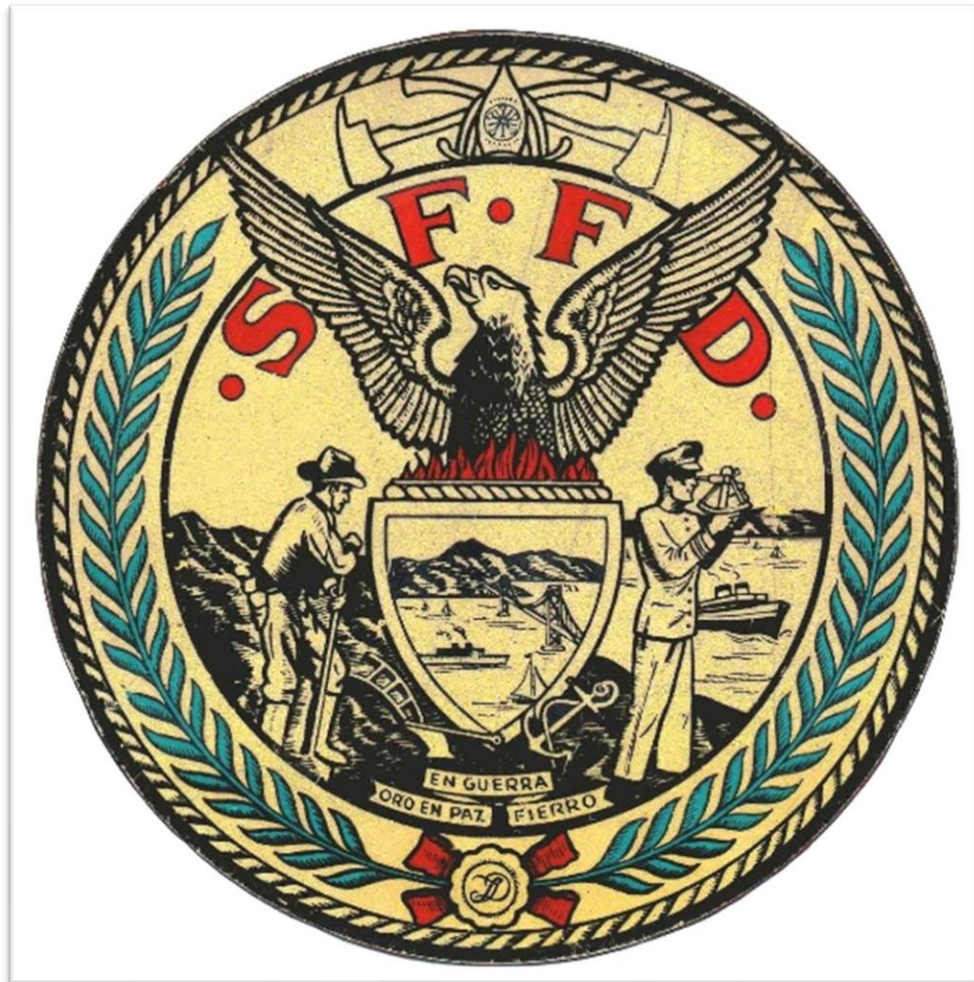

Utilizing retired firefighters as 960s in recruitment agencies harnesses their experience, skills, and dedication to public service. Their deep understanding of crisis situations, safety protocols, adaptability, teamwork, and public relations make them invaluable contributors to the recruitment process. By recognizing their unique expertise and providing them with opportunities to shape the future of firefighting through recruitment, we can ensure that the next generation of firefighters is well-prepared and equipped to handle the challenges they will face.

