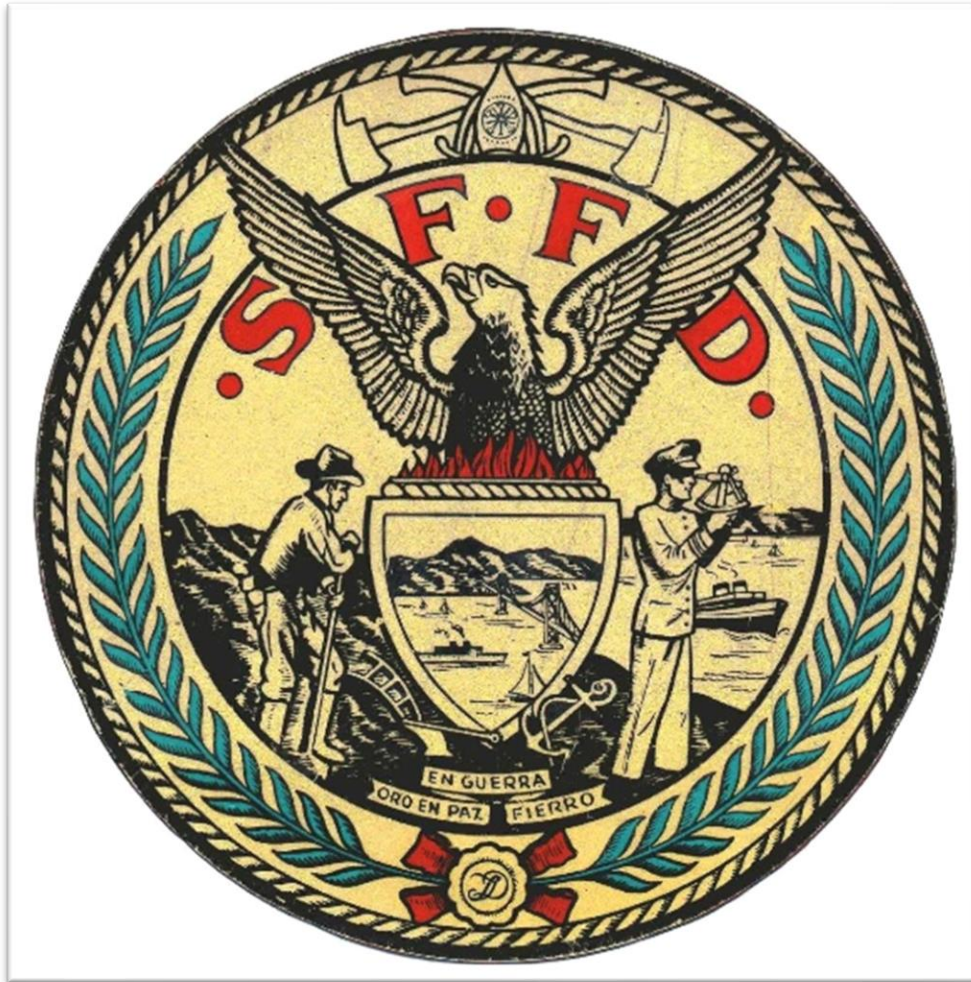

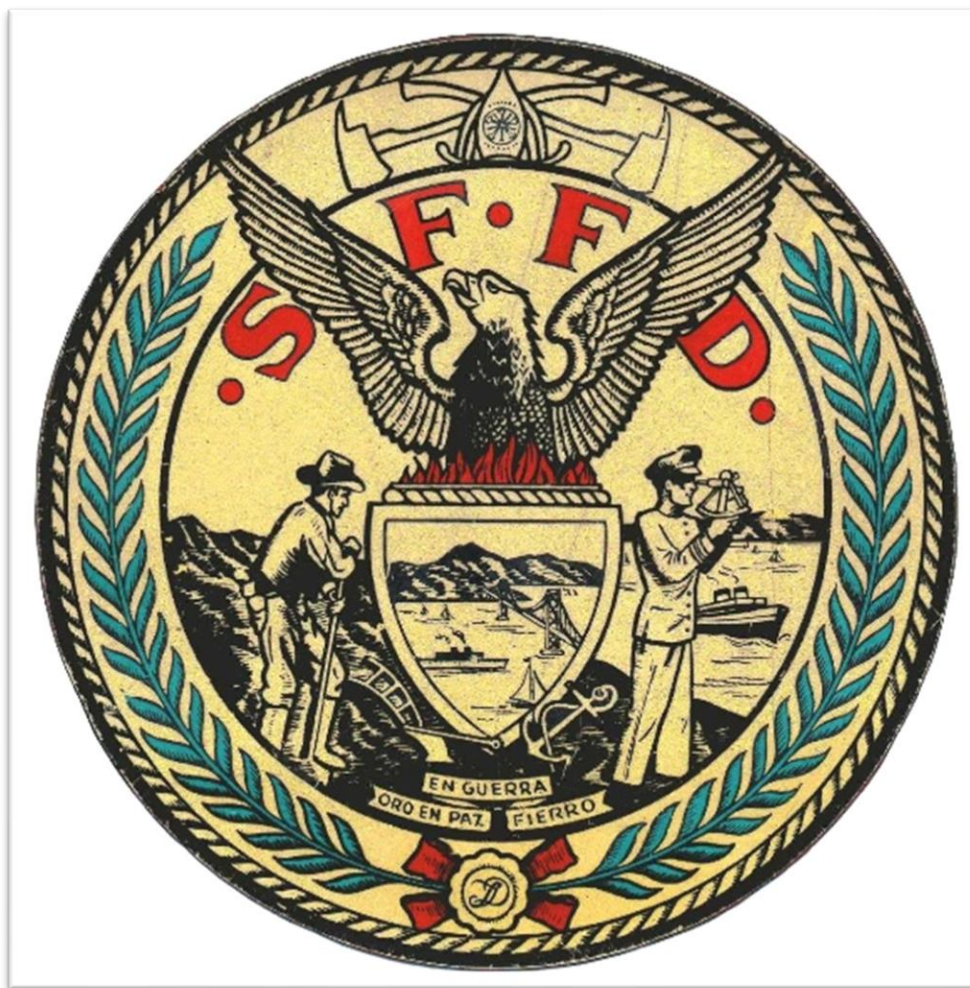

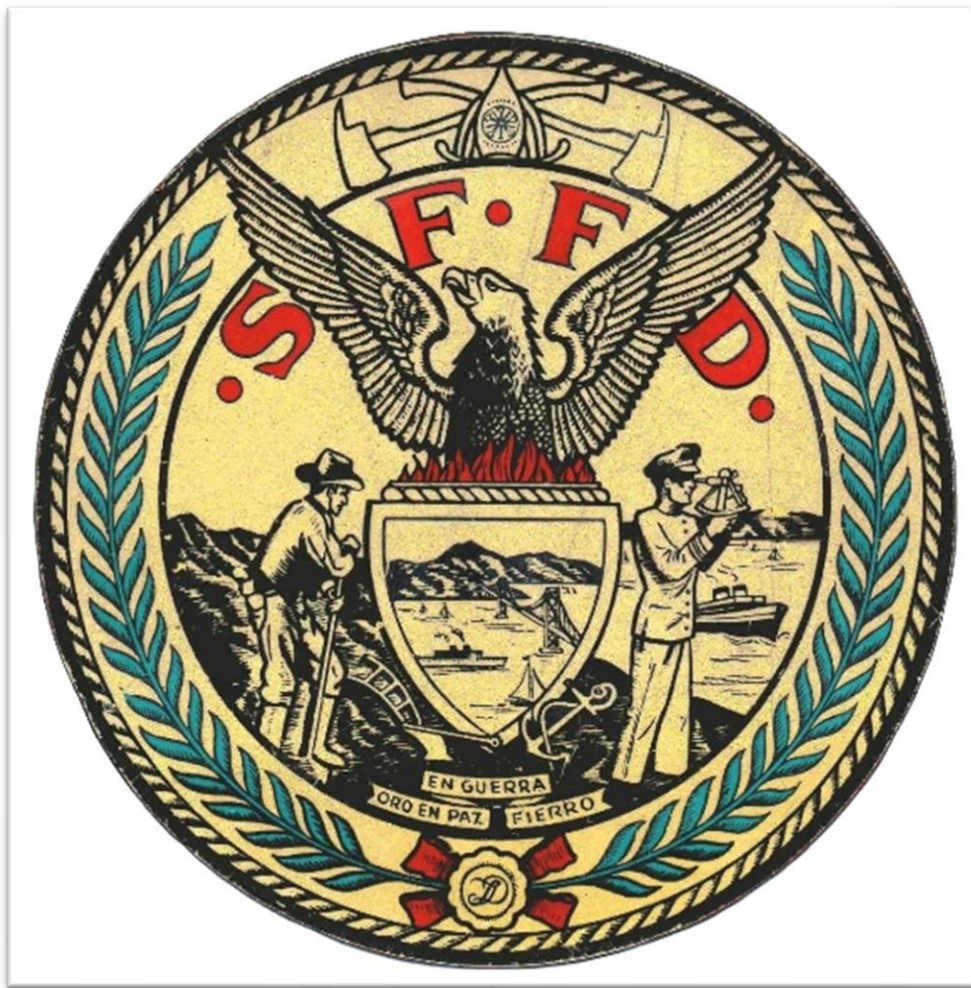

COVID is Ongoing:

May of 2022 should have been a quiet month in the Physician's Office, but we had an unexpected surge of COVID cases: **84**. This was equal to surges we experienced in August of 2021 and December of 2020, but still much less than our giant surge in Dec-January of 21/22.

Luckily, most cases were mild and were back to work after 10 day isolation. While there were a couple of Station clusters, most cases could be characterized as "community acquired."

