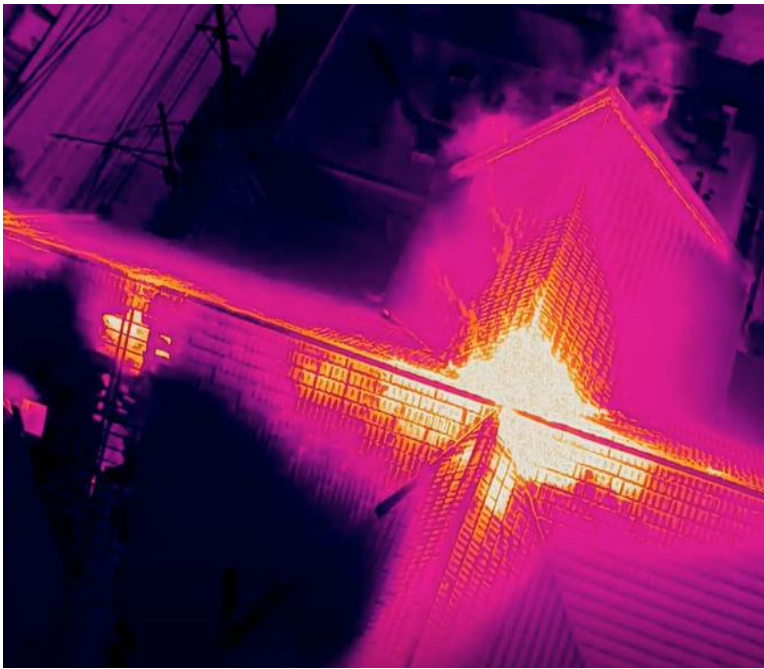

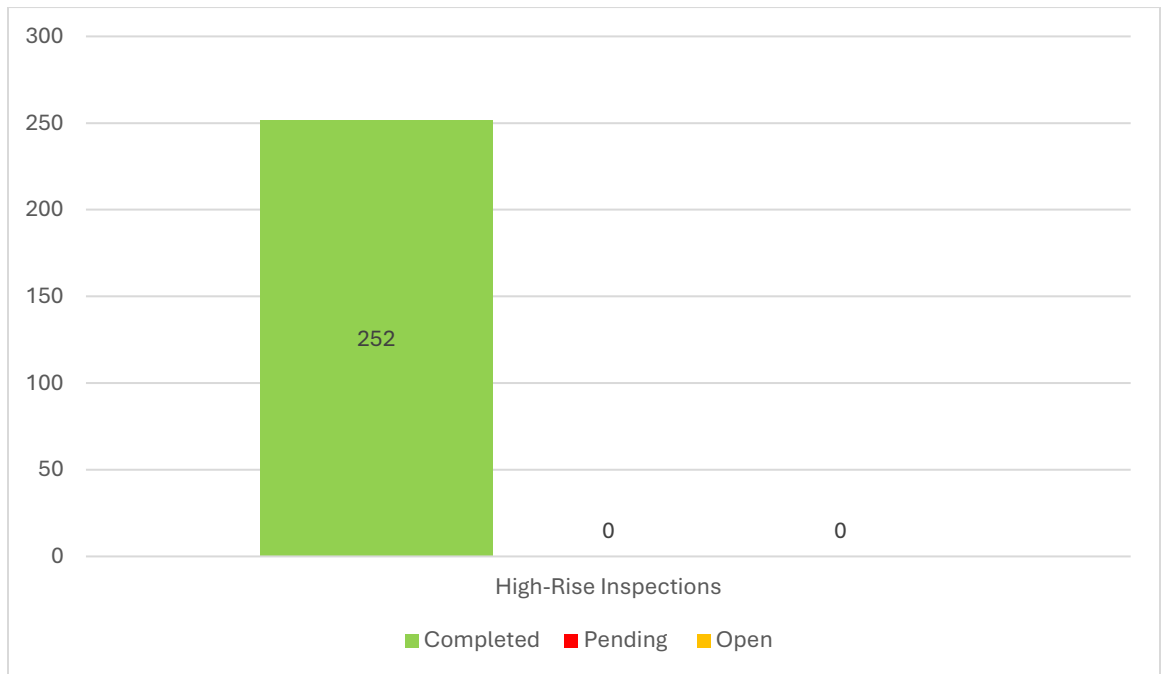

