



Recent ORD Activity – May 1 – May 31, 2023

132nd Recruit Academy Hiring

SFFD held its second of two pre-hire bootcamps for potential recruits on May 20th, 2023.

- The DOT and the DEIO facilitated two bootcamp preparation sessions for provisional candidates for the 132nd recruit academy. The prospective recruits underwent rigorous physical training to enhance their strength, endurance, and agility. They engaged in cardiovascular exercises, strength training, endurance drills, and agility tests to build the physical resilience needed to perform physically demanding tasks while wearing heavy gear and operating under extreme conditions.
 - The DOT Cadre introduced the prospective recruits to teamwork and effective communication. The prospective recruits participated in group exercises to foster collaboration, coordination, and communication skills. They learned to work seamlessly as part of a team, relying on each other's strengths to overcome obstacles and accomplish goals. These exercises simulate real-life emergency scenarios, encouraging recruits to think critically, make split-second decisions, and communicate effectively under pressure.
 - Conditional offers go out the week of June 5th for final selection.

- **Violence in the Workplace**
 - Police Chief Scott will assign someone to be a misdemeanor contact PD Liaison, we have a PD Felony contact, but many of these issues are misdemeanor.
 - Ideally there would be a “Teams Group” with representatives from PD, DA, & Fire that would ensure follow up for members affected by violence in the workplace.





May continued to be very busy in the Office of Employee Health. We screened over **40** candidates for the 132nd Fire Academy and have fully cleared 60 out of 78 people given job offers. We anticipate clearing 15 more people this week.

Other activities:

End of Probation for 129th Fire Academy, EMS Hires and Promotion exams: 40

End of probation exams include urine and saliva drug screening and a breathalyzer test.

Promotion exams include these three tests plus a physical exam, but no bloodwork.

Return to Work/ Modified Duty: Putting people back to full duty or modified duty after an injury is a daily activity in the office. Once we obtain a Work Status Report from the member's treating clinician, we do a phone call or Facetime with the member to hear and see for ourselves that they are ready for regular duty. Our department has a robust modified duty program, we can accommodate most people recovering from injuries.

Make Up Hearing and TB testing: While the bulk of our TB and hearing testing was completed in March, we held make-up sessions at the end of April and May. In total, we screened 1,383 members!





Fireboat/Energetix DOT Testing Program

The Fireboat testing is now under the random testing program and the names are added to the draw pool daily from Datco Services.

Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Four members were randomly selected and tested; results negative. Received new field tests from Smartox. These promise to provide a faster result compared to the T-cube we are currently using. They are in a research phase only. Per CD2 all members with prescriptions who now test positive will be placed off duty pending a laboratory test to confirm the prescription is within normal use limits. Numbers of testing low due to background investigations during month of May.

Conditional Offer, Promotional and End-of-Probation Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

Cpt. Aspelin provided supplies and breathalyzer maintenance to the Physician's office.

Breathalyzers

All breathalyzers have now been re-certified and returned to the field.

California Driver Licenses (CDL)

Cpt. Aspelin continued to monitor members' driver licenses and tracking software. Currently, there are 2 (two) suspended and 1 (one) out of state license not in compliance. We are pleased to report the DMV software is adequate and are now working on getting all members up to date on their DMV Health questionnaires.



Background Investigations

The background investigations for the 132nd started at the end of April. This was a very large undertaking with 78 candidates. This process took the month of May to complete with assistance from a light duty employee and ISB2 Tibbitts. ISB1/2 will be handling heightened backgrounds for future EMS classes until further notice as well.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechtler, SFFD)

- A total of 148 requests for service were initiated during the month of May 2023.
- 109 service orders were completed and closed out in May 2023. Roofing, fuel tanks and plumbing issues made up the majority of the requests.

PLUMBING

- Only five service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, shower drains) in the month of May 2023.
- Six sewage backups were reported during May 2023 which included ST 7 (2), 25, 1415 Evans, 8 and 14.

