- Chaplaincy Program HS&W is seeking 3-5 members to be on the Chaplaincy Program Committee.
- Post-Strike Team Deployment Protocols Recognizing we don't have any health information upon returning from deployments, I have created a list of 3-4 health supplements along with information about: Nutrition, Sleep, & Hydration. It is currently in preparation stage and will consult with the Physician's Office before requesting CD1 approval to distribute members returning from strike team deployments.
- Facility Dog Policy Completed and awaiting approval from CD1
- Resiliency Training was given to the 130<sup>th</sup> Recruit Class (4 hours) by our BHU Member
- Our 2 BHU Members are contacted by an average of 5-6 people per day for various reasons. (For example: Stress, Alcohol & substance Abuse, PTSD, marital/partner problems...)
  - Each person who contacts our BHU Member spends anywhere from 30 minutes 4 hours average / person.
- COVID tests have been reordered. We currently have 1700 tests with an expiration date of March 2023. Reorder amount: 2240 tests and 450 confirmatory tests. (Arriving in late September)
- I have requested the San Francisco Firefighters Cancer Prevention Foundation to purchase Gear Bags for the purpose of minimizing exposures with the goal of having it be incorporated in next year's equipment budget.
  - Because Firefighters (when detailed) must take their turnouts in their car and if it's not a pickup truck, the turnouts are in a shared space with other family members.

- Attended an audit of SDFD's Family Wellness Day in San Diego.
  - It covered topics such as: Behavioral Wellness Overview, Critical Incident Testimony, Dealing with Anger & Management
  - The second half of the day the recruit's family members were invited to hear a breakout of the trials and tribulations of having a child/partner in the fire service and explaining things to expect: Mandatories, Deployments, being gone a long time. At the same time, the recruits were given a lecture on what to expect at their first house and what to expect with the fire culture
  - I am having conversations with ADC Kaialoa to bring this to the SFFD

#### **MEDIA**

- I was interviewed by PBS Newshour, along with CD1 and Tony Stefani (President of the San Francisco Firefighters Cancer Prevention Foundation). We did a ride-along with Engine 1. They are doing a story on PFAS in our turnouts and how it contributes to our high amounts of occupational cancer. Expected airing of this story will be sometime between September 12 23.

# Office of the Department Physician Jennifer Brokaw, MD, Supervising Physician August 2022

- 1. The Physician's Office has obtained permission to change its name to the **Office of Employee Health** at SF Fire Department. This reflects the multi-disciplinary nature of our team and recognizes that we address the health of the department and not simply "work status."
- 2. We watched the July surge of COVID abate in August and are now down to about 1 case per day with 9 people out on isolation at this writing. This is one of the lowest case rates we've had since the pandemic began.
- 3. We are planning our fall influenza vaccine clinics for October. We have the opportunity to offer a limited number of the bivalent COVID vaccine too. We will likely set up separate clinics for each.
- 4. Our department hosted the **UCSF Occupational Medicine** residents and Fellows at Treasure Island to observe a live burn on August 9. It was an excellent morning for them and for Dr. Brokaw, who'd never seen a live burn. See photo below.
- 5. Usual business in August: Promotion exams: 8 End of Probation: 23 DMV: 2 Return to Duty: TMTC (too many to count due to COVID returns)

# Investigative Services Bureau Captain Lars Aspelin August 2022

## **Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program**

27 (Twenty-seven) members were randomly selected and tested; results were negative. Reviewed current Contracts with CDT to streamline testing and cut costs. Working with Physician's office on new proposal. Lt. Tibbitts has provided assistance with field testing.

# **Post-Accident Alcohol and Drug Testing Program**

One (1) Post-Accident Alcohol and Drug test were administered this month, results negative.

# Conditional Offer, Promotional and End-of-Probation Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Cpt. Aspelin provided supply materials to Physician's office.

### Breathalyzers

Five (5) have been sent in for the next round of re-certifications. The process is complete and they have been shipped.