Most of our Department is boosted, so many of these infections were "breakthrough". Again, few people had moderate or severe illness and many were asymptomatic.

They Physician's Office continues to encourage indoor K95 mask usage and ventilation mitigation to curb this very infectious variant.

UCSF Occupational Health Nursing Students Visit:

Nurse Practitioner Stephanie Phelps hosted 5 UCSF Occupational Health students and 1 Professor on a site visit to Headquarters and Station 4. She gave them an overview of our operations and work with Health and Safety.

End of Probation for 129th Probationary Firefighters

Our Office has begun doing End of Probation medical screens for probationary firefighters from the 127th Academy. We performed 8 in May, and will complete the rest in June.

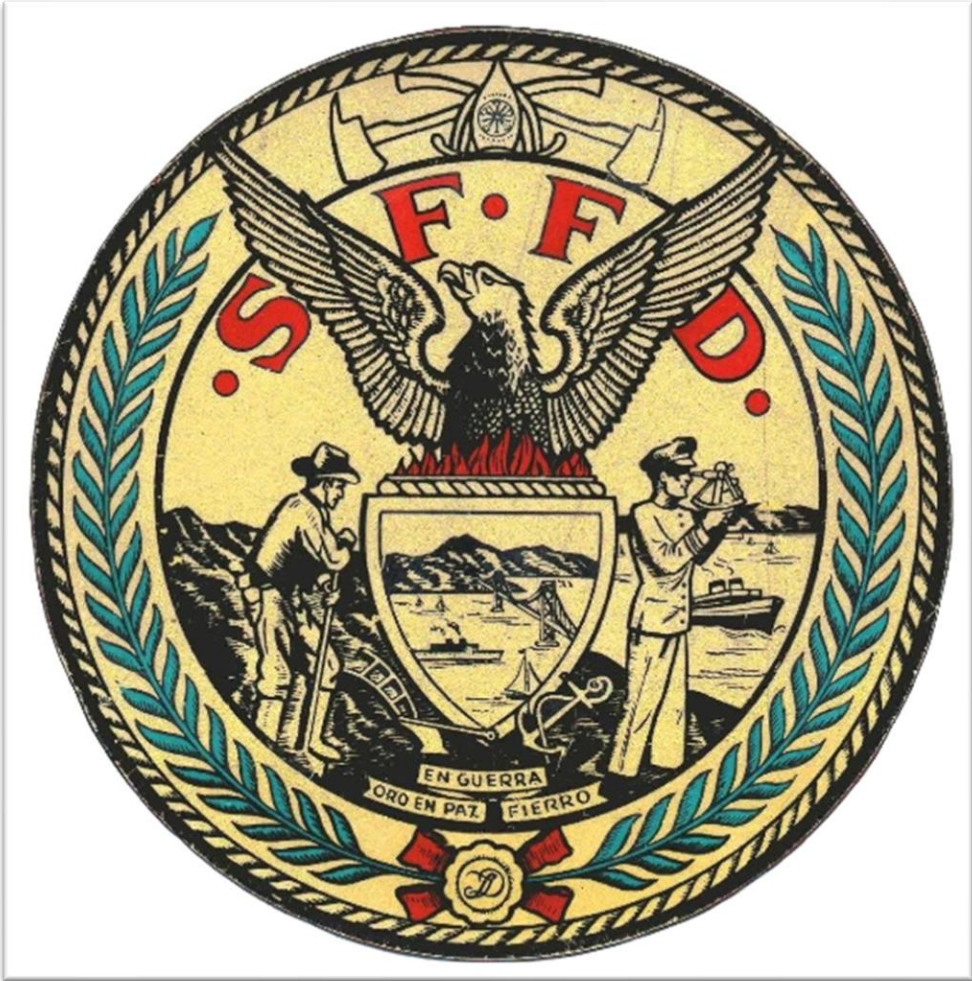

Fireboat/BOE DOT Random Testing

One Random test was performed by Energetix. It was Negative.

Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Fourteen members were randomly selected and tested; results were negative. Reviewed current contracts with CDT to streamline testing and cut costs. Working with Physician's office on new proposal. 798 Union has agreed to resume testing.

Post-Accident Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Two Post-Accident Alcohol and Drug test were administered this month, results negative.

Conditional Offer, Promotional and End-of-Probation Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Cpt. Aspelin was not utilized to assist the Physician's Office for preliminary alcohol and drug tests for Promotional and End-of-Probation physicals.

Breathalyzers

Five have been sent in for the next round of re-certifications. There is a backlog at Intoximeters, causing a major delay in return of our meters. This has affected our ability to test in the field and Physicians Office. Expected return is the first week of July.

Captain Aspelin attended the Marine Rescue Committee and Strike Team Leader Refresher class.

