• Final Results of the 2024 Cancer Screenings:

- 2 of the modalities offered were free, 2 modalities (Prenuvo & United Diagnostics*) were out of pocket expense incurred by our members. *United Diagnostics offered 15 complimentary scans
 - UNITED DIAGNOSTICS (Ultrasound) 29 Members Screened (15 screens complimentary & 14 scans @ \$350)
 - PRENUVO (MRI) 74 Members to Date have scheduled an appointment @ \$1899 / scan
 - LUCID (Esophageal Cancer) 259 Members Screened (FREE)
 - MELANOMA Skin Checks 379 Screened; 89 were referred for biopsy and further screening from the 2 weekends (FREE)







• Study Updates

- Sulforaphane Study funded by the San Francsico Firefighters Cancer Prevention Foundation:
 - Completed our 2^{nd} and final blood draw January 7 9, 2025
 - Results should be expected in May or June
 - Going to be analyzing blood and urine for:
 - Biomarkers of Inflammation: C reactive proteins
 - Epigenetic age (our cellular age as comparted to our chronological age)
 - Detoxification of heavy metals
 - In 20 samples, detoxification of PFAS
 - PFAS is measured in parts per trillion, there are POUNDS of PFAS on one SET of TURNOUTS!
- Nutrition Study funded by the San Francisco Firefighters Cancer Prevention Foundation
 - The first orientation is going to be held at the Div. Of Training Folsom St on January 13th and another on January 31st.
 - In increments of 20 participants, totaling 120 volunteers to be placed randomly with a meat and dairy based diet vs a plant-based diet.
- Fuel Pump Study funded by MKThink
 - Investigates how fire station design and Indoor Environmental Quality (IEQ) impact cancer risks among firefighters.
 - Building on the initial pilot analysis of two San Francisco fire stations (Stations 2, and 5), we aim to identify environmental hazards, assess pollutant exposure, and validate **interventions** that reduce cancer-related risks.
 - Both stations have fuel pumps INSIDE the stations.
 - Oakland Fire Dept –All fuel pumps are OUTSIDE
 - All of Marin County All fuel pumps are OUTSIDE
 - Sensors Deployed (6 / Station)
 - Indoor Air Quality: PM2.5, PM10, VOCs, CO, CO2, and formaldehyde
 - Planned to have sensers installed on Jan 15th and begin analysis.


- Lighthouse Wellness App Monthly Check The mission of Lighthouse Health & Wellness App is to ensure that the SFFD is able to provide its employees and families with sustainable, confidential and anonymous access to first responder-focused health and wellness resources. See analytics on App below.
- First Responder Peer Support Advisory Committee- BHU meets with SFPD, Sheriffs and Dispatch behavioral health teams for discussion, problem solving, inter-agency support and sharing of resources.
- SFHSS ComPsych monthly Specialty Provider Meeting: First responder behavioral health groups meet with EAP Counselors and SFFHSS Wellness manager to discuss issues and answer questions for our Specialty Providers
- BHU Collaboration with Office of Employee Health: The BHU is collaborating with the SF DHR Workers' Compensation Division to educate Claims Adjusters about the daily work and challenges faced by our Firefighters, EMTs, and Paramedics. Additionally, we are working with Maria Mariotto, our Ombudsman and WC Manager, to streamline the PTSD claims process, making it faster and less stressful for our members.
- Transcendental Meditation weekly meeting: TM Pilot program sponsored by the David Lynch for SFFD members. 20 members trained in the TM tech. Group created a weekly meeting to sit together.
- Iron Neck Pilot: The Iron Neck is a fitness tool designed to strengthen and rehabilitate neck muscles, helping prevent injuries like concussions and whiplash. It enables 360-degree resistance training to improve neck stability, mobility, and strength, making it valuable for athletes, first responders, and rehabilitation programs. Compact and versatile, it's ideal for injury prevention and recovery.
- Three members in the field have been selected to train on the neck-strengthening tool. Once trained, they will introduce it to their stations and teach others how to use it safely and effectively. (photo)



Fireboat/Energetix DOT Testing Program

The Fireboat testing is now under the random testing program and the names are added to the draw pool daily from Datco Services.

Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

The Random Alcohol and Drug Testing Program is in compliance for the month of December.

Cpt Weddle has ordered and received 400 oral drug testing kits that will be used by both ISB and the Doctors office. Tests have been received.

Three Intoximeters have been scheduled for inspection and calibration for a send-in date of 2/10/25.

Conditional Offer, Promotional and End-of-Probation Alcohol and Drug Testing Program

58 Members participated in pre-employment, promotional, and end of probation alcohol and drug testing with the Dr. office.

Cpt Weddle/Carter continue to ensure the Dr. Office has all the necessary supplies for alcohol and Drug testing.

Post Accident Investigations

Investigative Services conducted two Post Accident investigations.