# California Driver Licenses (CDL)

Cpt. Aspelin continued to monitor members' driver licenses and updating tracking software. Currently, there are Three (3) members with a suspended license and 1 (one) expired. We are also looking at switching to the DMV monitoring portal and leaving our 3<sup>rd</sup> party provider. This will save the Department an estimated 20,000\$ annually.

### Training

Captain Aspelin has been providing training to ISB2 Lt. Tibbits, to provide coverage for ISB1. In addition, Captain Aspelin attended the FEMA Wide Area Search class.

# FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechtler, SFFD)

A total of 155 requests for service were initiated during the month of August 2022. 106 service orders were completed and closed out. Minor plumbing and pest management issues made up the majority of the requests.

#### PLUMBING

- Twenty-one (21) service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, shower drains) in the month of August 2022.
- Three (3) sewage backups were reported during August 2022 (FS 11, 15, 1415 Evans).

#### HVAC/HEATING/BOILERS

 FS 14 – DPW Steamfitters to replace entire rooftop HVAC unit. Parts bid awarded to lowest bidder PO to be generated once vendor's required paperwork is submitted. DPW Steamfitters anticipate duct manufacturing will take 3-4 weeks. Total work estimated at 6-8 weeks. Job assigned to vendor Norman S. Wright. Requested and received construction schedule for removal and installation of new equipment. All deteriorated HVAC equipment and duct work was removed from rooftop on 2/16/22. Curb development commenced. New equipment set on rooftop by crane on 3/23/22. DPW Steamfitters reported replacement of all rooftop MUA furnace units is needed. DPW's Steamfitters, Electricians, Sheetmetal and Roofers performed initial site walk-thru with vendor and SFFD in February 2022, and DPW Steamfitters submitted estimate for replacement. Walk-thru with SFFD personnel completed. Project approximately 95% completed.

Status Update: Sheetmetal shop is finalizing work being performed on roof.

- FS 1 Drying Room Heater is 5/5. After numerous repairs have been made, it is recommended that a new heater be installed. *Status Update: waiting for parts expected to arrive week of 9/5/22.*
- FS 10 Boiler pump is damaged and needs to be replaced. Parts were ordered and have now been received.
  Status Update: New pump ordered; waiting for parts to arrive.
- FS 34 In-line pump motor issue with Boiler. Status Update: DPW in touch with vendor to replace warranty item.
- Old FS 35 Replace ignition wire on Boiler; install piping upgrade kit. *Status Update: Waiting on arrival of upgrade kit.*
- FS 43 Radiant heat is operational. HHW Boiler controls need to be repaired. SFFD gave approval to proceed with replacing boiler controls. DPW has obtained parts needed. *Status Update: Waiting for labor availability.*

#### GENERATORS

• Minor issues were reported with stand-by generators located at 9, 10, 24, 26, 42 in the month of August 2022. All units were repaired and returned to service. Staff is working with a generator contractor to relocate generator from Old FS 35 and install at the TI Training Facility.

#### CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

CEMENT/ASPHALT No major cement/asphalt issues were reported.

#### ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

#### EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

• FS 3, 28, 32 and 51 reported minor repairs needed to station's exhaust extractors. All units were repaired and returned to service during the month of August.

#### GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

No major glass/windows/screens were reported.

#### LANDSCAPING

• Conducted site visit with DPW's Bureau of Forestry to obtain a quote for monthly maintenance.

#### PAINT

No major paint/graffiti issues were reported.

#### PEST MANAGEMENT

No major pest management issues were reported.

#### <u>E.S.E.R. BOND 2010 NFS – Updates through August 2022</u> Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

• Fire Station 16 (\$14.2M) – Final Completion was achieved on July 18, 2019. Project is financially completed. Final PA was issued in June 2022.

### Additional Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works): Emergency Generators:

- **Fire Station 14** Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
  - Building Permit issued on 6/17/21.
  - This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs at Fireboat Station 35.
  - Invitation to Bid will be advertised in mid FY22-23

# E.S.E.R. BOND 2014 NFS – Updates through August 2022

# Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

**Fireboat Station 35 (\$50.5M)** – NTP for Design-Build Services was issued on October 10, 2017. Substantial Completion was achieved on February 28, 2022. Interior and Exterior Punchlists were completed.

