Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation Launches County-Wide Campaign To Prevent Hot Liquid Burns to Children

WHAT: The Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation (AARBF) will unveil its

broad-reaching campaign to prevent scald injuries to infants and toddlers. Hot liquid burns (scalds) affect thousands of children under the age of five in California each year. As one of the most damaging injuries a child can face, burns often lead to a lifetime of surgeries and disfigurement. AARBF is focused on alerting parents to this danger and teaching them how to protect their children.

The campaign, funded by a grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), will inform families through advertisements on public transportation in San Francisco County, presentations to parenting groups and free age-appropriate scald prevention kits distributed by AARBF and partner organizations.
