

- SFMTA: TASC (Transportation Advisory Safety Committee) Summary: All streetscape modification proposals impacting Fire Access reviewed bi-monthly. TASC review for Street Closures for Food Banks, Shared Spaces and Safe Sleeping Sites.
- **SDAT** (Street Design Advisory Team): Weekly meetings with SF Planning Department and City Agencies to review and provide comments on streetscape plans/proposals for building/ development projects.
- **DPW:** SFFD conducts plan review to ensure SFFD apparatus has fire access to buildings, hydrants, fire department connections, fire escapes, etc.
- BART/MUNI: SFFD Liaison to BART/MUNI for Fire and Life Safety Annual Inspections.
- SFFD: Contact Fire Stations regarding Traffic Calming proposals in their response area. Work with SFPD, DPW, SF Parks and Rec and the Presidio regarding the SFMTA Slow Streets and Shared Spaces ensuring Fire Access. Now collaborating with BFP Permits ISCOTT with Shared Spaces temporary street closures (ISCOTT) as there is some overlap of Shared Spaces Street Closures and ISCOTT as we emerged from the Pandemic.






