

Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

30 (Thirty) members were randomly selected and tested; results were negative. Reviewed current Contracts with CDT to streamline testing and cut costs. Working with Physician's office on new proposal.

Captain Aspelin has been providing training to ISB2 Lt. Tibbits, to provide coverage for ISB1.





- Assignment Office is working with EMS Division and Community Paramedicine for on-going staffing and scheduling.
- Working with Community Paramedicine to create new positions for increased staffing levels.
- Working with EMS Division for upcoming vacancy in June.
- The EMS WDO-In-Advance continues per General Order 20 A-08. In accordance with the policy, pre-hiring 75% of open ambulance shifts seven days in advance.
- Continues to assist Physician's Office with assigning personnel to Temporary Modified Duty Positions.
- Continue new WDO-In-Advance Pilot Policy for Suppression members, General Order 21A-64. Pre-hiring of 50% of shortage seven days in advance on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- Continue Mandatory Credit given WDOs for weekends to increase voluntary WDOs
- Scheduling change for station 49 members to open positions for upcoming new members.
- Moving of VR personnel to balance the field suppression units.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechtler, SFFD)

- A total of 123 requests for service were initiated during the month of July 2022. 115 service orders were completed and closed out. Minor plumbing and pest management issues made up the majority of the requests.

PLUMBING

- Seven service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, showers and exterior drains) in the month of July 2022.
- Two (2) sewage backup was reported during July 2022 (FS 2, 36).

HVAC/HEATING/BOILERS

- FS 14 – DPW Steamfitters to replace entire rooftop HVAC unit. Parts bid awarded to lowest bidder PO to be generated once vendor's required paperwork is submitted. DPW Steamfitters anticipate duct manufacturing will take 3-4 weeks. Total work estimated at 6-8 weeks. Job assigned to vendor Norman S. Wright. Requested and received construction schedule for removal and installation of new equipment. All deteriorated HVAC equipment and duct work was removed from rooftop on 2/16/22. Curb development commenced. New equipment set on rooftop by crane on 3/23/22. DPW Steamfitters reported replacement of all rooftop MUA furnace units is needed. DPW's Steamfitters, Electricians, Sheetmetal and Roofers performed initial site walk-thru with vendor and SFFD in February 2022, and DPW Steamfitters submitted estimate for replacement. Walk-thru with SFFD personnel completed. Project approximately 95% completed.

Status Update: Sheetmetal shop is finalizing work being performed on roof.

- FS 1 – Drying Room Heater is 5/5. After numerous repairs have been made, it is recommended that a new heater be installed.
Status Update: waiting for parts.
- FS 10 – Boiler pump is damaged and needs to be replaced. Parts were ordered and have now been received.
Status Update: Work to replace pump commencing mid-August.
- FS 34 – In-line pump motor issue with Boiler.
Status Update: DPW in touch with vendor to replace warranty item.
- Old FS 35 – Replace ignition wire on Boiler; install piping upgrade kit.
Status Update: Waiting on arrival of upgrade kit.
- FS 39: Boiler/heater register problem reported.
Status update: Work by DPW Steamfitters has now been completed.

- FS 43 – Radiant heat is operational. HHW Boiler controls need to be repaired. SFFD gave approval to proceed with replacing boiler controls. DPW has obtained parts needed; work on controls scheduled to commence mid-July.
Status Update: Work completed.

GENERATORS

- Minor issues were reported with stand-by generators at FS 28, 29, and 40 in the month of June 2022. All units were repaired and returned to service.

CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

CEMENT/ASPHALT

No major cement/asphalt issues were reported.

ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

- FS 2, 7, 15, and 17 reported minor repairs needed to station’s exhaust extractors. All units were repaired and returned to service during the month of July.

GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

No major glass/windows/screens were reported.

LANDSCAPING

No major landscaping issues were reported.

PAINT

No major paint/graffiti issues were reported.

PEST MANAGEMENT

No major pest management issues were reported.

E.S.E.R. BOND 2010 NFS – Updates through May 2022

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Fire Station 16 (\$14.2M)** – Final Completion was achieved on July 18, 2019. Project is financially completed. Final PA was issued in June 2022.

Additional Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Emergency Generators:**
 - **Fire Station 14** – Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port and sump pump at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
 - Public Works submitted application for DBI building permit on 10/2/19.

- Building Permit issued on 6/17/21.
- This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs at Fireboat Station 35.
- Invitation to Bid will be advertised in mid FY22-23.