Breathalyzers

The final three Breathalyzers due for recalibration have been collected from the field and will be sent to Intoximeter by 2/10/25. This process will conclude the inspection, recalibration and recertification of all breathalyzers. Next service will not be done until 2026.

California Driver Licenses (CDL)

Cpt Weddle/Carter continue to monitor all Dept. members' Drivers Licenses via CA DMV Pull Notifications.

ISB completed the 2024 end-of-year driver's license audit. Added new employees and removed employees no longer employed by SFFD.

Background Investigations

Background investigations for the 135th fire academy have concluded.

Investigative Services conducted an in-depth background investigation on approximately 86 candidates for the 135th class.

Capt. Weddle/Carter are prepping for the upcoming H3 academy background investigations.

Other Business

Cpt Weddle has created a step-by-step job aid book for Investigative services. This has helped with the smooth transition from Cpt Weddle to Cpt Carter starting mid-December. Cpt Carter has been training for the ISB position since 12/17/24, and is expected to take over as ISB Captain by 1/17/25.

Cpt Weddle/Carter participated in the Fire Control 3 course held at Treasure Island Training Center on 1/7 & 1/8/25.

Support Services

FACILITY MAINTENANCE & PLANNING (June Waechtler, SFFD)

• A total of 140 requests for service were initiated and 124 service orders were completed and closed out in December.

PLUMBING

• Thirty two service calls were placed to resolve minor plumbing issues (faucet, toilet, urinal repairs; clogged sinks, shower drains) in the month of December. Two sewage backups were reported during this month (FS 11 and 3).

HVAC/HEATING/BOILER

FS 13: SO #2154832. ESTIMATE RECEIVED for Furnace/Forced air units in dorm; price also includes replacing exiting ductwork: preliminary estimate is \$80,000. Awaiting formal ESTIMATE from DPW/BBR. DPWs Steamfitters made a temporary repair, however 2/4 zones have bad heat exchangers and gas is locked out. Unit is working with temporary repair in place. Received estimate for \$104,888.00. Quote approved by Support Services. Waiting for labor availability and funding transfer. DPW Steamfitters are reviewing system operations of new units at St 26 then they will replicate system for St 13 as per discussion with Support Service's Assistant Deputy Chief and Stationary Engineer. Still discussing which units to purchase with SFFD Stationary Engineer. Waiting for equipment to be approved by Support Services. Steamfitters also propose surveying the electrical panel as discussed with SFFD. Waiting for labor. Equipment has been ordered from Norman S. Wright. As of 10/8/24, Steamfitters are waiting on a PO for the new equipment. Equipment due to arrive week of December 2, 2024. After inspection, work will be scheduled to commence. Status update: Work has started on the furnace replacement. Gas piping has been capped off for demolition. New thermostat wire is needed to operate new units; conduits and junction boxes have been traced to pull new wires.

FS 22: Re-circ pumps need to be replaced. DPW Steamfitters to conduct walk through with Support Services then provide estimate for re-pipe. Moving forward with estimate for re pipe. SO # 2314145 was submitted to SFFD for approval to re-pipe boiler. Waiting on Client approval. *Status Update*: SFFD approved scope of work to be performed. Re-piping material estimate has been submitted to purchasing.

FS 23: Heater in Officer's Room needs to be replaced including new t-stats, on-off switch. Drying Room needs new heater and exhaust fan. Modifying controls to include timer and on/off switch in or outside the Drying Room. Waiting for a quote from DPW's Steamfitters Shop for two heaters, one exhaust fan and the necessary control work. Quote received from DPW, in for ADC of Support Service's review. ADC of Support Services requested that a quote be provided just for the fan coil replacement. Steamfitters propose to modify the existing estimate and resend mid-July. SO # 2115449 was submitted to SFFD for the Officers Room heater replacement. Waiting on Client approval.

FS 29: SO #2249790 Heating system is down. Noted that the pumps here on this system are frequently replaced. Steamfitters are recommending re-pipe unit similar to FS 12. Waiting on

Client approval. *Status Update*: SFFD approved scope of work to be performed. Re-piping material estimate has been submitted to purchasing.

FS 37: RADIATORS It was discovered that 17 radiators need new valves to control on/off. Nine units do not work. Waiting for the proposal to change out all valves. The Drying Room Heater needs a 3-way valve and an outdoor air override that needs to be installed. Proposing two men to take nine days, plus \$3500 in parts. The heat is on in the Station and the new program settings are adequate to get through the winter. Work will need to be done when they are permitted to shut boiler down for a few days. Waiting for a formal quote to be sent to ADC Support Services for sign off. *Status Update*: Deferred.