Issuance of the Final Completion Certificate projected in December 2022 after change order work is completed (lead time for utility enclosures requested by the BCDC is between four to six months).



# Focused Scope Program (Sherry Katz, San Francisco Public Works):

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17.

Work progresses through the 9 scope categories comprising Emergency Generator Replacements, Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control.

# **Emergency Generators:**

**FS 2** – Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.

- Substantial Completion Certificate issued on 8/24/22
- Final Completion is scheduled for 10/9/22
- **FS 19** Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and replace main electrical panel.
- This project has been on hold to accommodate potential costs for Fireboat Station 35.
- This project will now be packaged together (by BOA) with FS 19 and an Invitation to Bid will be advertised in late 2022/ early 2023

# **Exterior Envelope:**

Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29) – FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete; Note that on 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on FS 23 painting due to other priorities.
Package 2 (FS 24, 34) – This project is on HOLD at the request of Capital Planning.

# Highlights:

- Memorandum of Understanding between SFFD and Public Works submitted to SFFD in April 2021; comments received in June 2022; all SFFD revisions accepted, and all signatures acquired.
- Project Programming (functional spaces needed) meetings started in October 2021 and suspended after first session at request of SFFD. Restart expected upon approval of a Contract Service Orde and NTP issues assumed to occur in late September 2022.
- Public Works published the shortlist of three (3) Architect-Engineer teams on 1/20/22; interview invites were sent to the shortlisted proposers on 2/1/22; oral interviews were scheduled for 2/18/22 but suspended at request of SFFD. Interview of three firms held and the team led by RDC Architects was elected. Negotiations are to occur throughout 2022 with an expected agreement approval and NTP issued in first quarter of 2023.
- RFQ for Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) with Design-Assist Core Trade Subcontractors suspended as of 10/18/21 at request of SFFD. Expect to issue the RFQ solicitation in November 2022.
- Environmental Review:
  - CEQA Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND)heard and approved by the Board of Supervisors on 2/8/22. *File No. 220054, Motion No. M22-016.*

  - Project was bid on August 3, 2022; BBJ, the sole bidder, was deemed non responsive; City is in negotiations with BBJ who has met LBE requirements so that the project can be awarded to BBJ.
  - Target date for SFPW Commission approval under Prop B is tentatively December 2<sup>nd</sup>, at which time a Notice of Award may be issued to BBJ.
- **FS 18**:
  - Funding will be made available by way of reallocation of funds back to PHS NFS from PHS ADF
  - An Invitation to Bid will be advertised in 2023, following FS 15 Hose Tower, depending on available remaining funds to implement the construction phase.

## <u>P.H.S. BOND 2016 AMBULANCE DEPLOYMENT FACILITY (ADF) / STATION 49 –</u> <u>Updates through August 2022 (Kathleen O'Day, San Francisco Public Works)</u>

- Project final completion is anticipated in November 2022
  - Remaining change order work (locker replacement and garage installation) are anticipated to be completed by mid-October.
  - Art Enrichment Part II Fence and Gate Metal Art Panel installations at Jerrold and McKinnon Street are scheduled to begin in early October 2022.
- Contractor addressed the following warranty items: installation of a water hammer arrester on 4<sup>th</sup> floor to fix pipe vibration and replacement of photocell for exterior lights.
- Contractor is currently addressing 8 warranty items outstanding, such as recent backflow preventer malfunction and a reoccurring duct detector malfunction.

### <u>E.S.E.R.—Emergency Firefighting Water System (EFWS) / Auxiliary Water Supply</u> System (David Myerson, Ada Zhu SFPUC)

- 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue EFWS Pipeline Construction contract continued. Expect completion July 2023.
- Clarendon Supply EFWS Pipeline Construction contract continued. Expect completion April 2023.
- Fireboat Manifold Construction of new pipeline and fireboat manifold near Fort Mason Pier 2 and Pier 35.5 for fire suppression. Planning in progress.
- Pumping Station 2 Construction contract continued. Expect completion December 2022.
- Vicente EFWS Pipeline Construction contract continued.
- Potable Emergency Firefighting Water System (PEFWS) project Planning for the Richmond and Sunset areas continued.