E.S.E.R. BOND 2014 NFS – Updates through May 2022

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Fireboat Station 35 (\$50.5M)** – NTP for Design-Build Services issued on October 10, 2017. Substantial Completion was achieved on February 28, 2022. Interior and Exterior punch lists completed. Issuance of Final Completion Certificate projected in August 2022.



Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17. Work progresses through the 9 scope categories, comprised of: Emergency Generator Replacements, Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control.

- **Emergency Generators:**
 - **FS 31** – Complete.
 - **FS 2** – Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.
 - On 5/3/22, Argo (the Contractor) delivered the generator to Station 2’s rooftop. Supply chain issues have been a challenge in achieving Substantial Completion. Argo is in process of completing generator’s installation, and Substantial Completion is now scheduled for July 18, 2022.
 - **FS 19** – Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and provide electrical infrastructure upgrade.
 - This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs for Fireboat Station 35.
 - Project is permitted by DBI and BAAQMD.
 - This project will now be packaged together (by BOA) with FS 19, and Invitation to Bid is expected to be advertised in later 2022/early 2023.
- **Exterior Envelope:**
 - **Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29)** – FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete.
 - **FS 23** – On 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on the project, due to other priorities.
 - **Package 2 (FS 24, 34)** – This project is on HOLD at the request of Capital Planning.

- Public Works published the shortlist of three (3) Architect-Engineer teams on 1/20/22; interview invites were sent to the shortlisted proposers on 2/1/22; oral interviews were scheduled for 2/18/22, but suspended at request of SFFD.
- RFQ for Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) with Design-Assist Core Trade Subcontractors – suspended as of 10/18/21 at request of SFFD.
- Environmental Review
 - CEQA Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND) heard and approved by the Board of Supervisors on 2/8/22; *File No. 220054, Motion No. M22-016.*

Fire Station 7 Replacement (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works)

Budget: \$TBD

Phase: Planning **ON HOLD per SFFD**

Schedule:

- Estimated Start of Construction – TBD
- Estimated Substantial Completion –TBD

Highlights:

- 2/8/22 meeting with SF Planning to review target CEQA and existing property information.
- 2300 Folsom Street is on the Cortese List (list of hazardous waste and substances sites); a Categorical Exemption (CatEx) is not applicable to Cortese sites; TBD if a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) will be required.
- Preservation planner will provide a determination regarding need for EIR based on impact of replacement of FS 7 on the California Register-eligible 1952 Firehouse Bond Act Thematic Historic District.

P.H.S. BOND 2016 NFS – Updates through May 2022

The total funding allocated for Neighborhood Fire Stations is \$9.1M.

Seismic Improvement Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Hose Tower Removal & Roofing (FS 6, 11, 12, 21, 38)** – Complete.
- **Hose Tower Replacement (FS 15)** – Funding will be made available by way of reallocation of funds back to PHS NFS from PHS ADF, and an Invitation to Bid will be advertised early 2023.

Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Emergency Generators:

- **FS 37 & 44:**
 - This bid package was advertised the last week of July, and a Pre - Bid Conference and Mandatory Bid Walk was held on July 11th, attended by 4 prime contractors. Bids are due on August 3, 2022.
- **FS 18:**
 - Funding will be made available by way of reallocation of funds back to PHS NFS from PHS ADF.
 - This project will now be packaged together (by BOA) with FS 19 and an Invitation to Bid will be advertised in late 2022/ early 2023.

P.H.S. BOND 2016 AMBULANCE DEPLOYMENT FACILITY (ADF) / STATION 49 – Updates through May 2022 (Kathleen O’Day, San Francisco Public Works)

- Project final completion is anticipated in late June/early July 2022 after the remaining change order work (currently 2) is completed.
- Art Enrichment Part II Fence and Gate Metal Art Panels have been delayed two months, now anticipated to be completed in November 2022.
- Contractor is currently addressing 11 warranty items outstanding, such as the parking garage deck resurfacing, camera replacement at Jerrold, and underground irrigation line leak.

E.S.E.R.—Emergency Firefighting Water System (EFWS) / Auxiliary Water Supply System (David Myerson, Ada Zhu SFPUC)

- 19th Avenue EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued. Expected completion in July 2023.
- Clarendon Supply EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued. Expected completion revised to April 2023 due to supply chain issues.
- Fireboat Manifold – Construction of new pipeline and fireboat manifold near Fort Mason Pier 2 and Pier 35 ½ for fire suppression. Planning in progress.
- Pumping Station 2 – Construction contract continued. Expect completion December 2022.
- Vicente EFWS Pipeline – Construction contract continued.
- Potable Emergency Firefighting Water System (PEFWS) project – Planning for the Richmond and Sunset areas continued.