College Campus Advertising

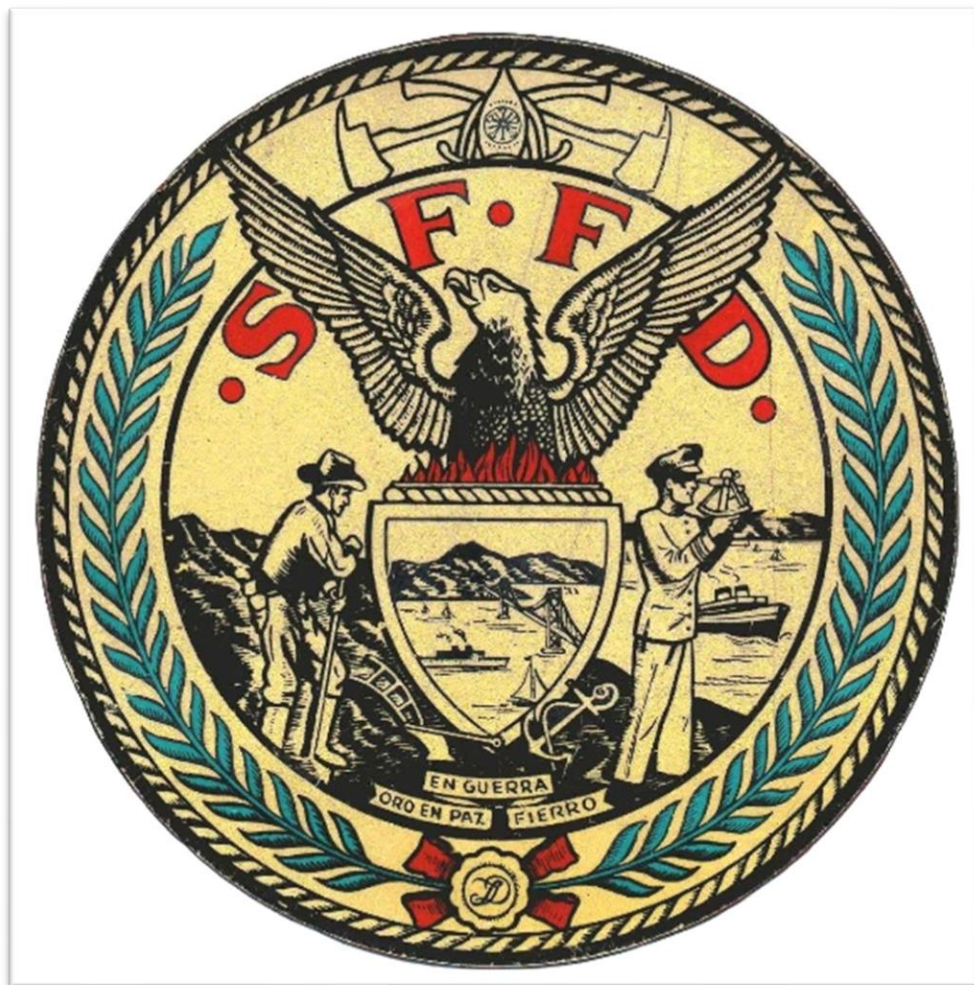

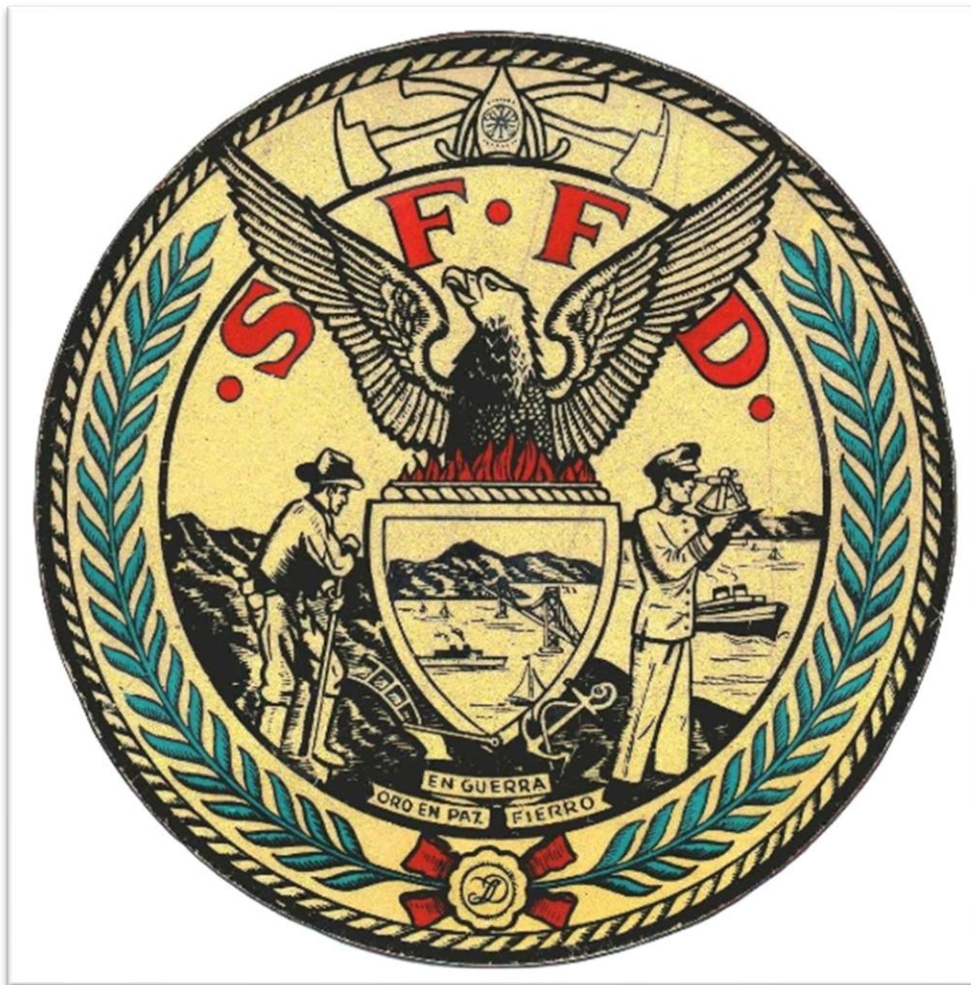

End of probation exams include urine and saliva drug screening and a breathalyzer test.

Promotion exams include these three tests plus a physical exam.

Return to Work/ Modified Duty:

Putting people back to full duty or modified duty after an injury is a daily activity in the office. Once we obtain a Work Status Report from the member's treating clinician, then a phone call or Facetime with the member to hear and see for ourselves that they are ready for regular duty. Our department has a robust modified duty program, we can accommodate most people recovering from injuries.