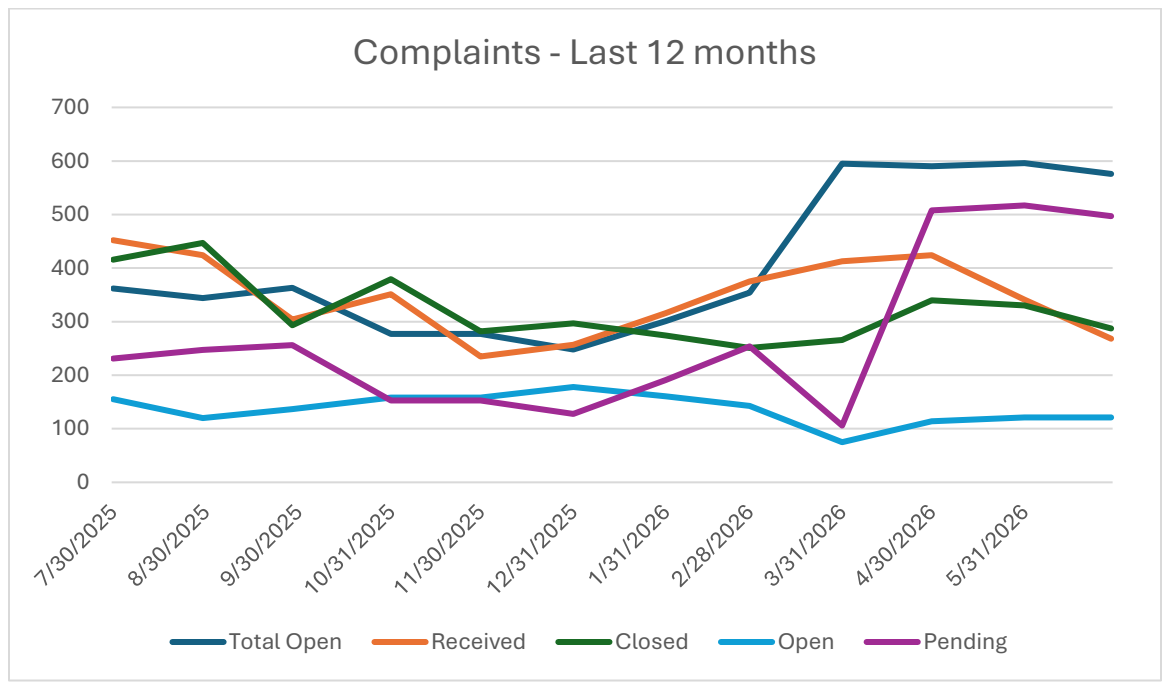

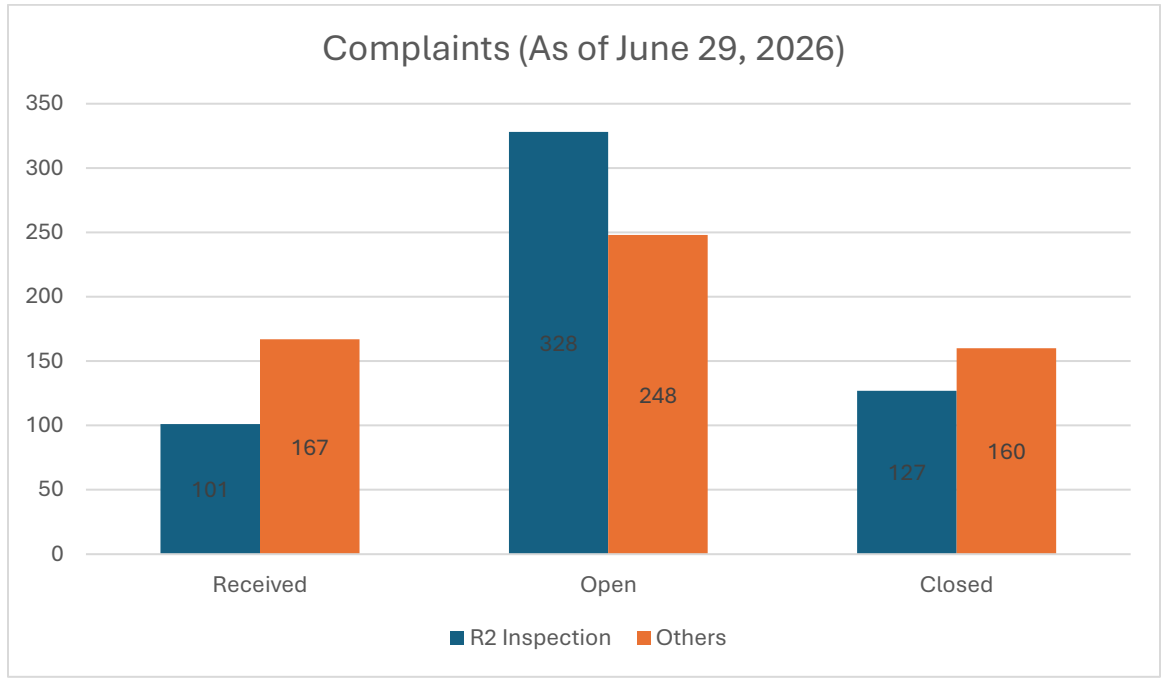

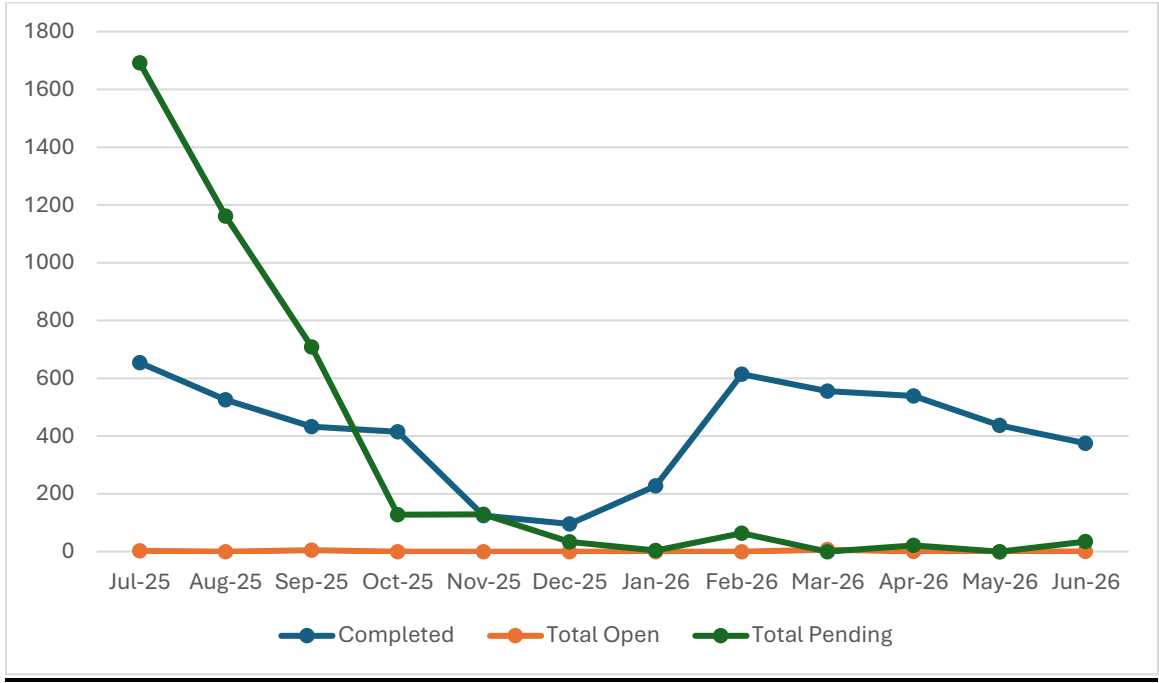