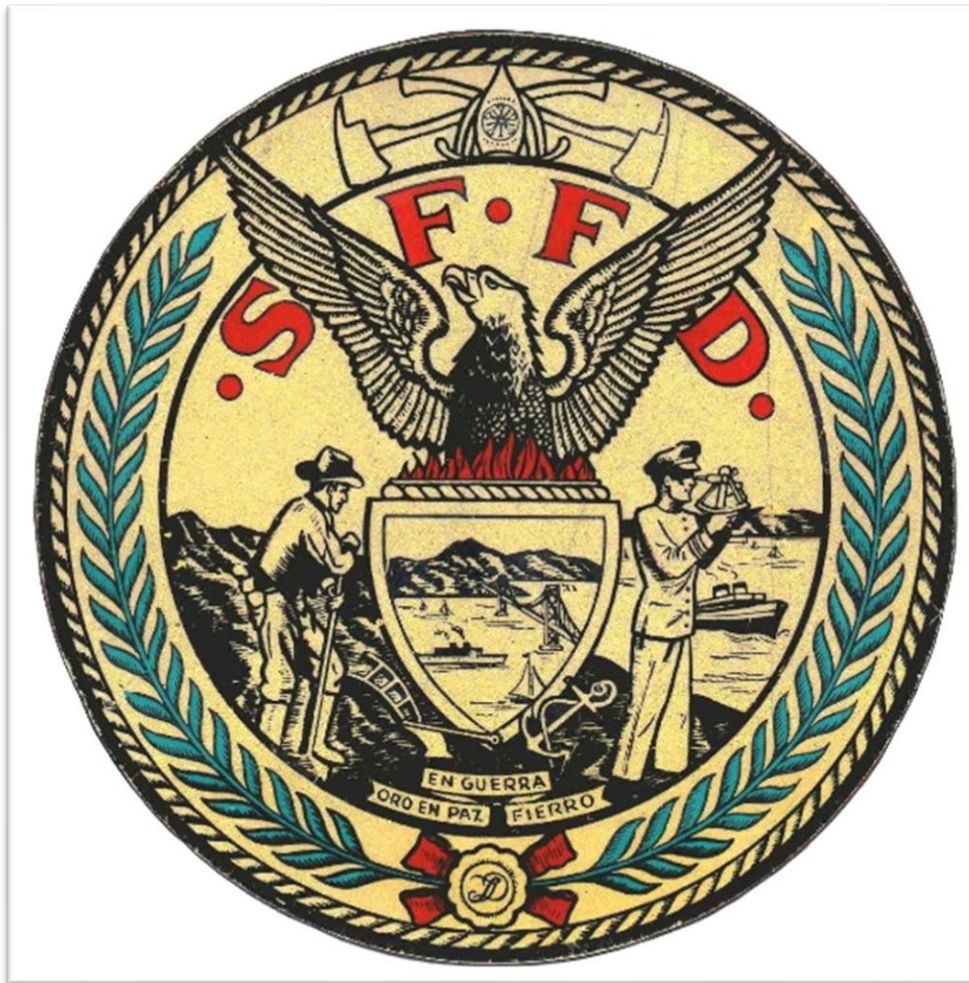

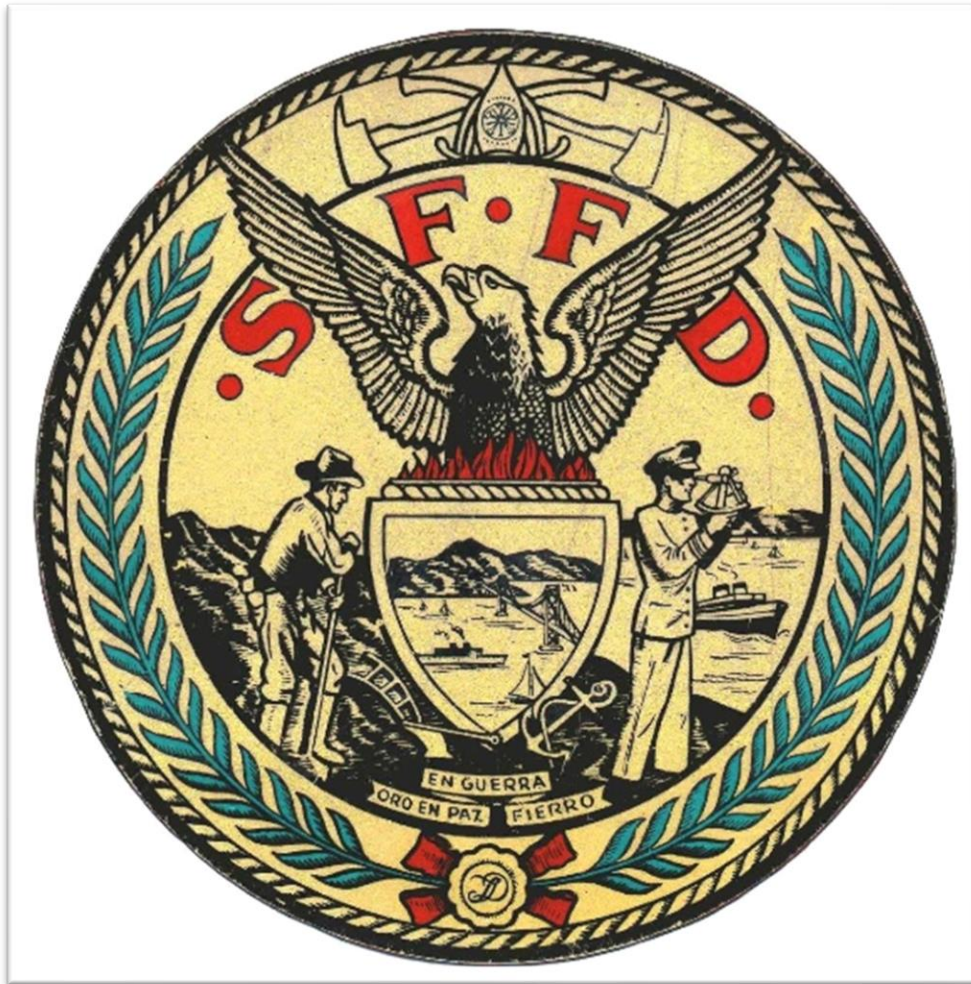

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechter, SFFD)

A total of 127 requests for service were initiated during the month of May 2022. 110 service orders were completed and closed out. Plumbing issues made up the majority of the requests.

PLUMBING

Six service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, showers and exterior drains) in the month of May 2022.

Only one (1) sewage backup was reported during May 2022 (FS 22).

HVAC/HEATING/BOILERS

FS 14 – DPW Steamfitters to replace entire rooftop HVAC unit. Parts bid awarded to lowest bidder PO to be generated once vendor's required paperwork is submitted. DPW Steamfitters anticipate duct manufacturing will take 3-4 weeks. Total work estimated at 6-8 weeks. Job assigned to vendor Norman S. Wright. Requested and received construction schedule for removal and installation of new equipment. All deteriorated HVAC equipment and duct work was removed from rooftop on 2/16/22. Curb development commenced. New equipment set on rooftop by crane on 3/23/22. DPW Steamfitters reported replacement of all rooftop MUA furnace units is needed. DPW's Steamfitters, Electricians, Sheetmetal and Roofers performed initial site walk-thru with vendor and SFFD in February 2022, and DPW Steamfitters submitted estimate for replacement.

Status Update: New walk-thru with SFFD personnel scheduled for June 2022.

Sheetmetal is 70% complete with ductwork. Electricians are 90% complete with power and controls. Steamfitters are doing start up and are complete with 2 of 3 units. Minor work still needs to be completed: DPW Roofers to seal unused existing sleepers; new system needs to be integrated into existing life safety system; exhaust fans 2, 3, 6 need to be replaced.

FS 1 – Drying Room Heater is 5/5. After numerous repairs have been made, it is recommended that a new heater be installed.

Status Update: waiting for parts.

FS 10 – Boiler pump is damaged and needs to be replaced.

Status Update: waiting for parts.

FS 23 - received replacement recirc pump for boiler.