# BOE/FLEET MANAGEMENT (Captain Vince Wong, SFFD)

- BOE is assisting in the logistics of ordering, obtaining, and delivering of supplies critical to the department during the current pandemic. We are currently distributing all necessary PPE to the members.
- Ten new Engines have been distributed to the field, and the eleventh is waiting for parts to arrive.
- The Hose Tender build continues at Rosenbauer with mid-point inspection completed.
- Eight 12-passenger Ford vans and an RC Buggy for the Community Paramedicine Division have now been ordered, but no ETA currently due to auto industry chip/parts shortage. Conversions of two (2) MTA vans and two (2) Paratransit Transport vehicles at Upfitters.
- Coordinated with EMS team to finalize specs for a new Type-1 ambulance. Specs are now finalized and were submitted to OCA, where they are currently being reviewed. In process to acquire 9 new ambulances.
- Two Type-6 Pumpers for wildland/mutual have been delivered from HiTech Fire Apparatus.
- The BOE continues to research and test out new equipment for our firefighters.
- The BOE would like to thank everyone in Support Services for their continued assistance and support. They are a vital part of our crew.

- Ongoing and routine maintenance at Fire HQ and ADF
- Tenant improvement project at 1415 Evans 80% complete. EMS has moved in and are occupying building.
  - HVAC units on order; as of 7/12/22 no ETA for units.
- Assisted ADC Serrano with the coordination of an outside vendor replacing a section of damaged fencing and adding K-Rails at the new training center on Carroll Avenue.
  - Application to PUC has been submitted for energizing power pole for lighting.
- Assisting ADC Serrano with logistics and planning of the new trades people being hired in the coming months.

# **CLOTHING DEPOT & LOGISTICS (Lt. Michael Teupel, SFFD)**

# **REVOLVING MONTHLY OUTREACH**

- Multiple Public Safety announcements were provided throughout the month.
- Engine companies continue to pass fire prevention and education material on calls or the public. This material is now available on our website in multiple languages.
- Coastal Rescue companies continue to give Surf Hazard Education to the community while on calls or while out in public (Targeted to Ocean Beach Area)
- Cliff Rescue units provide cliff rescue and animal safety community outreach in areas such as Fort Funston.
- Recruitment efforts towards all populations continue.
- "See the Red Lights Pull to the Right" campaign for yielding to emergency vehicles is striking comments from the public regarding what to do when they see an emergency vehicle.
- Bicycle safety messages on social media and in public areas promote safe riding habits: wear your helmet, follow the traffic laws, yield to pedestrians and emergency vehicles, and more. These efforts are to help reduce bicycle-related accidents and injuries.
- Pedestrian Safety and distracted driver safety messages on social media: "Look don't like" (referring to texting), yield to pedestrians, share the road with a bicyclist, to name a few.
- P.E.T. safety tips for fire and environment-related issues are placed on social media and shared with media outlets. Examples would be: "Do not forget your pets when making a home or work escape or disaster plan."
- Cliff and hiking safety messaging on social media help reduce falls, entrapments, and rescue incidents.
- Information on the station rebuilds and the ESER 2014 BONDS has been posted on social media to help keep the community informed.
- The Department has joined a national fire Service campaign: "Close your Door before you Doze." These efforts encourage closing bedroom doors at sleep to increase your chances of survival or saving during a fire. The temperature outside a door can be 1000 degrees, and in the bedroom with a closed door, 100 degrees.
- The Department has teamed up with D.E.M. promoting: "When to Call 911" campaign to help reduce non-emergency calls to 911.
- The Department worked with SF-Environment to promote fire extinguisher disposal.
- The Department assisted SF-Environment with battery safety information and disposed of them properly. When improperly disposed of, old batteries can cause fires. To learn more, visit: www.sfbatterysafe.org