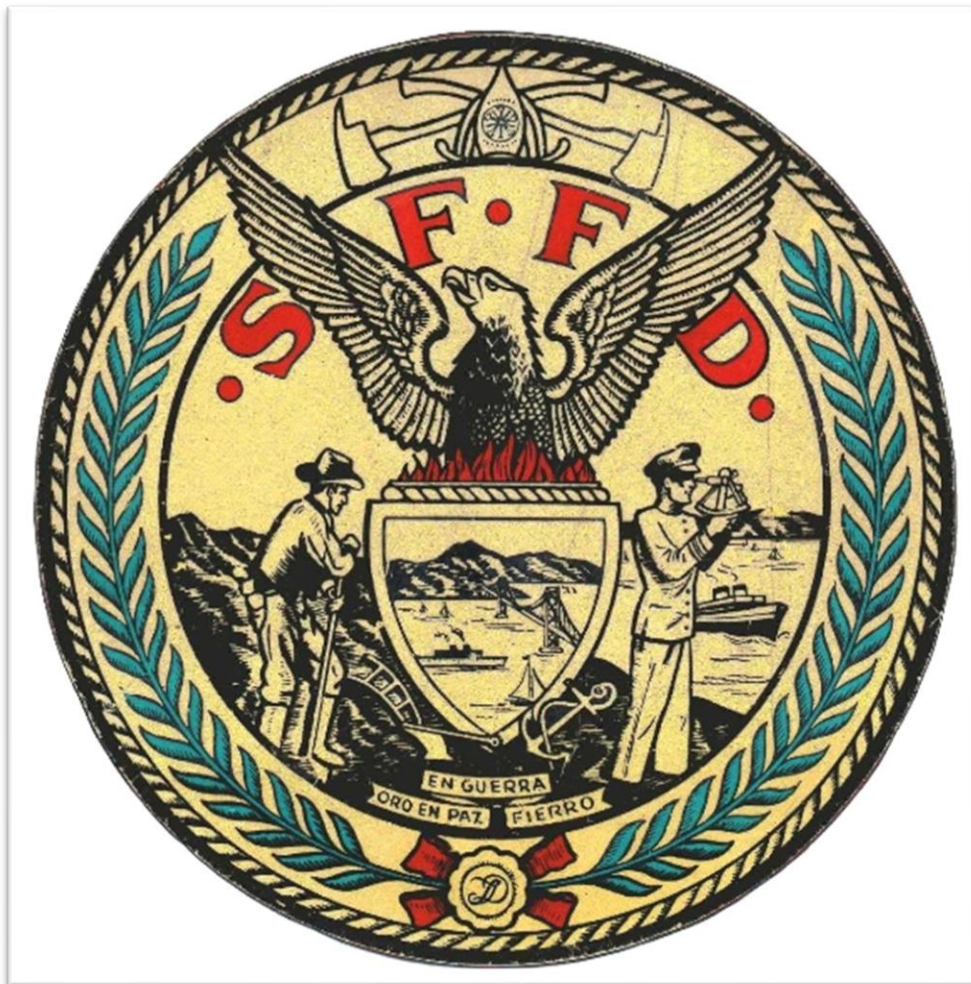

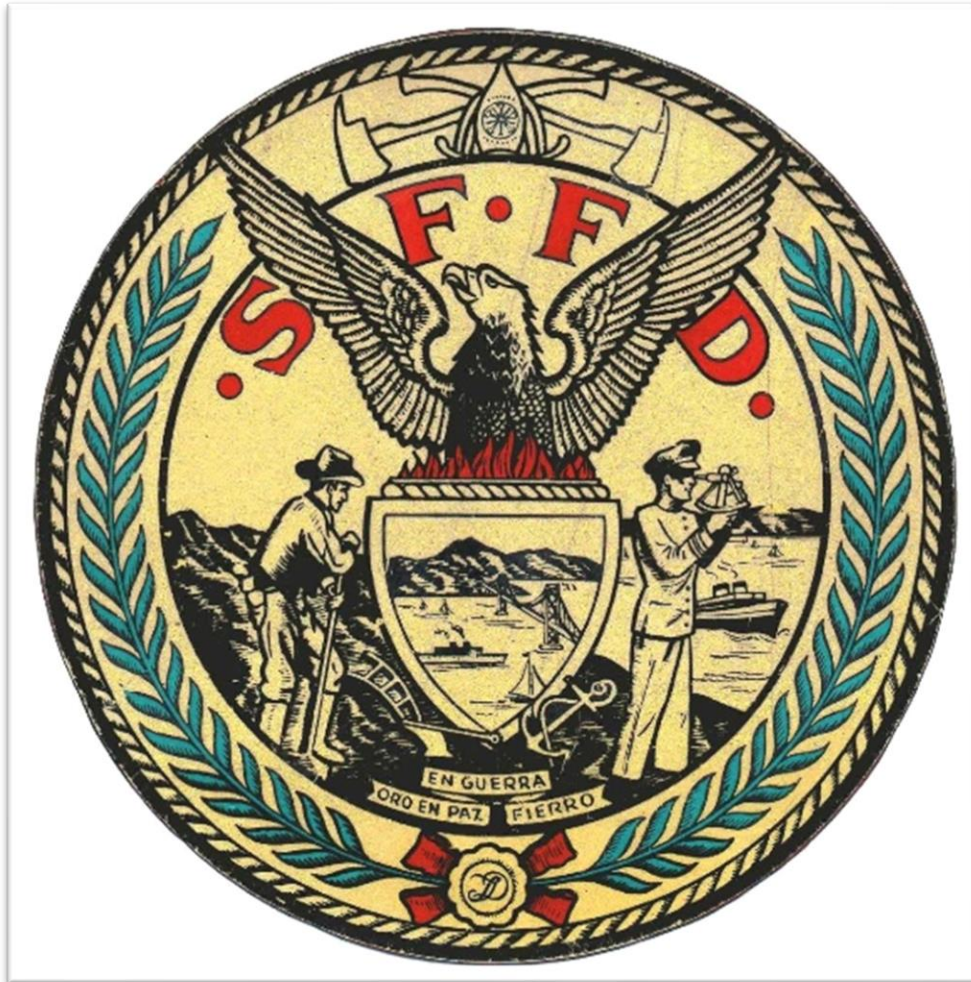

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechtler, SFFD)

- A total of 104 requests for service were initiated during the month of June 2023.
- 116 service orders were completed and closed out in June 2023.

PLUMBING

- Only six service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, shower drains) in the month of June 2023.
- Five sewage backups were reported during June 2023 which included ST 42, 34, 15, 28 and 1415 Evans Ave.
- New water heaters were installed at FS 10 and 25 during June 2023 which are the 6th and 7th water heaters installed since January 1, 2023.

The Division held interviews to hire a plumber and electrician who will be tasked with the Department's day-to-day plumbing and electrical needs that are currently managed by DPW trades. Both employees will report to the Stationary Engineer. Support Services anticipates the new employees employment will commence late June or early July. The division will experience an immediate savings with the hiring of trade personnel as we will no longer be utilizing DPW's services for routine plumbing and electrical repairs. *Status Update: Both employees are scheduled to start July 10, 2023.*

HVAC/HEATING/BOILER

