4. CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT'S REPORT [Discussion]

REPORT FROM CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT, JEANINE NICHOLSON

Report on current issues, activities, and events within the Department since the Fire Commission meeting on September 27, 2023, including budget, academies, special events, communications, and outreach to other government agencies and the public.

Chief Nicholson reported remotely on activities since the last meeting. She provided an update on how the Department is preparing for APEC. She added that the biggest challenge is preparing for protests and that they are working hard on getting the staffing right so they can staff all the emergency operations centers. She mentioned that she, her three deputies, and Mark Corso met regarding succession planning and talked about priorities and charted their analysis, strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. She touched on the budget and the challenging conversations they are having in terms of future cuts. She added that they have hired a plumber Marioa Tuimavave and an electrician Brian Yan. She gave a shout-out to Hashim Anderson who was honored at City Hall recently for the All-Partners appreciation event for dedication to the youth of San Francisco. She touched on events and activities she attended during the reporting period, including Filipino American History Month, American Indian Heritage Month, and the Veteran's Day parade. She announced that Dr. Brokaw will be retiring in March of 2024.

Vice President Morgan wished Chief Nicholson the best of luck during the APEC convention and thanked her for all her hard work and scheduling.

President Nakajo acknowledged the announcement of Dr. Brokaw's retirement and the hiring of an in-house electrician.

There was no public comment.

REPORT FROM ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY CHIEF SHAYNE KAIALOA Report on the Administrative Divisions, Fleet and Facility status and updates, Finance, Support Services, Homeland Security, and update from Anthony Boone of the Environmental Occupational Health and Safety Office.

Chief Kaialoa presented his report for October 2023. He described Homeland Security activities and mentioned the enormous challenge of APEC planning and coordination as well as the interoperability of communications between the civilian and military disaster responders. He added that Chief Arteseros Brown also attended the NERT city-wide drill on October 21st. He touched on the Department of Equity and Inclusion and the work they are doing in creating pathways and partnerships to ensure our youth has a clear pathway to the emergency medical services in the Fire Department; the Health and Safety

and Wellness Division; the Office of Employee Health and Support Services where he described request for services, ESER projects and slides that were in his presentation. His presentation is attached: https://sf-fire.org/media/2910/download?inline

Commissioner Fraser acknowledged the retirement of Dr. Brokaw stating that she has been a wonderful medical director, and her position will be hard to fill. She thanked Chief Kaialoa for his informative and comprehensive report.

Vice President Morgan apologized for missing the dinner where Chief Kaialoa was honored.

President Nakajo confirmed that about 21 heads of state would be attending the APEC conference and that they expect between 20,000 and 30,000 participants. He acknowledged Lt. Hashim Anderson and the wonderful work he is doing. He also stated that he appreciated and was impressed with the photos of Chief Miller and the DOT construction team. He confirmed that the Commission has the responsibility of oversight of the department physician position, and they would participate in the interview process. President Nakajo thanked him for his comprehensive report.