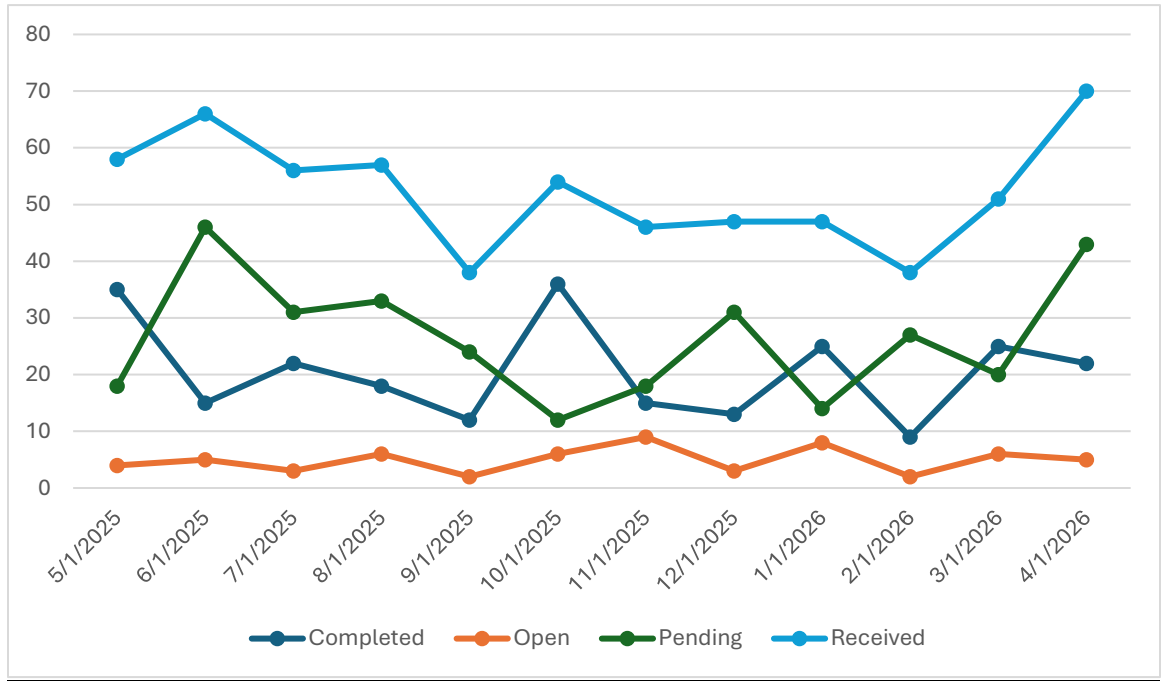
Overall Annual R1/R2 Inspections (2026)