- 1415 Evans Ave: Installation of new HVAC system. Equipment was delivered and anticipate that units will be crane picked early mid-April. DPW's Steamfitters and Sheetmetal Teams will be setting the new units in place. Steamfitters will proceed with installing new gas piping and thermostats the following week. 85% completed. Still need to upgrade stat wire to units (existing did not have enough conductors). Complete startup. Walk thru scheduled for June 1. *Status Update: HVAC installation complete.*
- FS 23: Heater in Officer's Room needs to be replaced including new t-stats, on-off switch. Drying Room needs new heater and exhaust fan. Modifying controls to include timer and on/off switch in or outside Drying Room. *Status Update: DPW's Steamfitters Shop to schedule walk thru with Support Services.*
- FS 5: Boiler needs new flue to be fabricated by DPW Sheetmetal Shop; after fabrication and installation of new flue, DPW Steamfitters will run new drain and condensate neutralizer. *Status Update: DPW's Steamfitters Shop to schedule walk thru with Support Services.*
- FS 28: Flushed entire heating system and strainers of fan coil and air handlers; will replace 3 t-stats. Pump was replaced and 2 of the 3 T-stats have been replaced. The last of the 3 T-stats installed in March. New equipment is not syncing with older equipment plus multiple zones with inadequate heat. Additional control valves and thermostats are needed. Quoted 3 days labor plus \$3,000 parts which was approved by ADC

