire Department's CERT folks for allowing SF NERT to use their FOG as a model and guideline for our own. NERT volunteer authors and reviewers made changes to adjust for specific needs here in San Francisco—where our city is our county—and cover all the potential activities NERTs might be called to respond to, and included San Francisco emergency addresses and radio frequencies. Lt. Arteseros made sure it was up-to-date with recent changes in ICS and search and rescue markings, and accurate for NERT training.

What is so neat-cool-awesome-fabulous is that we now have a stuff-it-in-your-back-pocket operations guide that we can take everywhere and be ready for anything! Thanks again to Woodside CERT for their generosity, to our own NERT writers for their work, and to Doug Adams, author of *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy*, for the NERT-like advice: "Don't Panic." And with our Field Operations Guide lighting the way, we'll shine whatever the disaster! ☺

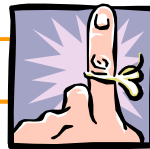

## An April Drill Epiphany by Chaplain Earl Rogers

The Citywide drill this April was my very first and I learned a lot of things, but three were deeply impressed in my mind. First, my neighborhood, Tenderloin/City Center, had so few NERTs there. With luck, it's because they were busy with other things. More probably, there are only a few of us who are NERT trained, and, in a disaster, we could be overwhelmed by the number of people needing help. We'll also be surrounded by a sea of willing people, wanting to help, but who have no idea what to do. So it is not enough that I know what to do. I must be able to teach others, in a short time and under stress, what to do while making sure they don't become victims! And I think this is true of many neighborhoods. So the first lesson: recruit as many people in the Tenderloin as possible now to get NERT training. There is safety in numbers!

The second thing—NERT is first response training but first response ends at some time and we start recovery. For the first 6, 24, 72 hours after a quake, we are going to be extremely busy, but what happens after that? I have no idea and I need to know because people will be asking me "What now?" I am assuming that the professionals will step in—state and city agencies, FEMA, Red Cross—but even if they do, they'll need help—our neighbors will continue to need help. NERTs need to think about it now—a first response, no matter how good, needs good follow-up.

The third thing that really hit home is that we need to be prepared to survive. Having a few basics and knowing how to take care of yourself beats the heck out of scrounging for a flashlight in the dark, not knowing what to do for yourself or those who need care. In short: **Prior Preparation Prevents Poor Performance!** Anything, even the smallest thing, that you can do in advance, you should do—now. For NERTs that also means Practice Practice Practice! We will need to be ready for anything and everything. God bless. ☺

### HAYES VALLEY

A small and dedicated core group of Hayes Valley NERTs continue to meet monthly to develop neighborhood outreach for Block Captains and to our neighbors. Our meeting fell on the 21st anniversary of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster. We remembered the victims by reading of their experiences and were struck by the similarities between that event and Hurricane Katrina. Too few evacuation buses too late; too little information about what was happening; the forced abandonment of pets and personal resources were just a few of the hardships facing the citizens of Pripyat and, 20 years later, of New Orleans. Worlds and years apart, yet so alarmingly alike. It made us feel lucky and grateful for NERT and our NERT training.

## FOG Shines for Hams Too by Bob Jacklevich

NERT Hams—good news for you! Our new Field Operations Guide gives guidance to all NERT communicators (HCT members) and NERT staging area command staff on what is expected of us and how to handle emergency communications (E-coms).

The Ham Radio Communications chapter (Chapter 9, page 28) gives the 'how to do it'. Following the basic instructions in the FOG, combined with taking NERT HCT E-Com training, will give you the tools to do one of the most important jobs: communications. After a disaster, NERT field assessments of damage, information on infrastructure, and neighborhood information reported to the Emergency District Coordination Centers (EDCC, former ERD) are vital to City leaders for dealing with the situation city-wide.

Rules of the E-Com road are simple:

- ✓ Send messages when you are told to do so—do not send messages without authorization
- ✓ Keep your messages to about 30 words
- ✓ Write down the message and read it through before sending it
- ✓ Send 5 to 7 words at a time, say stop. When the operator at the EDCC (ERD) acknowledges receiving your message, send the next 5 to 7 words, until the message is complete.



The Field Operations Guide lists basic equipment ham operators should carry, but you should ask yourself: what do I need to do the job? You need everything!

- ✓ your own two-meter radio and an extra two-meter capable antenna
- ✓ power cables and connectors, and extra batteries
- ✓ pencils—lots of pencils
- ✓ paper—message forms are best, lined pads keep you neat
- ✓ flashlight and extra batteries
- ✓ warm clothes, sunscreen, hat
- ✓ personal medical kit
- ✓ chewing gum—keep your mouth and throat from drying out
- ✓ your brains and patience!

These are the **things** you need. The knowledge and experience you bring are equally, if not more important, than the equipment. Attending drills, taking classes, using your radio equipment regularly are a must to be successful NERT communicators. So, when it gets hot (in a disaster), bring on the FOG to clear the way! ☐



## Riding the [Air] Waves

"Siren Net", every Tuesday at noon, is your chance to call in and report on the operation of sirens located throughout the City. Call in on the W6TP repeater: 443.100+ pl 114.8 or 146.79-pl 114.8.

San Francisco's geography makes it necessary to use different repeaters. Hams on the north and west sides of the City should use 145.150; on the east and south sides, use 146.79- or 443.100 pl 114.8. Red Cross Mass Care Shelter simplex frequency is 147.420; monitor 145.15+ and 146.79-.

The San Francisco Amateur Radio Club is another resource for Hams. Call 415-563-2111 or check the web site, [www.sfarc.org](http://www.sfarc.org) or phone 415-245-1114. The SFARC radio net is Mondays at 8 p.m. on the W6PW repeater, 145.150-pl 114.8.



## We're Number One!

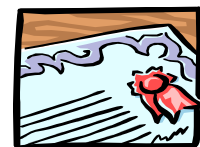

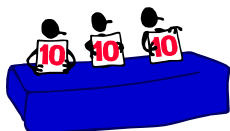