FS 41: SO #2155508. Boiler controls proposal. Received revised quote from DPW Steamfitters \$23,559.83. Approved by Support Services. Order of new relays and wire has arrived; DPW will schedule labor to replace contactors and relays in the control panel. Status Update: Work is scheduled to start on the boiler controls mid-October, including new pump contactors and relays. Status Update: System needs new expansion tank and PRV. Boiler is working; new parts will prolong the life of pump and boiler. Anticipate that the new parts will run approximately \$3,000; 32 hours of labor needed for install. Waiting on Client approval. *Status Update:* SFFD approved scope of work to be performed. Parts estimate has been submitted to purchasing.

FS 43: DPW Steamfitters are investigating intermittent heat issues on 1st Floor. Waiting for findings. There is an existing radiant heating system on the 1st floor of the Station. Steamfitters are proposing to see if they can repair a system which could resolve the heating issue. Steamfitters advise if the unit is not repairable, they propose designing a new heating system for the 1st floor. Project under consideration by Support Services. Steamfitters anticipate that they will be restoring the old system that was abandoned (as indicated in old system drawings) versus designing a whole new heating system.

CEMENT/ASPHALT

In November, we solicited and received a written estimate for minor sidewalk repairs necessary at **FS 39** (\$702). One day needed to demo, two days needed for curing. Tentative start date – December 2, 2024. *Status update:* Work Completed.

EXHAUST EXTRACTORS

In December, FS 3, 41, 1, 2 (2), 10, 39 and 25 reported issues with their equipment; all units were repaired and returned to service.

GLASS/WINDOWS/SCREENS

No major glass/window/screens issues were reported.

CARPENTRY

No major carpentry issues were reported.

ELECTRICAL

No major electrical issues were reported.

LANDSCAPING

Total Funding allocated for the Focused Scope Program is \$21,407,279, approved by SFFD on 8/17/17. Work is complete in 8 of 9 of the Focused Scope categories comprising Roofing, Apparatus Bay Door Replacements, Exterior Envelope Improvements, Windows, Showers, HVAC/Mechanical, Sidewalk/Slabs, and Security Access Control. Work continues to progress through the last scope category, Generator Replacements.

Emergency Generators:

- o FS 2 − Scope of work: replace existing rooftop generator set, structurally strengthen roof structure to support new fuel tank with capacity for 72-hour run time and provide new fuel fill port and piping to generator.

 This project is complete.
- FS 19 Scope of work: replace existing generator at grade and replace main electrical panel.
 - The generator lead time has increased. The manufacturer now reports a delivery date of April 2025.
 - 11/27/24: DPW-BUF tree removal & general pruning of trees adjacent to the emergency generator was completed in Dec 2024. Revision of generator enclosure to A-Frame design completed by BOA.
- **FS 14** Scope of work: replacement of existing generator with new rooftop generator, new subgrade fuel fill port at the sidewalk in front of the station, and new fuel piping from sidewalk to generator.
 - DPW-BOA has been approved to re-initiate the project with a concepts phase to validate changing the generator from a rooftop to a ground-mounted location that will be fuel-filled by hand in lieu of piped. The concepts drawing was delivered to SFFD on 4/29/24 and approved. DPW held a design review with the new SFFD Captain and is awaiting SFFD direction to move forward with redesign. On hold.

■ 10/25/24: A pre-application meeting was held with Fire Prevention to discuss the redesign concept with the Fire Marshal. 10/31/24: BoA delivered pre-app. meeting minutes which were approved by Chief Harold. BoA will begin composing AB-005 for the redesign proposal.

Exterior Envelope:

- o **Package 1 (FS 8, 20, 23, 29)** FS 8, 20, and 29 are complete; On 1/15/21, SFFD requested a hold on FS 23 painting due to other priorities.
- o **Package 2 (FS 24, 34)** This project remains on HOLD initially placed at the request of Capital Planning in order to provide supplemental funding to the Police TC&FSD project. It is now expected that those funds will be returned to the SFFD for allocation to a priority project, possibly FS24 and/or FS34.
- o **FS 17 & 31** Exterior Envelopes were requested as new projects by SFFD in August 2023, both as lower priorities. These were approved by the Capital Planning Committee for use of ESER 2014 interest. A waterproofing consultant is recommended to determine corrective measures and potential costs.

Miscellaneous:

FS35 Security Fence Enhancements, FS17 Boiler Replacement & FS 29 Apparatus Bay Door Replacement were requested as new projects by SFFD in August 2023. These are ranked as the highest priority (most urgent) projects after the Network Modernization project.

Highlights:

- SFFD provided responses on 12/13/24 to SF Planning's list of questions that were received on 11/22/24, related to proposed fire training activities and the updated environmental assessment for smoke emissions. The answers to these questions will help Planning complete their evaluation of the new data and whether to consider modifying one of the mitigation measures in CEQA.
- The draft updated geotechnical report, based on the recent additional 23 soil borings, was released on 12/13/24 to help support structural and civil engineering efforts as part of Design Development. The report helped further define some of the existing underground

conditions, including a previously unidentified former bay inlet along the west side of the site which includes additional bay mud deposits. Information in this new report may require additional design considerations for structural and civil engineering. The final report is due 1/17/25.