Mullin. *Status update: New thermostats and control valves have been received and need to be installed. Installation scheduled for mid-July.*

- FS 14: New pulleys, motors and belts were installed on the station's exhaust extractor system to improve intake. Fan not performing as designed. Rep from Nederman (manufacturer of the exhaust extractor) came on-site for inspection, and recommended a different exhaust fan for the exhaust extractor. *Status Update: HVAC installation is complete. Nederman exhaust fan had to be replaced and has been ordered; ETA is 3 months.*
- FS 29: Boiler's Re-circ pump is 5/5. *Status Update: pump has been installed and work order has been completed.*
- FS 12: Baseboard controls in Comm and Dining Rooms need to be upgraded. *Status Update: parts have arrived; installation to be scheduled.*
- FS 22: Re-circ pumps need to be replaced. *Status update: DPW Steamfitters to conduct walk thru with Support Services then provide estimate for re-piping .*
- FS 9: ESTIMATES RECEIVED from DPW Steamfitters to replace 3 rooftop HVAC units: \$149,701.72. *Status Update: Submitted approval to DPW/BBR to proceed with work as quoted.*
- FS 17: ESTIMATE RECEIVED to replace Boiler: preliminary estimate \$222,000. Pending approval from Client (SFFD). *Status Update: deferred until funding is available.*
- FS 13: ESTIMATE RECEIVED for Furnace/Forced air units in dorm; price also includes replacing existing ductwork: preliminary estimate \$80,000. *Status Update: Awaiting formal ESTIMATE from DPW/BBR.*
- FS 26: ESTIMATE RECEIVED for Furnace/Forced air units: \$137,211.66. *Status Update: Submitted approval to DPW/BBR to proceed with work as quoted.*
- FS 11: Dorm heater not working. DPW Steamfitters will replace leaking valves and try to fix leak on unit. Proposes that unit may need to be replaced if leak persists. *Status Update: There were multiple leaks, which included the valves which were replaced, however the unit still leaks. Unit valved-off and put out of service. DPW to quote replacement of unit. Estimate new unit may cost approximately \$3,000 and it may take up to 30 hours to demo old unit and install new one. DPW proposal forthcoming.*

CEMENT/ASPHALT

One cement/asphalt issue pending: FS 6. *Status Update: Deferred until funding is available.*

EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

FS 37, 18, 20, 1 and 44 reported repairs are needed to station's exhaust extractor. *Status Update: Repairs completed; all but FS 1 have been returned to service.*

GENERATORS

No major generator issues were reported.

GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

Requested estimate from DPW to replace windows at FS 43. Received estimate from DPW Glass Shop (\$9,833.70 for Officer's Windows). ADC Serrano to discuss scope of materials with DPW Glass Shop before approval. ADC Serrano approved estimate; advised DPW Glass Shop okay to proceed. *Status update: Waiting on start date to be determined.*

CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

LANDSCAPING

- Requested DPW/Bureau of Forestry to perform site inspection of the trees surrounding FS 10 (over 80 trees in total) to determine if any were diseased, at risk of toppling, etc. Site inspection was performed; waiting for a written report on findings but nothing needed immediate attention. A site visit with BUF on May 11th revealed that several trees need significant pruning and thinning. Waiting for written estimate for tree trimming. *Status Update: Received estimate to remove large overlapping branches that overhang station parking lot, back of building plus work to include elevating branches over sidewalk and parking spaces: Crew of 5 for 3 days \$20,959.34. All 80 plus trees are within the Fire Department's property line and are not funded for maintenance through the Public Works Street Tree SF Program, therefore, we are responsible for all maintenance. Forwarded estimate to CFO to schedule work for next fiscal year. Next trim should be scheduled within the next 3-5 years.*
- 1415 Evans Ave: Requested that DPW/Bureau of Forestry perform inspection of large tree in the yard that had suffered some wind damage to its branches. Site inspection was performed by BUF on May 11th. Waiting for written report from BUF on findings, however the tree was not at risk of uprooting or needed immediate attention. *Status Update: Received estimate for \$3,341.30. On hold for now as other more pressing issues must take precedence.*

PAINT

No major paint issues were reported.

PEST MANAGEMENT

No major pest management issues were reported.