Residential Buildings w/ 9+ units for last 12 months



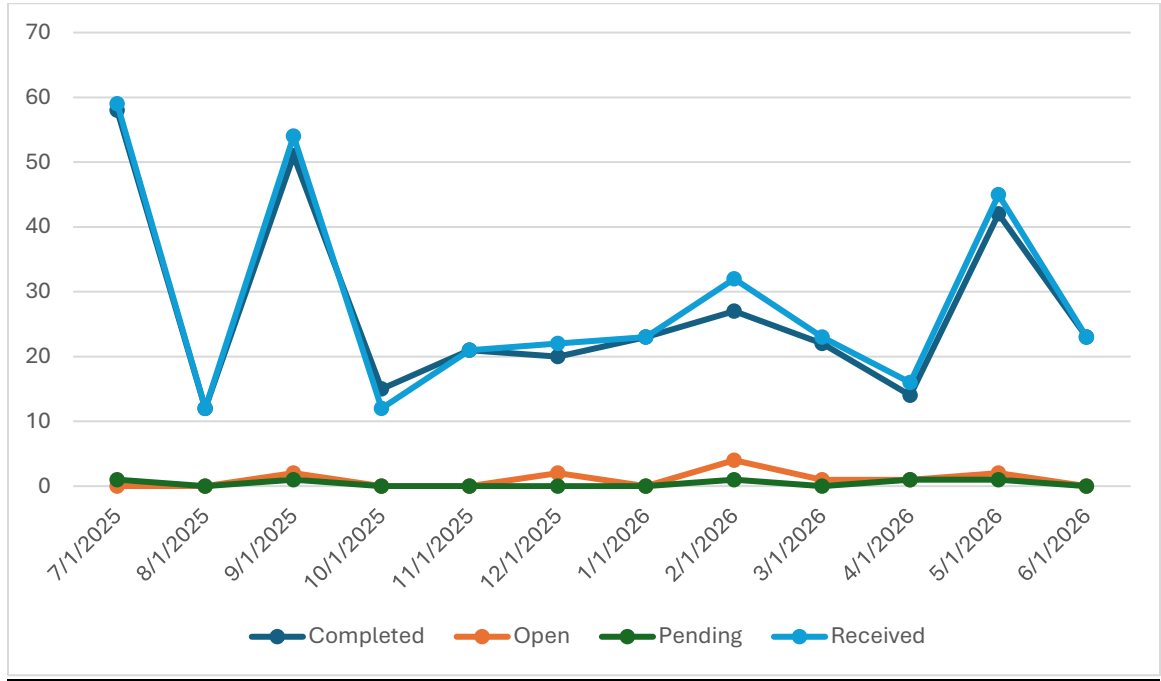

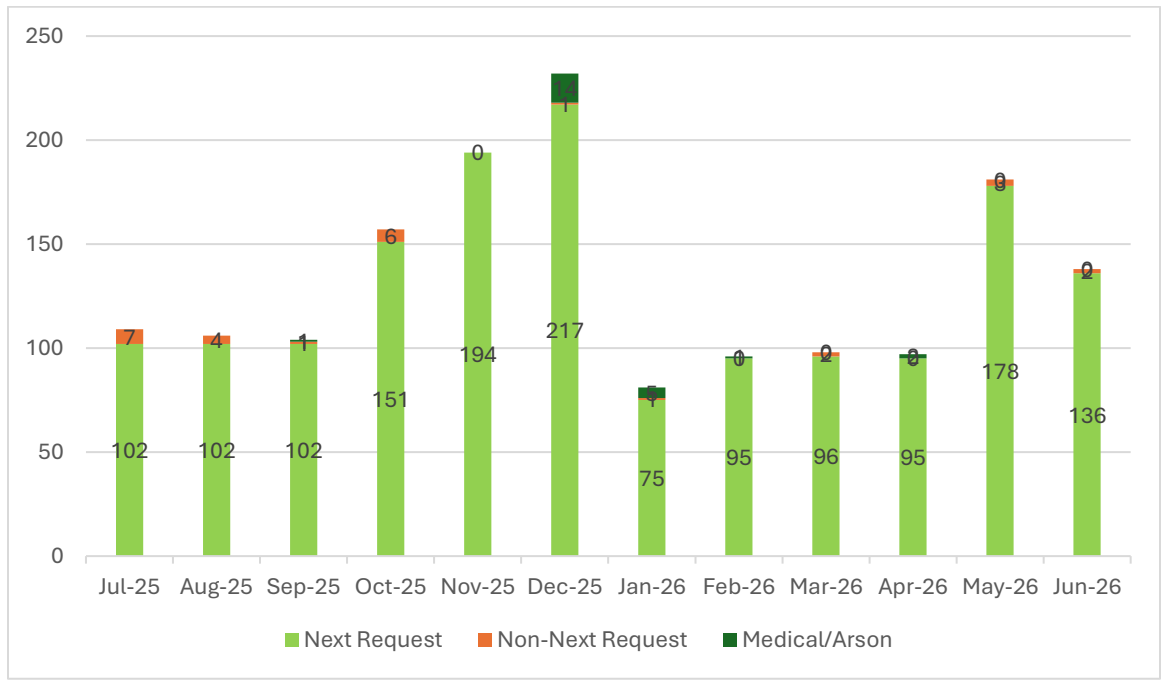

The BFI Captain is the designated Custodian of Records for all SFFD National Fire Incident Reports (NFIRS) and Fire Investigation Reports (FIR). The BFI receives and processes all Public Records requests for these reports and also contacts SFFD for court ordered subpoenas.