The Division held interviews to hire a plumber and electrician who will be tasked with the Department's day-to-day plumbing and electrical needs that are currently managed by DPW trades. Both employees will report to the Stationary Engineer. Support Services anticipates the new employees employment will commence late June or early July. The division will experience an immediate savings with the hiring of trade personnel as we will no longer be utilizing DPWs services for routine plumbing and electrical repairs.

HVAC/HEATING/BOILER

- 1415 Evans Ave: Installation of new HVAC system. Equipment was delivered and anticipate that units will be crane picked early mid-April. DPW's Steamfitters and Sheetmetal Teams will be setting the new units in place. Steamfitters will proceed with installing new gas piping and thermostats the following week. 85% completed. Still need to upgrade stat wire to units (existing did not have enough conductors). Complete startup.

Status update: Walk thru scheduled for June 1.

- FS 23: Heater in Officer's Room needs to be replaced including new t-stats, on-off switch. Drying Room needs new heater and exhaust fan. Modifying controls to include timer and on/off switch in or outside Drying Room.

Status Update: Project is in process and being prioritized within DPW's Steamfitters Shop.

- FS 5: Boiler needs new flue to be fabricated by DPW Sheetmetal Shop; after fabrication and installation of new flue, DPW Steamfitters will run new drain and condensate neutralizer.

Status Update: Project is in process and being prioritized within DPW's Steamfitters Shop.

- FS 28: Flushed entire heating system and strainers of fan coil and air handlers; will replace 3 t-stats. Pump was replaced and 2 of the 3 T-stats have been replaced. The last of the 3 T-stats installed in March. New equipment is not syncing with older equipment plus multiple zones with inadequate heat. Additional control valves and thermostats are needed.

Status update: Quoted 3 days labor plus \$3,000 parts. SFFD to review/approve quote.

- FS 14: New pulleys, motors and belts were installed on the station's exhaust extractor system to improve intake. Fan not performing as designed. Rep from Nederman (manufacturer of the exhaust extractor) came on-site for inspection, and recommended a different exhaust fan for the exhaust extractor.

Status Update: DPW Steamfitters are waiting on material procurement process for new Nederman Fan.

- FS 16: Suspected radiator leak. DPW will replace radiator valve and see if leak stops. If not, we may need a new radiator.

Status update: Repair completed; unit returned to service.

- FS 29: Boiler's Re-circ pump is 5/5.

Status Update: DPW waiting for materials.

- FS 12: Baseboard controls in Comm and Dining Rooms need to be upgraded.

Status Update: DPW waiting for materials.

- FS 22: Re-circ pumps need to be replaced.

Status update: DPW Steamfitters to provide estimate for re-piping.

- FS 9: ESTIMATES RECEIVED from DPW Steamfitters to replace 3 rooftop HVAC units: \$149,701.72.

Status Update: Submitted approval to DPW/BBR to proceed with work as quoted.

- FS 17: ESTIMATE RECEIVED to replace Boiler: preliminary estimate \$222,000. Pending approval from Client (SFFD).

Status Update: deferred until funding is available.

- FS 13: ESTIMATE RECEIVED for Furnace/Forced air units in dorm; price also includes replacing exiting ductwork: preliminary estimate \$80,000.

Status Update: Awaiting formal ESTIMATE from DPW/BBR.

- FS 26: ESTIMATE RECEIVED for Furnace/Forced air units: \$137,211.66.

Status Update: Submitted approval to DPW/BBR to proceed with work as quoted.

- FS 11: Dorm heater not working.

Status update: DPW Steamfitters will replace leaking valves and try to fix leak on unit. Proposes that unit may need to be replaced if leak persists.

CEMENT/ASPHALT

Two cement/asphalt issues were reported at FS 6 and FS 35. *Status Update: Deferred until funding is available.*

EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

FS 33 reported a minor repair was needed to station's exhaust extractor.

Status Update: Repair completed; unit returned to service.