E.S.E.R. BOND 2010 NFS – Updates through May 2023

Additional Focused Scope Program (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Emergency Generators:

- **Fire Station 14** – Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
 - Building Permit issued on 6/17/21.
 - This project had been on hold because of other SFFD priority projects. Architectural documentation is scheduled for completion in September 2023 with procurement to follow.
 - Invitation to Bid will be advertised in 2023

E.S.E.R. BOND 2014 NFS – Updates through June 2023

Seismic Improvement Program (Magdalena Rvor, San Francisco Public Works):

- **Fireboat Station 35 (\$50.5M)** – Certificate of Final Completion was issued on November 11, 2022. Project is in financial close-out. Final Payment Application to Swinerton/Power, JV was approved on 7/10 followed by the final release of retention on 7/12.



Focused Scope Program (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17.

Work is complete in 8 of 9 of the Focused Scope categories comprising Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control. Work continues to progress through the last scope category, Generator Replacements.

Emergency Generators:

FS 2 – Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.

Substantial Completion Certificate issued on 8/24/22 § Final completion was reached in October 2022, but retention is being withheld due to a fuel port control enclosure leak requiring correction by the contractor.

FS 19 – Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and replace main electrical panel.

This project has been on hold to accommodate other SFFD priority projects, but procurement documentation is underway.

Job Order Contract (JOC) as opposed to open bid is being investigated to reduce time.

Exterior Envelope:

Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29) – FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete; Note that on 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on FS 23 painting due to other priorities. o

Package 2 (FS 24, 34) – This project remains on HOLD initially placed at the request of Capital Planning in order to provide supplemental funding to the Police TC&FSD project. It is now expected that those funds will be returned to the SFFD for allocation to a priority project, possibly FS24 and/or FS34

Network Improvement Project (Michael Rossetto, San Francisco Public Works):

Survey existing network infrastructure and document recommended improvements at all fire stations. The first surveys were performed on 1/17/23 at FS 29 and 37. Additional surveys and documentation have occurred at fire stations - three out of nine fiber rings:

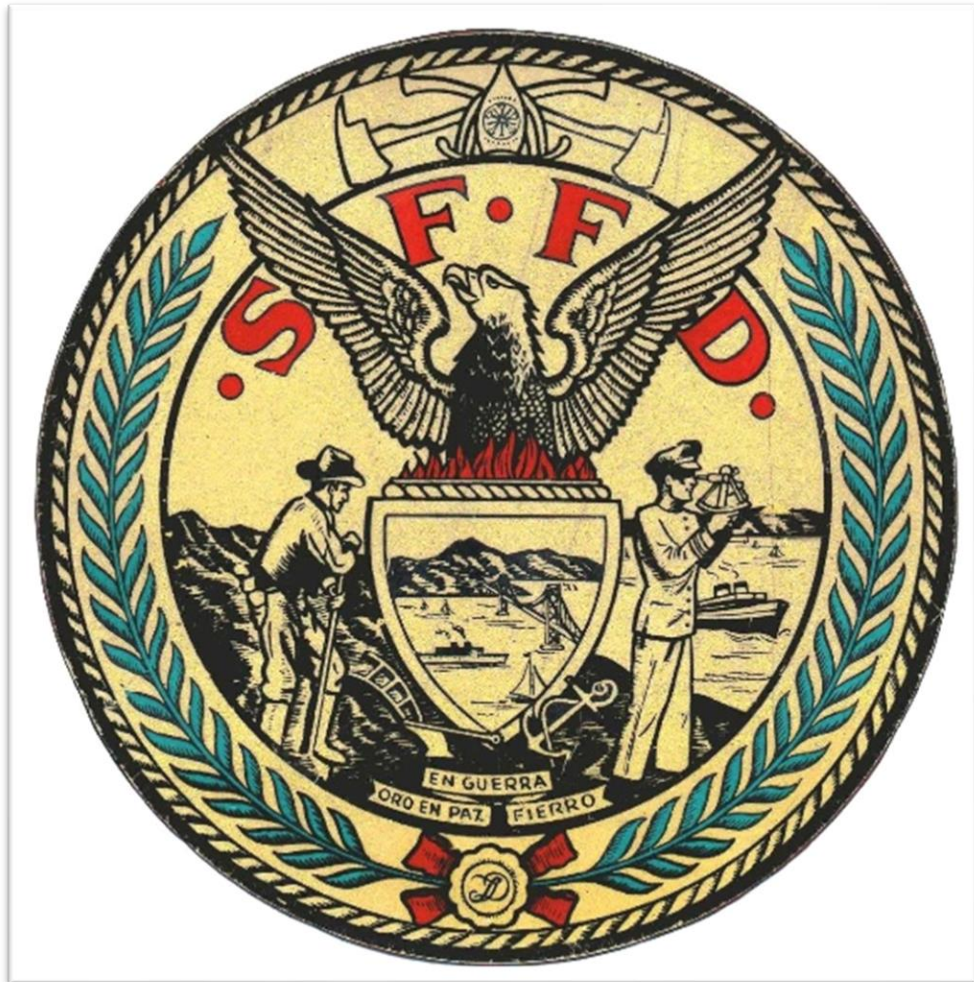

- Neighborhood Fire Stations – Generator upgrade project for stations 44 and 37 specifications complete, the specification for station 37 had to be amended due to the originally specified equipment not complying with emission regulation changes. The vendor advises a 64 week lead time.

- Hose tower removal at Station 15 is the next project in the queue. DPW is finalizing specifications and preparing a Job Order Contract for the work.

- Network Improvement Project – The Survey Team completed the assessment of 7 of the 10 fiber rings, 40 fire department sites have been surveyed. DPW is preparing a job narrative for the selection of a contractor as the project involves many different trades doing a small amount of work at many sites.

- Station 49 continued warranty work.

- Evaluation of PUC draft MOU for box culvert at proposed FTF.

- In May 2023, the SFFD Bureau of Equipment, the In-Service Training Staff, the Emergency Water Supply Committee, and the PUC coordinated a large-scale drill in which the 5” portable hydrant system was tested and Hose Tender 22 and 17 were utilized. Over seven thousand feet of hose was determined to have exceeded its service life and was replaced, and two battalions of Firefighters were trained on deploying a system that spanned over 2,500 feet in length. Future drills are being planned with the PUC and will involve the 5’ hose system, the Fireboat and bayfront manifolds, and the Bay Bridge standpipe system.

- **ROSENBAUER HOSE TENDER**

Pictured below is SFFD's newest Hose Tender manufactured by Rosenbauer. It is the first of three Hose Tenders that the SFFD will receive. This apparatus flowed over 5,500 gallons per minute during the manufacturer's testing process, and it will be used to supply water for the SFFD's above ground 5" hose system. This system is utilized during greater alarms where the domestic water supply is overwhelmed and is designed to provide water for firefighting needs in the event of a major earthquake. The SFFD should take delivery of the Hose Tender within the next few weeks, and the manufacturers will provide three days of instruction to SFFD apparatus operators and the Division of Training.