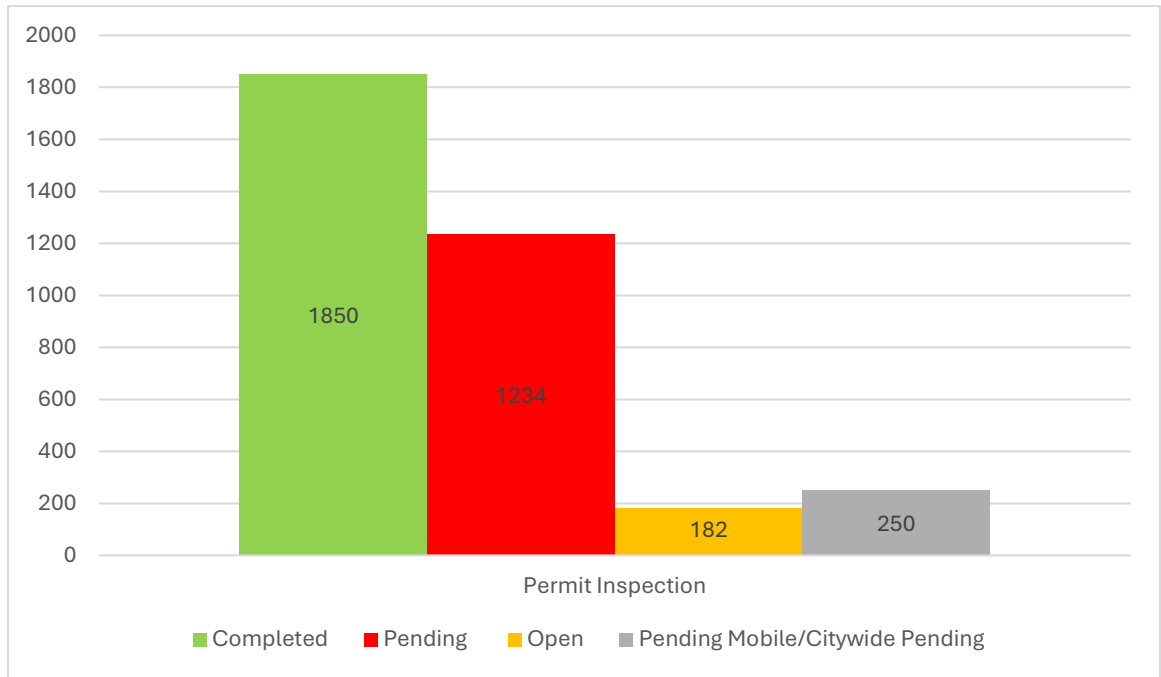

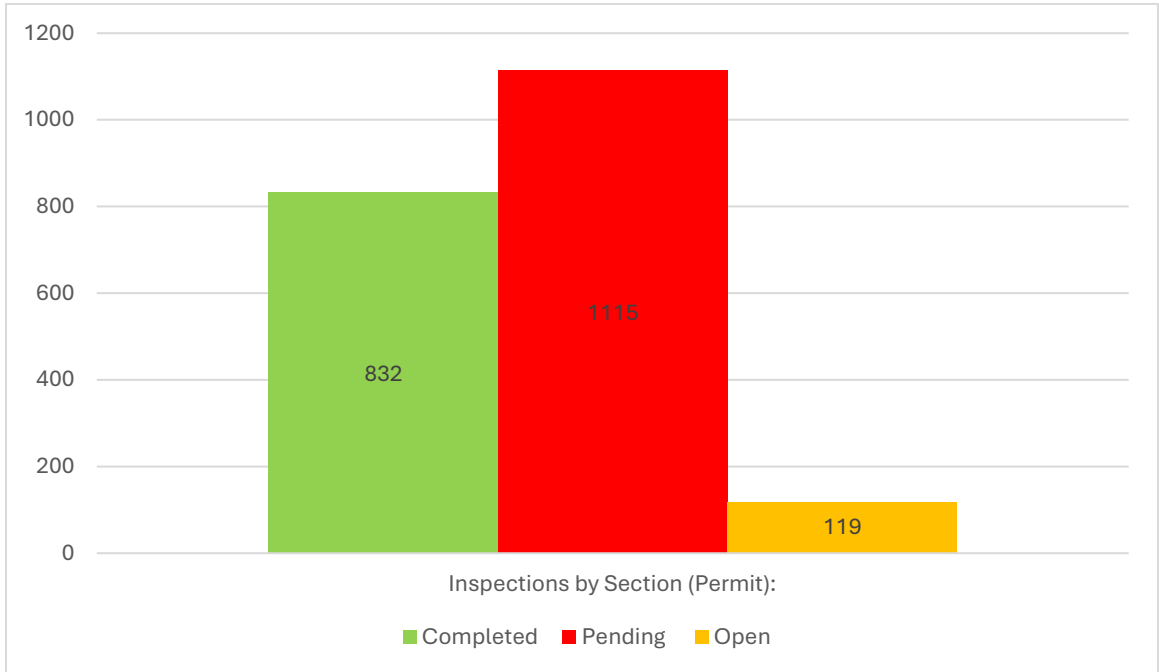

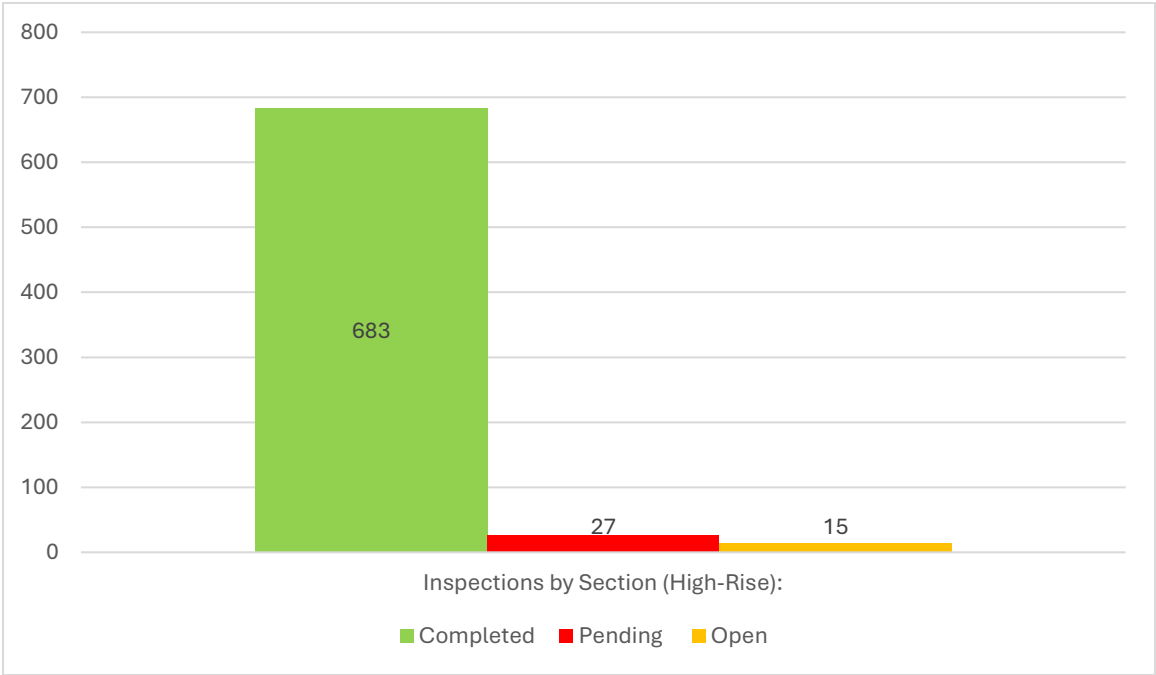

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