



OPERATIONS REPORT

January 1 – January 31, 2023

GREATER ALARMS:

There were two Greater Alarm fires during this reporting period.

2nd Alarm – (1/13/23) 1858 hours, 3017 20th Street, cross streets Florida and Alabama streets. There were no injuries. The cause of this fire is under investigation. (A/Assistant Chief Dustin Winn)

Division 3 was the first company in on scene and gave the initial report of the working fire on 20th and Florida streets. The fire presented as either an attic fire or heavy fire from the rear, Charlie side of the building. A working fire was immediately declared adding an additional Engine Company as the RIC team and a Rescue Captain to the box.

There was no delay in any units responding to 3017 20th Street. Fortunately, the first due responding units were only 4 blocks away. The first on scene company arrived at the front of the fire building in 1 minute and 25 seconds and established command. Per Dispatch, there was no delay in reporting the fire. The caller reported a building/structure fire at 1859 hours.

The main fire building was a multi-residential type 5 structure that was not required to have any additional fire protection system (i.e., fire sprinklers or dry/wet standpipes). The Bravo exposure was equipped with sprinklers, which assisted in suppressing the fire in that building.

Upon arrival, there was heavy fire and smoke venting out of the 2nd and 3rd floors of the Charlie side of the fire building. Once a truck company made it to the roof of the Delta exposure, it was clear that fire was running both lightwells on the Bravo and Delta sides of the building and was present in the attic space.

The main obstacle encountered was the number of bicycles found in the main fire building on the 2nd floor. The bicycles made it very difficult to access the rear of the building to the seat of the fire. Companies prevailed and made a very difficult lead onto the fire floor in order to search and extinguish the fire. The fire had already spread to 3 of the 4 floors in the main fire building, and 2 floors in the exposure building prior to arrival of the first due companies. The Department of Building Inspections red tagged the building.

The strategy of this fire was to make very aggressive hose leads to the seat of the fire in the rear of the building, followed by extinguishing the fire that had already taken hold of the attic space in the main fire building. Simultaneously, crews worked on each exposure building in order to limit horizontal fire spread.

Operationally, assigning chief officers to supervise companies in each of the fire buildings worked well. Battalion 2 was assigned as Fire Attack in the main fire building and supervised E7, E29, E6, T9 and T6. B6 was assigned Bravo and supervised E37, E36 and T11. B6 was assigned to the Charlie side of the building and supervised E8 and coordinated with the companies assigned to Delta E11. Truck 7 was assigned to the roof and worked with E1. RS2 supervised and conducted their own primary and secondary searches of the Fire Buildings. The whole operation was extremely successful resulting in 27 occupants and 2 cats evacuating the building safely. Multiple ladders provided access and egress to the roofs, and multiple hose lines were put into play in order to extinguish the fire.

The crews worked in a professional and diligent manner, putting themselves in harms was in order to protect the citizens, residents and visitors of our great city. It was a pleasure and honor to be the incident commander at this fire.

2nd Alarm – (1/22/23) 0139 hours, 1312 Hayes Street, cross streets Divisadero and Broderick streets. There was one injury. The cause of this fire is under investigation. (Assistant Chief William Storti)

On January 22, 2023, a full box was dispatched at approximately 0138 hours at 1310 Hayes Street. E21 was first on-scene and reported a working fire in a four-story type 5 residential building. Fire was venting from the roof on the Bravo side, and E21 took the front of the building and proceeded to take the 150' ready line to the second floor. B5 arrived on-scene and took command calling for an immediate 2nd alarm for heavy fire between the fire building and Bravo exposure. T6 threw an aerial to the Bravo exposure roof and took crews to the roof performing ventilation operations, opening skylights, and cutting holes into both the roofs of the fire building and Bravo exposure. E10 backed down supplying E21 and took 200' ready line to 2nd floor of Bravo exposure. E06 also backed down, giving a second supply to E21 and took a large line wye to front of the fire building bringing a small line led to the 3rd floor. B2 was assigned fire attack in the fire building with E21. T05 arrived and threw a 50' ladder to the delta exposure. D2 arrived and assigned B5 as Bravo Division. T05, E05, E10, and E38 led lines to 2nd through 4th floors of Bravo exposure. Companies also used lines and attic extensions to fight fire in the attic. E36, E3, and T10 were assigned to Fire Attack and led lines from 2nd to 4th floors and to fight fire in attic. RS1 split crew and performed a primary search of both buildings; E12 was assigned RIC and B4 Safety.

Both buildings received extensive damage mostly in the apartments on the shared side of each building. The fire started in the 2nd floor Bravo side apartment and spread through the lightwell to the upper floors and the Bravo exposure extending to the attic of both buildings. Twenty-five individuals were displaced.

Initial strategy was containing the fire as there was already significant extension between the buildings and up the lightwell. Companies with hose lines were assigned to each floor in both buildings and Truck companies were assigned to the top floor with attic extension ladders.


The fire building's attic was built with plywood flooring slowing operations to extinguish the fire there. The fire was given plenty of time to grow and spread between the buildings and into the lightwell up to the attic. Companies efficiently led several hose-leads to 3 floors in each building supporting difficult overhaul and attic operations.
