





Residential Buildings w/ 9+ units for last 12 months







Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Permits Section)





Permit Annual Inspections by Section (High-Rise)





Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Districts Section)





Activities and Projects:

- The 137th Academy is in full swing. We are in week five and the class is doing very well.
- Special Ops is conducting several drills throughout the city. Currently, they are having Confined Space and Haz-Mat drills with collaboration from the Presidio.
- The DOT is moving forward with developing a Rope Rescue Awareness and Operations Cadre. We are continuing to task book our instructors and the DOT has partnered with the Airport Division to utilize their RRAO classes to develop more instructors. The 137th class will be the first class to be given RRAO prior to graduation which is a huge win.
- We are working with City College to develop a course for our members to enroll in their entire career. This will generate \$3.50 per hour of training, and I estimate will bring in funds over 1 million dollars per year for training. This is in the infancy stage but City College is fully invested in this program.
- H16 Neal Narayan has been creating training videos, podcasts, and rebuilding our Vector Solutions online training. These videos generate CJAC funds from our members. We will continue to publish monthly podcasts focused on training.

- The DOT hosted several classes through CJAC funds in the month January and February. This includes “Access Granted” Lock Pick Classes to limit damage to buildings for non emergency entry. These classes were well attended and in high demand. E14 used their lock picking skills on a water leak in a vacant home and accessed the high value home without damage in February.
- In-Service staff are currently taking training to the field and visiting stations to conduct training. We are gearing up for a module in March relating to greater alarms and live fire.
- In Service Training has been having multiple live burns. The props have been re-imagined making it more realistic with bedrooms, kitchen, closets, furniture, cabinets, and hoarder conditions. We have expanded adding two more connex boxes to simulate below grade operations.
- The DOT is finishing up on a Virtual Command and Control exercise for our chief officers which will consist of radio traffic, a fire scenario, and assigning companies. Additionally, it will have a Tablet Command component for tracking companies. BC Cannon is assisting with IPAD and Tablet Command.
- We have several classes on the horizon from DOT. Will have Forcible entry, Confined Space, and ICS 300, and Fire Investigation 1B. Two of these classes are in collaboration with the Airport Division.
- DOT and the field have increased their support for the Fire Reserves. We are detailing companies to assist them on Thursday Training nights. Several officers have volunteered to assist with this. We have obtained equipment for them and are searching for a dedicated legacy apparatus to give to them for training and company pride. FB3 hosted the reserves in January and T12 assisted at Folsom in February with an introduction to power saws.