Permits Section)



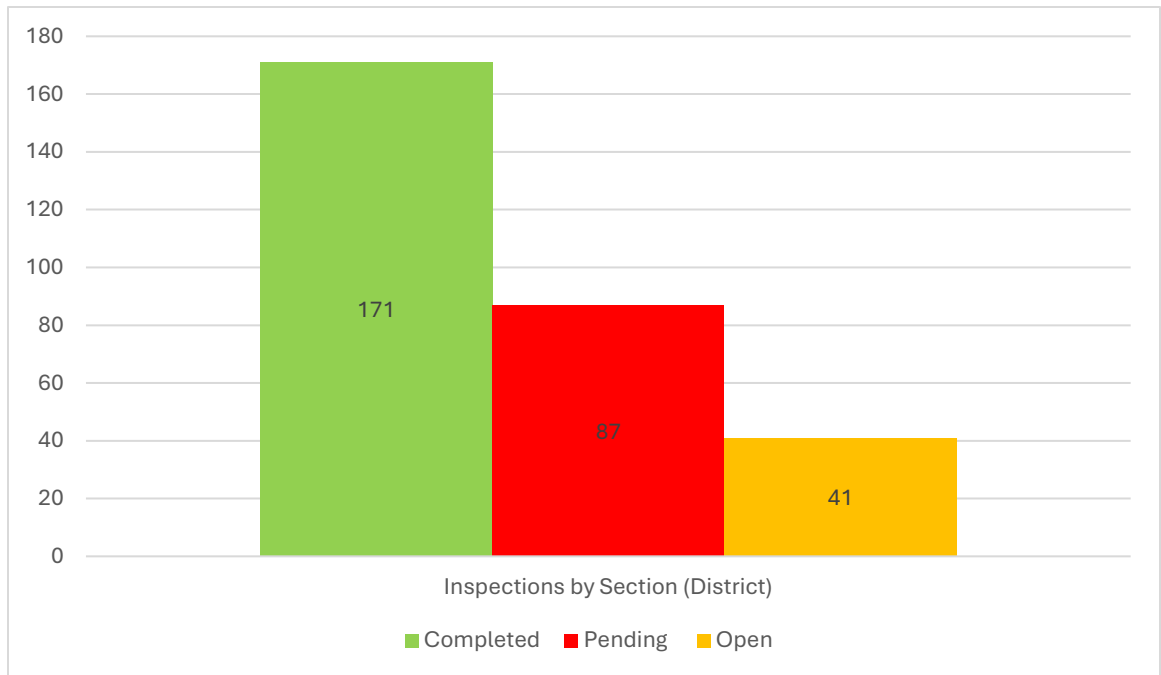

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (High-Rise)