Status Update: Work completed.

FS 24 – Station has heat, but there are flow issues in the piping configuration.

Status Update: DPW Steamfitters are preparing recommendations.

FS 32 – Approved DPW’s proposal to replace boiler’s pump, rewire, drain down and repair relief valve and gas regulator.

Status Update: Work completed.

FS 43 – Radiant heat is operational. HHW Boiler controls need to be repaired.

Status Update: waiting for SFFD's approval.

GENERATORS

Minor issues were reported with stand-by generators at FS 13, 29, 39, and 48 in May 2022. All units were repaired and returned to service.

CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

CEMENT/ASPHALT

No major cement/asphalt issues were reported.

ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

No major exhaust extractor issues were reported.

GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

No major glass/windows/screens were reported.

LANDSCAPING

No major landscaping issues were reported.

PAINT

No major paint/graffiti issues were reported.

PEST MANAGEMENT

No major pest management issues were reported.

E.S.E.R. BOND 2010 NFS – Updates through May 2022

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Fire Station 16 (\$14.2M)** – Final Completion was achieved on July 18, 2019. Public Works has assessed Liquidated Damages from July 17, 2018, to June 5, 2019, in the amount of \$489,500.00. Project is in the financial close-out phase.
Contractor has now paid LBEs, now currently awaiting CMD’s closeout memo. Once memo is received from CMD, DPW will release final payment.

Additional Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Emergency Generators:

- **Fire Station 14** – Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port and sump pump at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
 - Public Works submitted application for DBI building permit on 10/2/19.
 - Building Permit approved on 5/28/21 and issued on 6/17/21.
 - This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs at Fireboat Station 35.
 - Invitation to Bid will be advertised in mid FY22-23.