GENERATORS

Minor issues were reported with stand-by generators located at FS 51, 5 and 43 during the month of May, 2023.

Status Update: All units are currently operational, however FS 51 and FS 43 are still pending repairs.

GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

Requested estimate from DPW to replace windows at FS 43. Received estimate from DPW Glass Shop (\$9,833.70 for Officer's Windows). ADC Serrano to discuss scope of materials with DPW Glass Shop before approval. ADC Serrano approved estimate; advised DPW Glass Shop okay to proceed. *Status update: Waiting on start date to be determined.*

CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

LANDSCAPING

- Requested DPW/Bureau of Forestry to perform site inspection of the trees surrounding FS 10 (over 80 trees in total) to determine if any were diseased, at risk of toppling, etc. Site inspection was performed; waiting for a written report on findings but nothing needed immediate attention. A site visit with BUF on May 11th revealed that several trees need significant pruning and thinning. *Status Update: Waiting for written estimate for tree trimming.*
- 1415 Evans Ave: Requested that DPW/Bureau of Forestry perform inspection of large tree in the yard that had suffered some wind damage to its branches. *Status update: Site*

inspection was performed by BUF on May 11th. Waiting for written report from BUF on findings, however the tree was not at risk of uprooting or needed immediate attention.

PAINT

No major paint issues were reported.

PEST MANAGEMENT

FS 6 noticed an increase in rodent intrusion. Increased pest abatement to every 2 weeks for 6-8 weeks.

ESER BOND 2010 NFS – UPDATES THRU MAY 2023

Additional Focused Scope Program (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Emergency Generators:

- **Fire Station 14** – Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
 - Building Permit issued on 6/17/21.
 - This project has been on hold because of other SFFD priority projects but procurement documentation is underway.
 - Invitation to Bid will be advertised in 2023E.S.E.R. BOND 2014 NFS – Updates through May 2023

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Ryor, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Fireboat Station 35 (\$50.5M)** – Certificate of Final Completion was issued on November 11, 2022. Project is in financial close-out.

Focused Scope Program (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17.

Work is complete in 8 of 9 of the Focused Scope categories comprising Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control. Work continues to progress through the last scope category, Generator Replacements.

Emergency Generators:

- **FS 2** – Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.
 - Substantial Completion Certificate issued on 8/24/22
 - Final completion was reached in October 2022, but retention is being withheld due to a fuel port control enclosure leak requiring correction by the contractor.
- **FS 19** – Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and replace main electrical panel.
 - This project has been on hold to accommodate other SFFD priority projects, but procurement documentation is underway.
 - Job Order Contract (JOC) as opposed to open bid is being investigated to reduce time.

Exterior Envelope:

- **Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29)** – FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete; Note that on 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on FS 23 painting due to other priorities.
- **Package 2 (FS 24, 34)** – This project remains on HOLD initially placed at the request of Capital Planning in order to provide supplemental funding to the Police TC&FSD project. It is now expected that those funds will be returned to the SFFD for allocation to a priority project, possibly FS24 and/or FS34.

Network Improvement Project (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Survey existing network infrastructure and document recommended improvements at all fire stations. The first surveys were performed on 1/17/23 at FS 29 and 37. Additional surveys and documentation have occurred at fire stations - three out of nine fiber rings:

- 1/17/23: Fire Stations 29 and 37.
- 3/7/23: Fire Stations 25, 17, 49 (ADF), 9, and BOE at 1415 Evans.
- 4/4/23: Fire Stations 38, 5, 10 and 16
- 4/18/23: Fire Stations No. 7, 2, 28, 41, Chief's Residence.

- **Hose Tower Removal & Replacement (FS 15)** –
On 4/13/23 funding was made available by way of reallocation of funds back to PHS NFS from PHS ADF. Job Order Contract (JOC) is being pursued for time savings. The goal is to NTP construction by Fall ‘23.

Focused Scope Program (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):**Emergency Generators:**

- **FS 37 & 44:**

 - An Invitation to Bid will be advertised in 2023, following FS 15 Hose Tower, depending on available remaining funds to implement the construction phase.