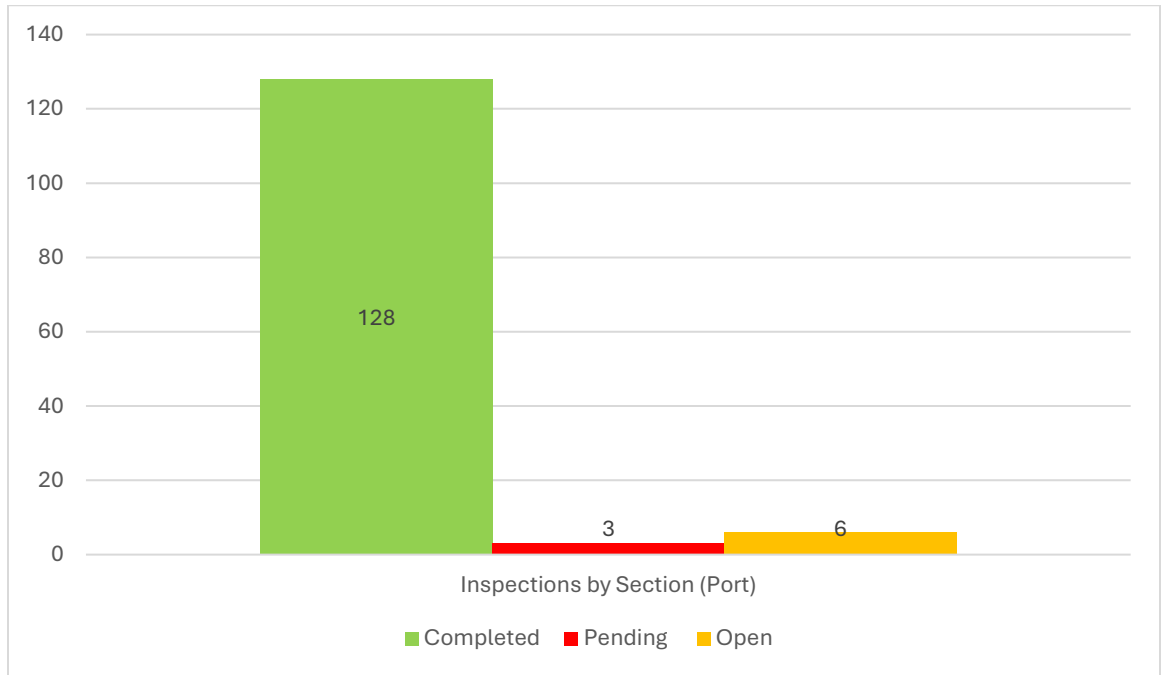

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Districts Section)



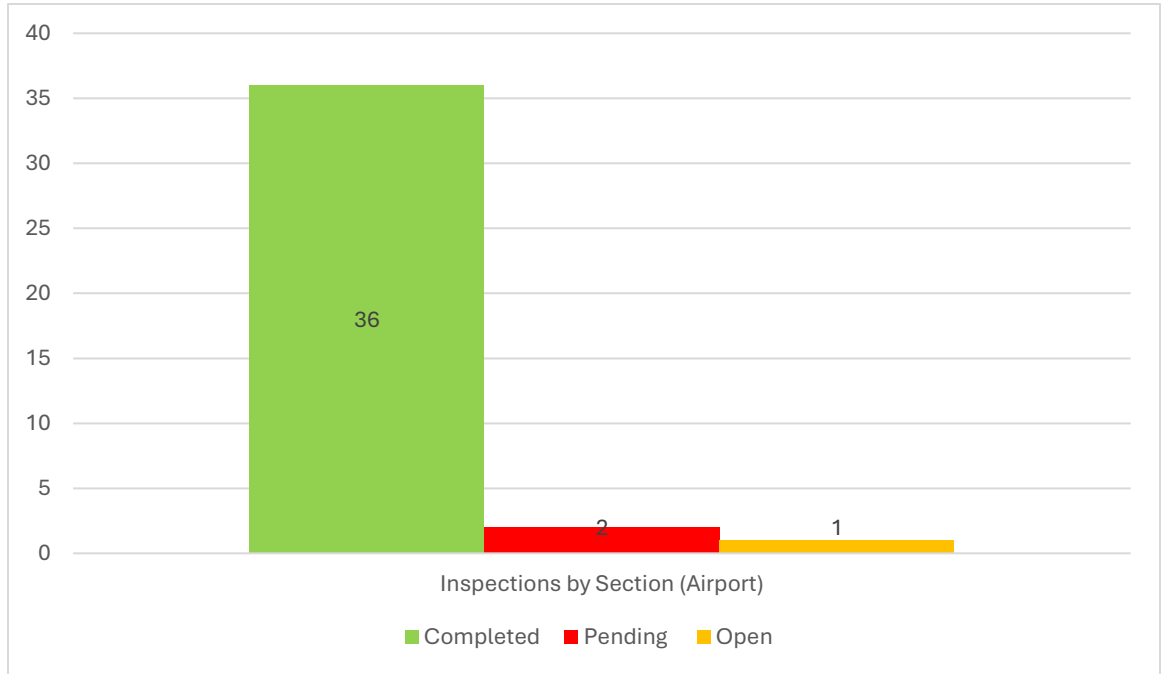

Activities and Projects:

- The 137th has graduated. We lost 3 instructors to retirement and 8 went back to field operations. We have hired a new H39 Recruit Captain and 8 more instructors. They are preparing for the start of the 138th and receiving the mandated training s instructors.
- Special Ops is conducting several drills throughout the city. Currently, they are having Rope Rescue Classes and working on logistics for upcoming drills. They secured several vacant building in Potrero Hill for Truck Operations training. Our Truck Academy Cadre has been Leading this training.
- We had Several PG and E Substation Drills and various sites through the city and trained the district companies at those sites.
- We are continuing to work with City College to develop a course for our members to be enrolled in their entire career. This will generate \$3.50 per hour of training, and I estimate will being in funds over 1 Million dollars per year for training. This is in the infancy stage bur City College is

fully invested in this program. The class should be “accepted” in August / September. It is estimated to take a year to be processed after that.