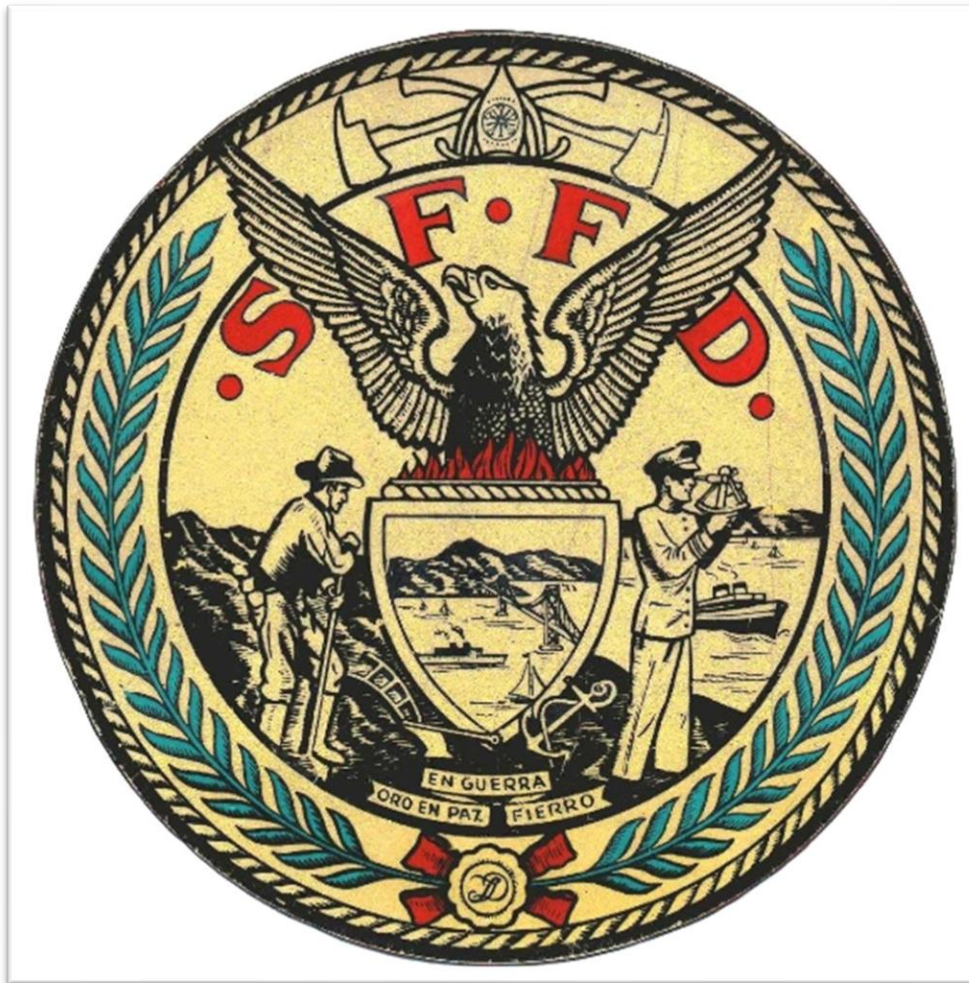


- **TREASURE ISLAND Emergency Firefighting Water Supply (EFWS)**

There are currently four High Pressure Hydrants installed on Treasure Island to augment the domestic supply. The EFWS grid will expand as the Treasure Island development continues. This system will be supplied by Fireboat 3 through a manifold that will be located adjacent to the TI Ferry pier until the construction of a saltwater pump station is completed (projected 2028). The manifold is currently at the foundry and will be installed at the location in the picture below. SFFD is exploring the possibility of a potential secure hose storage facility due to the amount of 5” hose that will be needed to connect the manifold to FB3.

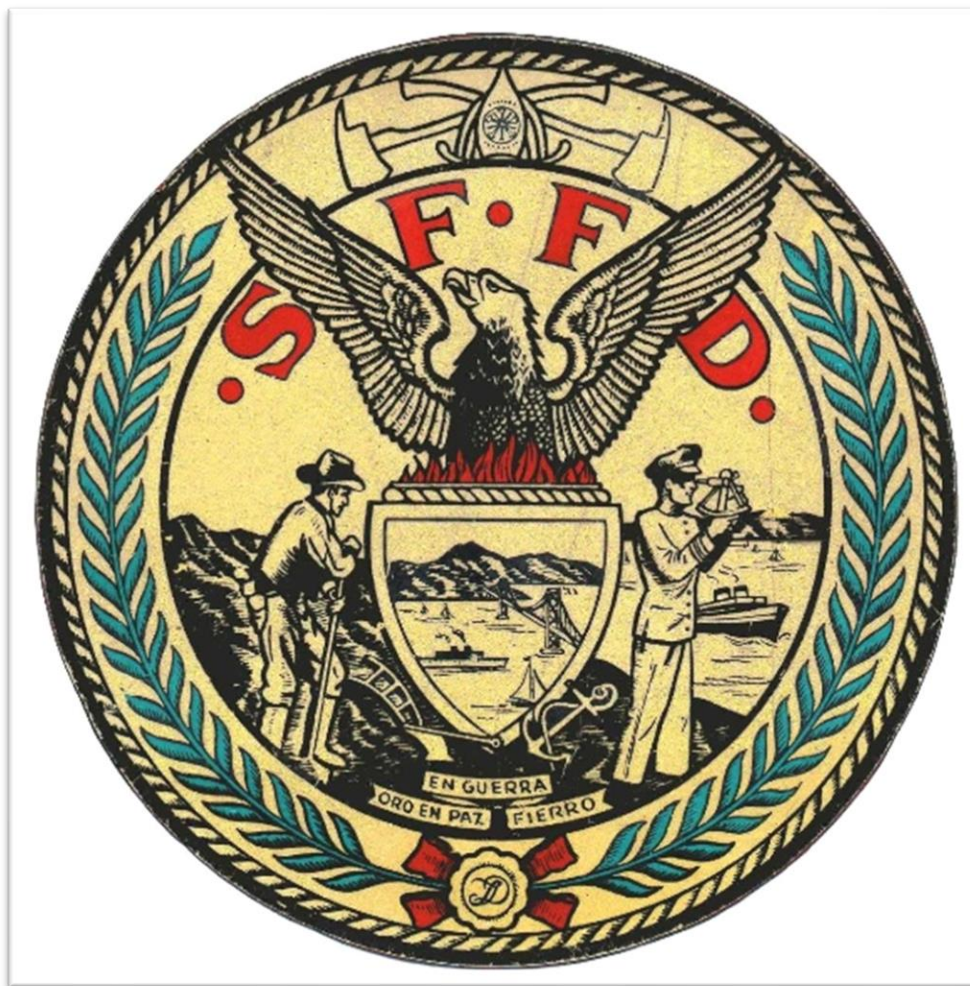
