4. CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT'S REPORT [Discussion]

REPORT FROM CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT, JEANINE NICHOLSON

Report on current issues, activities, and events within the Department since the Fire Commission meeting on May 10, 2023, including budget, academies, special events, communications, and outreach to other government agencies and the public.

Chief Nicholson reported on activities since the last meeting. She mentioned that the budget is just about finalized with the mayor's budget office and the mayor has to submit her budget on June 1, 2023. She stated that they had a meeting with Supervisor Aaron Peskin as well as folks from the MTA and Mayor's office about the challenges with autonomous vehicles. She touched on events she attended including the St. Anthony's penny pitch, the James Gallagher interstation run, a labor-management meeting, Station 49's Art Installation, and the first drag laureate event. She announced that Mike Mullin will be the Assistant Deputy Chief of Support Services upon Chief Serrano's retirement and that she attended the EMS awards ceremony where several members were recipients of those awards, Paramedic Nicholas Ku, Paramedic Scott Wagness, Paramedic Chris Couch, and Chief Michael Mason. She introduced Chief Darius Luttropp who will be taking over Chief Postel's position and Chief Shayne Kaialoa, who will be taking over Chief O'Connor's position. She invited Chief Postel to say a few words since it was going to be his last meeting. Chief Postel provided a few departing words and thanked everyone. She also invited Chief Serrano to say a few words. Chief Serrano also thanked everyone.

President Nakajo thanked the Chief for her report and asked the President of AFA, Stan Lee to come up and talk about the Asian American Heritage and the AFA. Firefighter Lee spoke about the history of the AFA, their proactive outreach, and mentoring efforts.

Vice President Morgan thanked the Chief for her report and acknowledged the nice ceremony today at Station 49. He mentioned that he is available for any help they need in going to the Board of Supervisors and explaining the challenges of autonomous vehicles. He wished happy EMS Appreciation Week to everyone and thanked the retiring staff for their great leadership.

Commissioner Fraser thanked the Chief for her report and expressed her congratulations on EMS Week. She also thought the ceremony at Station 49 was great. She congratulated Chief Postel on his retirement after 32 years of service and thanked him for always bringing up the history of the San Francisco Fire Department in his reports. She thanked Stan Lee for his update.

Commissioner Collins joined the chorus and thanked the chief for her complete report and stated she thought the ceremony at Station 49 was terrific. She congratulated Chief Postel and Chief Serrano on their upcoming retirements.

President Nakajo thanked the chief for recognizing the President of the Asian Firefighters Association, Stan Lee, and allowing him to make his comments. She acknowledged Chief Postel and Chief Serrano for their parting words and thanked them. He congratulated Chief Luttropp and Chief Kaialoa on their new positions.

REPORT FROM ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY CHIEF TOM O'CONNOR Report on the Administrative Divisions, Fleet and Facility status and updates, Finance, Support Services, Homeland Security, and an update from Assistant Deputy Chief, Erica Arteseros-Brown

of Homeland Security Division.

Chief O'Connor presented his report for April 2023. He mentioned that Homeland Security had a busy April with various training and exercises under the California Office of Emergency Services and various drills. He touched on the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion; the Health, Safety, and Wellness Division; the Office of Employee Health, and Support Services. that are held in San Francisco, the Department is not responsible for such as Outside Lands where they provide their own medical coverage as they are income-generating events.

President Nakajo stated his intention to get as many officers and units to present for the commission is to get as much information and knowledge about the SFFD. He thanked Chief O'Connor for his report and found them educational. He asked Chief Serrano to provide any new information on the fire training facility and Chief Serrano stated that he is currently working with Chief Mullin to update him on all the projects, fleet challenges, and facility repairs as well as the fire training facility which is the biggest project they have going on now. President Nakajo appreciated his response and thanked him and stated Chief Serrano is going to be missed.