E.S.E.R. BOND 2014 NFS – Updates through May 2022

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

Fireboat Station 35 (\$50.5M) – NTP for Design-Build Services issued on October 10, 2017. Substantial Completion was achieved on February 28, 2022. DBE submitted Notice of Potential Claim (NOPC) for compensable schedule extension due to the revised design by PG&E. NOPC was not advance and Claim was not submitted, based on agreement reached with Contractor for 180 calendar days of compensable schedule extension, in the amount of \$598,000.

- Ribbon-cutting ceremony took place on March 10, 2022.
- Interior and Exterior punch lists completed.
- Anticipated timeframe for issuance of the Final Completion Certificate is TBD.



Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17. Work progresses through the 9 scope categories, comprised of: Emergency Generator Replacements, Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control.

Emergency Generators:

- **FS 31** – Complete.
- **FS 2** – Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.

On 5/3/22, Argo (the Contractor) delivered the generator to Station 2's rooftop. Supply chain issues have been a challenge in achieving Substantial Completion. Argo is in process of completing generator's installation, and Substantial Completion is now scheduled for June 9, 2022.

- **FS 19** – Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and provide electrical infrastructure upgrade.
 - This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs for Fireboat Station 35.
 - Project is permitted by DBI and BAAQMD.
 - Invitation to Bid to be advertised in mid FY22-23.
 - January 26th meeting with SFPUC resulted in decision to provide PG&E permit extension in lieu of requiring new permit; coordination with SFPUC ongoing.

Exterior Envelope:

Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29) – FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete.

FS 23 – On 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on the project, due to other priorities.

Package 2 (FS 24, 34) – This project is on HOLD at the request of Capital Planning.

- 2/8/22 meeting with SF Planning to review target CEQA and existing property information.
- 2300 Folsom Street is on the Cortese List (list of hazardous waste and substances sites); a Categorical Exemption (CatEx) is not applicable to Cortese sites; TBD if a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) will be required.
- Preservation planner will provide a determination regarding need for EIR based on impact of replacement of FS 7 on the California Register-eligible 1952 Firehouse Bond Act Thematic Historic District.

P.H.S. BOND 2016 NFS – Updates through May 2022

The total funding allocated for Neighborhood Fire Stations is \$9.1M.

Seismic Improvement Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Hose Tower Removal & Roofing (FS 6, 11, 12, 21, 38) – Complete.

Hose Tower Replacement (FS 15) – An Invitation to Bid will be advertised in Q4 2022, depending on availability of remaining funds.

Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Emergency Generators:

FS 37 & 44:

Public Works’ Contract Prep is preparing the project for an Invitation to Bid; Advertisement is anticipated in Q2 2022.

FS 18:

This project is permitted by DBI and BAAQMD.

Invitation to Bid to be advertised in Q4 2022, pending review of available funding.

P.H.S. BOND 2016 AMBULANCE DEPLOYMENT FACILITY (ADF) / STATION 49 – Updates through May 2022 (Kathleen O’Day, San Francisco Public Works)

- Project final completion is anticipated in late June/early July 2022 after the remaining change order work (currently 2) is completed.
- Art Enrichment Part II Fence and Gate Metal Art Panels have been delayed two months, now anticipated to be completed in Fall 2022.
- Contractor is currently addressing 14 warranty items outstanding, such as the parking garage deck resurfacing, camera replacement at Jerrold, and underground irrigation line leak.

E.S.E.R.—Emergency Firefighting Water System (EFWS) / Auxiliary Water Supply System (David Myerson, Ada Zhu SFPUC)

- 19th Avenue EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued.
- Clarendon Supply EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued. Expected completion projected for September 2022.

- Fireboat Manifold – Construction of new pipeline and fireboat manifold near Fort Mason Pier 2 for fire suppression.
 - Conceptual Engineering Report (CER) expected in August 2022.
- Pumping Station 2 – Construction contract continued. Expected completion projected for November 2022.
 - Terry Francois/Mission Rock/Warriors Way EFWS Pipeline – Construction completed May 2022.
- Vicente EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued.
- Potable Emergency Firefighting Water System (PEFWS) project – Planning for the Richmond and Sunset areas continued.

BOE/FLEET MANAGEMENT (Captain Vince Wong, SFFD)

- BOE is assisting in the logistics of ordering, obtaining, and delivering of supplies critical to the department during the current pandemic. We are currently distributing all necessary PPE to the members.
- Ten new Engines have been distributed to the field.
- Testing Loadout of new TDA scheduled for mid-June.
- The Hose Tender build continues at Rosenbauer with mid-point inspection completed.
- Eight 12-passenger Ford vans and an RC Buggy for the Community Paramedicine Division have now been ordered, but no ETA currently due to auto industry chip/parts shortage. Conversions of two (2) MTA vans and two (2) Paratransit Transport vehicles at Upfitters.
- Coordinated with EMS team to finalize specs for a new Type-1 ambulance. Specs are now finalized and were submitted to OCA, where they are currently being reviewed. In process to acquire 9 new ambulances.
- Last two Type-6 Pumpers for wildland/mutual aid are being acquired from HiTech Fire Apparatus.
- Two Ford PPV Explorers delivered to Code-3 upfitter to install Code-3 light package.
- The BOE continues to research and test out new equipment for our firefighters.
- The BOE would like to thank everyone in Support Services for their continued assistance and support. They are a vital part of our crew.