- Potable Emergency Firefighting Water System (PEFWS) project – Draft Conceptual Engineering Report (CER) is being finalized. Design kicked off for Contract A from Lake Merced Pump Station to Sloat Blvd/19th Ave on May 11, 2023.

BOE/FLEET MANAGEMENT (Captain Vince Wong, SFFD)

- The second TDA (Truck 2), is now in service. The third TDFA is scheduled for final inspection mid-June.
- Pre-construction conference for five Braun Ohio Type-1 ambulances completed during the second week of May.
- Two Rosenbauer TDA's are under construction and expected to be delivered within 600 days.
- One QRV replacement vehicle is currently awaiting upfitting.
- Four mini pumpers are having radios installed and awaiting decals.
- BOE is currently researching and developing:
 - Idle-mitigation policies and practices for SFFD fire apparatus
 - EV Implementation Plan to transition Dept. from Internal Combustion Engines (ICE) to Hybrid-Electric to full Electric Vehicle (EV) fleet.
 - EV Fire Engine Spec
- The BOE continues to research and test out new equipment for our firefighters.
- The BOE would like to thank everyone in Support Services for their continued assistance and support. They are a vital part of our crew.

DEPARTMENT ENGINEERING (Stationary Engineer Avo Sarkissian, SFFD)

- Ongoing and routine maintenance at Fire HQ and ADF.
- Tenant improvement project at 1415 Evans remains approximately 80% complete. HVAC units were finally delivered - DPW Steamfitters coordinated logistics with the crane company for installation of these units, which is now underway with 75% of the units currently installed.
- Assisting ADC Serrano with logistics and planning of the new tradespeople potentially being hired in the coming months. Interviews for plumber and electrician positions have


been completed; we are currently waiting for HR to send notices to qualified candidates for the next phase of the hiring process.

- Waterproofing is needed for the gutters at Fire HQ. Estimates are currently being obtained.





REVOLVING MONTHLY OUTREACH

- Multiple Public Safety announcements were provided throughout the month.
- Engine companies continue to distribute fire prevention and education material on calls or the public.
- Coastal Rescue companies continue to give Surf Hazard Education to the community while on calls or while out in public (Targeted to Ocean Beach Area)
- Cliff Rescue units provide rescue and animal safety community outreach in areas like Fort Funston.
- Recruitment efforts continue.
- "See the Red Lights Pull to the Right" campaign for yielding to emergency vehicles is striking comments from the public regarding what to do when they see an emergency vehicle.
- Bicycle safety messages on social media and public areas promote safe riding habits, wearing helmets, following traffic laws, yielding to pedestrians and emergency vehicles, and more. These efforts are to help reduce bicycle-related accidents and injuries.
- Pedestrian Safety and distracted driver safety messages on social media: "Look don't like" (referring to texting), yield to pedestrians, and share the road with a bicyclist, to name a few.
- Pet safety tips for fire and environment-related issues are placed on social media and shared with media outlets. Examples include: Do not forget your pets when making a home, work escape, or disaster plan."
- Cliff and hiking safety messaging on social media help reduce falls, entrapments, and rescue incidents.
- Information on the station rebuilds and the [ESER 2014 BONDS](#) has been posted on social media to help keep the community informed.
- The Department has joined a national fire Service campaign: "[Close your Door before you Doze.](#)" These efforts encourage closing bedroom doors at sleep to increase your chances of survival or saving during a fire. The temperature outside a door can be 1000 degrees, and in the bedroom with a closed door, 100 degrees.
- The Department has teamed up with D.E.M. promoting: "When to Call 911" campaign to help reduce non-emergency calls to 911.
- The Department worked with SF-Environment to promote fire extinguisher disposal.
- The Department assisted SF-Environment with battery safety information and safe disposal. When improperly disposed of, old batteries can cause fires. To learn more, visit: www.sfbatterysafe.org