- The RFQP for CMGC Services is still in process. During the month of December, Addendum 1 was released with 50% Design Development drawings also being provided to potential bidders. Proposals are due on 1/14/25. After proposal evaluations, interviews, notification of the successful candidate, and agreement negotiations are completed, the goal is to go before the Public Works Commission in mid-March 2025 for their formal approval of the CMGC agreement. Final notice to proceed for the successful CMGC is anticipated to be in early- to mid-April 2025, just as the project is beginning the Construction Documents phase of design.
- During the month of December, the options for exterior building materials were further explored to try and address concerns regarding ease of cleaning and repair for graffiti and vandalism. A variety of building material samples were sent to DPW's BBR group (Bureau of Building Repair which handles graffiti removal on all City owned buildings). BBR created several mock-ups, and the entire team visited their shop to observe the performance of the various materials. As previously assumed, brick did not perform well, even with two different anti-graffiti coatings. The best performing material was large format porcelain panels (Crossville), which was easier to clean and was resistant to scratching and gouging with a tool. Phenolic panels (Trespa) also performed well. The design team is further developing designs for the exterior to use one or both of these materials in a way that is reminiscent of brick in color and layout. The new designs are being estimated to confirm budget impact for this change in materials. At the end of Design Development (late-February, early-March), the updated designs will be presented to the Civic Design Review committee for their review.
- Planning and the City Attorney's Office (CAT) have determined that only Planning Code Map Amendments (not Planning Code Text and Map Amendments) will be required for the zoning changes on the site. Draft legislative language has been provided by CAT for two Planning Code Map Amendments: one for the zoning change of some parcels from PDR-2 (Production, Distribution, Repair) to P (Public); one for the bulk and height change from 40/X (40' height) to 90/X (90' height). These changes are required to meet the planned uses on the site and proposed building heights (84' training tower tallest building). Additionally, CAT is working on legislative language for the vacation of 3 paper streets (unbuilt City roads) so that they can be incorporated into the overall site. The goal is to introduce these legislative items in January (or February) 2025. Supervisor Walton has agreed to introduce these items at a future Board of Supervisors meeting. This would start the clock on the legislative process, which will include public hearings and review by the Planning Commission.

Operations:

The PIO Office is committed to providing internal and external information as needed. In addition to our department, the PIO office engages with the public and external public safety and government entities daily to ensure the safety of our members and the public we serve.

Operations:

December was an opportunity for the training and preparation of the PIO office to come into play during two significant, first-of-their-kind regional emergencies. The first was on December 5th, when a Tsunami Warning was issued for the Northern California coast due to an offshore earthquake. The preparation of crisis messaging and a clear operations document allowed emergency messaging and instructions to be dispersed via social and traditional media before other City agencies had a chance to gather their messaging. Had this been an actual Tsunami evacuation, this preparation bought over 30 minutes of notice and preparation time for residents and visitors.

Second, a Tornado Warning was issued in the early hours of December 14th, which again was addressed using prepared messaging following a clear operations plan.

Events and Community Engagement:

Holiday Decorations Contest—Station 18 won the Bomberos-sponsored Holiday Station Decoration Contest, reimagining extensive decorating from the 1930s and 40s. Many communities' social accounts covered the contest, including the SF Standard, which posted a map of all stations participating as part of their "Holiday Lights of San Francisco" piece shortly before the Christmas Holiday. This event brings 'Community outreach" to each station that participates and strengthens the bond between Public Safety and the communities we serve. It is also fun.

The PIO Office hosted a "Meet your PIO" event at Red Bay Coffee, which included public safety PIOs from local agencies and media from all over the Bay Area. Each reporter was given a prepared thumb drive of SFFD images and media to use as a B-roll or images for stories. This event facilitated networking between regional PIO teams and the media we serve. We are the only Pio agency in California to hold such an event.

Training:

Mayor London Breed recognized the SFFD PIO for its work during and before the Tsunami and Tornado and for becoming the first 24-hour PIO shop in Northern California. FEMA also recognized members for completing the required training to work toward California Specialist Credentialing for Public Information Officers. All PIO members received a letter from FEMA.

Members continue seeking training opportunities to serve the SFFD and the community better.

It is important to note that in December 2024, two incidents of worldwide attention featured the SFFD PIO as the primary Public Information Officer: The December 5th Tsunami Warning and the December 14th Tornado Warning. Both incidents featured the SFFD PIO on multiple national channels and briefly extended the reach of messaging on websites and news channels worldwide. Any spike in viewership or audience reach will likely return to normal expected levels in January, pending no additional large-scale disaster warnings.