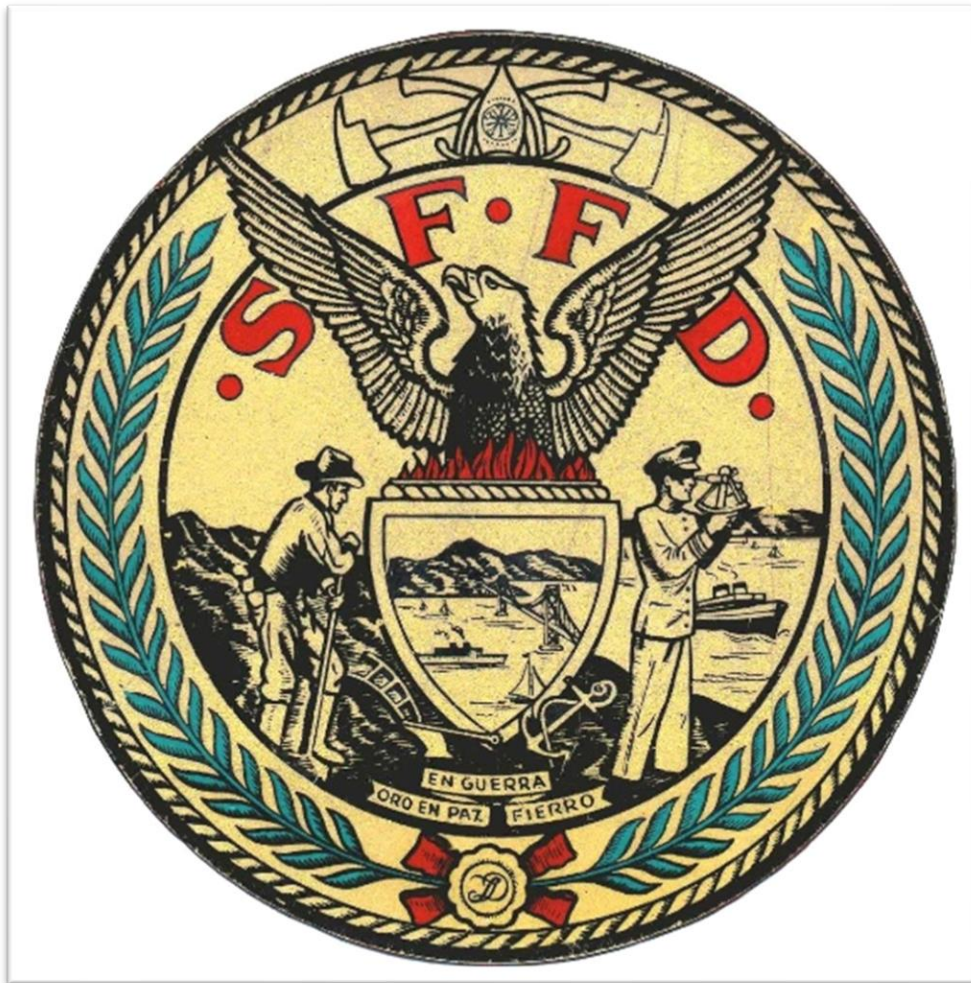
DEPARTMENT ENGINEERING (Stationary Engineer Avo Sarkissian, SFFD)

- Ongoing and routine maintenance at Fire HQ and new ADF.
- Responded to a variety of maintenance calls at a number of fire stations, training facilities (TI & 19th/Folsom), 1415 Evans, HQ, and new ADF building.
- Tenant improvement project at 1415 Evans now mostly completed. Community Paramedicine Team has moved in and are occupying building. HVAC replacement is currently pending arrival of equipment needed to complete replacement.

CLOTHING DEPOT & LOGISTICS (Lt. Michael Teupel, SFFD)

- 4/14 - 5/14 the Clothing Depot received 210 requests for uniform and PPE repairs, replacement, or new issue that were fulfilled.
- Surf equipment has begun to arrive. Full delivery of this equipment is expected to be complete in mid-July, as some equipment included in order is still in the process of being manufactured.
- The turnout PPE bid has been awarded to AllStar Fire Equipment Inc. Finalization of contracts are forthcoming. SFFD has a long-standing relationship with AllStar and expects this will be a continued positive transition back to their services for turnouts.
- With the assistance of OCA, SFFD was able to secure turnouts for the 129 and 130 recruit classes through Fire Dex supplied by MES. This will allow the recruits to continue their training and enter into their positions after graduation with their full complement of PPE.
- Fire Academy Class 130 will be entering into academy in June and preparations are underway for their outfitting.