BOE/FLEET MANAGEMENT (Captain Vince Wong, SFFD)

- BOE is assisting in the logistics of ordering, obtaining, and delivering of supplies critical to the department during the current pandemic. We are currently distributing all necessary PPE to the members.
- Ten new Engines have been distributed to the field, and the eleventh is waiting for parts to arrive.
- Testing Loadout of new TDA was completed. Electronic malfunctions were noted, and repairs are in process to address and rectify these issues.
- The Hose Tender build continues at Rosenbauer with mid-point inspection completed.

- Eight 12-passenger Ford vans and an RC Buggy for the Community Paramedicine Division have now been ordered, but no ETA currently due to auto industry chip/parts shortage. Conversions of two (2) MTA vans and two (2) Paratransit Transport vehicles at upfitters.
- Coordinated with EMS team to finalize specs for a new Type-1 ambulance. Specs are now finalized and were submitted to OCA. Nine new ambulances are being acquired, three of which will have final inspections at the end of August.
- Last two Type-6 Pumpers for wildland/mutual aid were successfully acquired from Hi-Tech Fire Apparatus. All four Type-6 Pumpers have now been delivered and are currently being upfitted to our needs.
- Two Ford PPV Explorers delivered to Code-3 upfitter to install Code-3 light package. The first is complete and going to the Community Paramedicine Team. The second will be used by Rescue Captain upon completion.
- The BOE continues to research and test out new equipment for our firefighters.
- The BOE would like to thank everyone in Support Services for their continued assistance and support. They are a vital part of our crew.


DEPARTMENT ENGINEERING (Stationary Engineer Avo Sarkissian, SFFD)

- Ongoing and routine maintenance at Fire HQ and new ADF.
- Responded to a variety of maintenance calls at a number of fire stations, training facilities (TI & 19th/Folsom), 1415 Evans, HQ, and new ADF building.
- Tenant improvement project at 1415 Evans 80% complete. EMS has moved in and are occupying building.
 - HVAC units remain on order from DPW Steamfitters, and we still do not currently have an ETA for units' arrival.

CLOTHING DEPOT & LOGISTICS (Lt. Michael Teupel, SFFD)

- The Clothing Depot fulfilled approximately 210 clothing voucher requests in the month of July 2022, and has 7 more waiting on delivery of back-ordered material.
- 98% of Surf Rescue PPE has now arrived. Distribution to qualified personnel will commence late August 2022.
- Fire-Dex Turnout PPE has been ordered to fulfill the 129th Academy's second set upon graduation.
- Lion turnouts have been ordered for the commencement of the 131st Academy, and to replace PPE retired due to age/wear-and-tear over the last 8 months.



- Engine companies continue to pass [fire prevention and educational material](#) on calls. This material is now available on our website in multiple languages. To download, visit: www.sf-fire.org
- Coastal Rescue companies continue to give [Surf Hazard Education](#) to the community while on calls or while out in public (Targeted to Ocean Beach Area)
- Cliff Rescue units provide cliff rescue and animal safety community outreach in areas such as Fort Funston.
- "See the Red Lights Pull to the Right" campaign for yielding to emergency vehicles is striking comments from the public as to what to do when they see an emergency vehicle.
- Bicycle safety messages on social media and in public areas promote safe riding habits: wear your helmets, follow the traffic laws, yield to pedestrians and emergency vehicles, and more. These efforts are to help reduce bicycle-related accidents and injuries.
- Pedestrian Safety and distracted driver safety messages on social media: "Look don't like" (referring to texting), yield to pedestrians, share the road with a bicyclist, to name a few.
- P.E.T. safety tips for fire and environment-related issues are placed on social media and shared with media outlets. Examples would be: Do not forget your pets when making a home or work escape or disaster plan."
- Cliff and hiking safety messaging on social media help reduce falls, entrapments, and rescue incidents.
- Information on the [station rebuilds](#) and the [ESER 2014 BONDS](#) has been posted on social media to help keep the community informed.
- The Department has joined a national fire Service campaign called: "[Close your Door before you Doze.](#)" These efforts encourage closing bedroom doors at sleep to increase your chances of survival or saving during a fire. The temperature outside a door can be 1000 degrees, and in the bedroom with a closed door, 100 degrees.
- The Department has teamed up with D.E.M. promoting: "When to Call 911" campaign to help reduce non-emergency calls to 911.