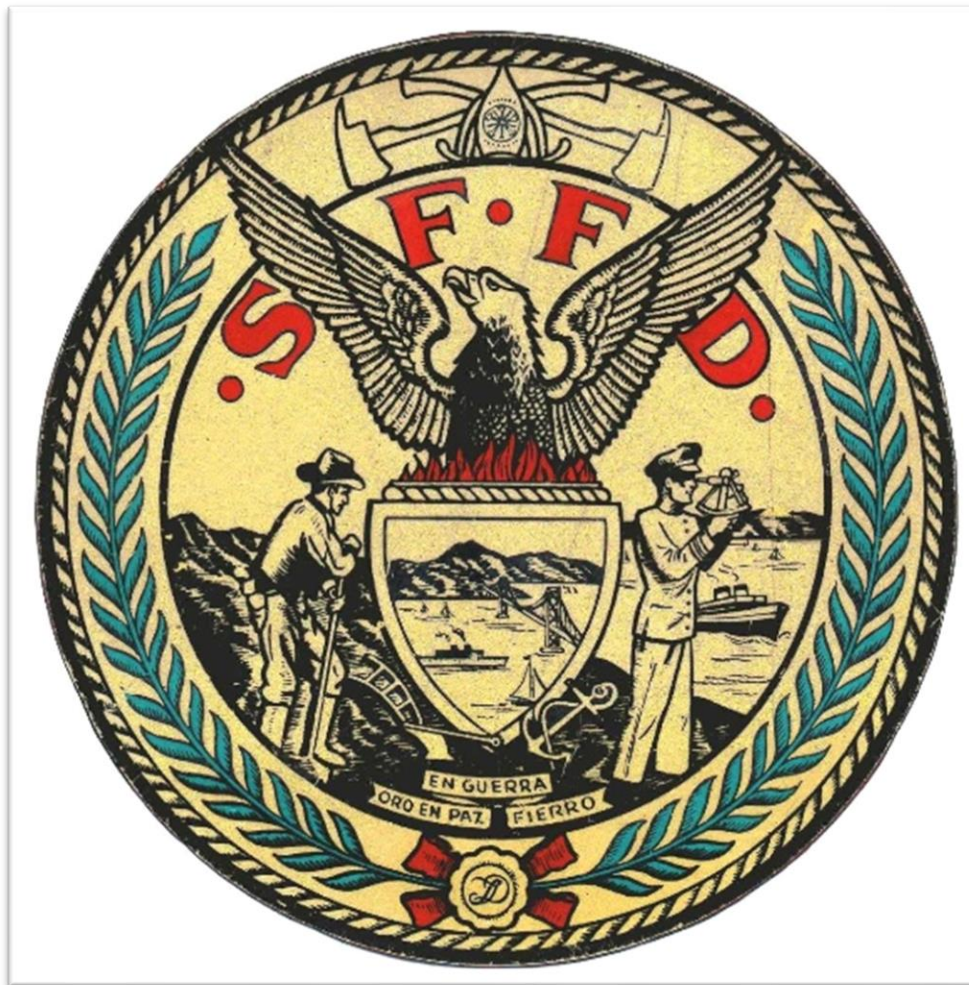

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

REVOLVING MONTHLY OUTREACH

- Engine companies continue to distribute fire prevention and education material on calls or the public. This material is now available on our website in multiple languages.
- Coastal Rescue companies continue to give Surf Hazard Education to the community while on calls or while out in public (Targeted to Ocean Beach Area)
- Cliff Rescue units provide cliff rescue and animal safety community outreach in areas such as Fort Funston.
- "See the Red Lights Pull to the Right" campaign for yielding to emergency vehicles is striking comments from the public as to what to do when they see an emergency vehicle.
- Bicycle safety messages on social media and in public areas promote safe riding habits: wear your helmets, follow the traffic laws, yield to pedestrians and emergency vehicles, and more. These efforts are to help reduce bicycle-related accidents and injuries.
- Pedestrian Safety and distracted driver safety messages on social media: "Look don't like" (referring to texting), yield to pedestrians, share the road with a bicyclist, to name a few.
- P.E.T. safety tips for fire and environment-related issues are placed on social media and shared with media outlets. Examples would be: Do not forget your pets when making a home or work escape or disaster plan."
- Cliff and hiking safety messaging on social media help reduce falls, entrapments, and rescue incidents.
- Information on the station rebuilds and the ESER 2014 BONDS has been posted on social media to help keep the community informed.
- The Department has joined a national fire Service campaign called: "[Close your Door before you Doze.](#)" These efforts encourage closing bedroom doors at sleep to increase your chances of survival or saving during a fire. The temperature outside a door can be 1000 degrees, and in the bedroom with a closed door, 100 degrees.
- The Department has teamed up with D.E.M. promoting: "When to Call 911" campaign to help reduce non-emergency calls to 911.
- The Department worked with SF-Environment to promote fire extinguisher disposal.
- The Department assisted SF-Environment with safety information on batteries and disposing of them properly. When improperly disposed, old batteries can cause fires. To learn more, visit: www.sfbatterysafe.org