- H16 Neal Narayan has been creating training videos and rebuilding our Vector Solutions online training. These videos generate CJAC funds from our members. We will continue to publish monthly podcasts focused on training.
- The DOT is hosting several classes utilizing our own experienced members and using CJAC Funds to support this. This includes RRAO, Fire Investigation 1B, another Fire prevention Series, Public Safety Diver, Instructor 1, REO / CEET, Thermal Imaging and we are in the process of putting together Safety Officer and Elevator Rescue Training. These will all be paid for with CJAC Funds.
- In-Service staff are currently finishing our Live Fire Prop build-out. They have added a basement component with several hundred square feet added.
- In Service Training has been multiple live burns.
- We have secured an agreement with South City Lumber to purchase lumber with CJAC funds. We just purchased \$10,000 in lumber as our members are going through Plywood and Wood dowels on our training props. This is a great thing.
- The DOT held Driver/Tiller Training in June for the 135th members getting off probation.
- The DOT and the field have continued to increase their support for the Fire Reserves. We are detailing companies to assist them on Thursday Training nights. Several officers have volunteered to assist with this. We have obtained equipment for them and are searching for a dedicated legacy apparatus to give to them for training and company pride. The Recruit Staff has worked hard to bring a “Academy Culture” with discipline and organization to our program, while maintaining respect for the great work they give to us at our Greater Alarms and events. This framework will prepare them to be successful if they choose to become full time members of SFFD. They will be having AWSS Training in July with HT18.
- We have installed lighting at the tower for night training with the reserves. We will be adding a Flagpole on top of the Tower which will be a center Piece in the Mission district to represent SFFD.
- The DOT will be hosted the first ever “Land Based Marine Firefighting” class in June. This will prepare us for Shipboard firefighting as it is such a Low Frequency- High Risk event. This will be funded by State OES taught by the Industry Leaders and specially developed for SFFD resources and Operations. We are working on having additional classes.
- DOT Folsom Ventilation Training Props have been reimagined and enhanced to bring more options and efficiency. We are currently making a video to inform the field of the changes. Special thanks to the members of Station 7 for their assistance and ingenuity. We will continue to enhance the training options at the Folsom Tower.
- I am currently working with BC Alba to start a fitness program for our field members. This will bring in many CJAC hours. Several members in the field have offered assistance to make monthly fitness programs specialized for firefighting and EMS operation in collaboration with the Physicians Office.
- The Vehicle Extrication Cadre has had several exercises at DOT Folsom and is continuing as we move forward.

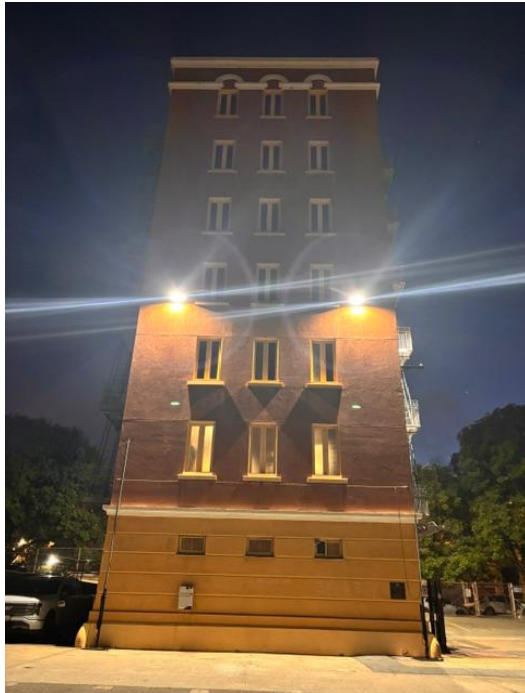

May / June 2026 Monthly Report

In May, Special Operations began the first ever in-house instruction of Rope Rescue Operations & Awareness (RRAO) to 24 SFFD city firefighters. It is the first time we were able to give actual state fire certifications and be taught by an exclusively SFFD cadre. It took us about year and lots of support from the administration, Chief Kasper, A/Lt. Lauren Canning, and CJAC funds to get to this point. Special Operations plans to continue to offer this training at least 4 times annually. This is important as RRAO is the pre-requisite class for all technical rescue disciplines. Being able to instruct in-house will save the SFFD money and strengthen our position to train our members.

Special Operations continues to make contacts and collaborating with outside agencies. FF Jason Harrell (retired) has been instrumental for fostering and re-vitalizing collaborative relationships with Bay Area agencies. We continue to meet and training collaboratively with the Golden Gate Bridge Authority and Southern Marin Fire. For the first time ever, SFFD units were allowed to access the Suicide Net on the Golden Gate Bridge for realistic training mid-span (light pole 62) over the water on two separate weekends. Station 14, B07, and both our Rescue Squads were able to experience first hand the high wind, fog, traffic, and being suspended 220' in air that makes this rescue so dangerous. It was a huge success and will lay the groundwork for future collaborations in training.

In June, Special Operations was able to train the newest 48 members of the SFFD with RRAO. This is the first time since the 119th class when LARRO was taught to a recruit class. This feat was only accomplished through flexibility and dedication of our rope instructor cadre who sacrificed time and energy to make it happen. Hopefully, a RRAO certification will become the new normal when graduating an SFFD recruit class.

Special Operations had the opportunity to access the Potrero Hill Housing Projects currently being demolished. With Chief Kasper and FF Jason Harrell's legwork, we were able to conduct realistic hands-on truck training with our Truck companies in the field. Captain Ed Vail (Truck 9) was able to assemble instructors from the SFFD Truck academy to put on one of the most valuable and pertinent interior and roof operational drills in recent memory. Truck companies were given 90 minutes to practice cutting techniques on the roof and chase down a fire in the walls from the interior.

Lastly, I need to mention that Special Operations also coordinated safety orientations with the Bernal Heights Medical construction project with all companies from Battalion 6. Rescue Squad 1 continues to partner with SFFD Dive unit for joint training. Auto Extrication instruction for Truck companies continues every Friday per the drill schedule. FF/PM Steve Marcotte (retired) continues to train with B02 and Station 36 for Hazmat readiness and response. Special Operations assisted the Asian Firefighter Association with a youth academy event for high school students where they were introduced to knots, ladders, rescue carries and fire extinguishers.

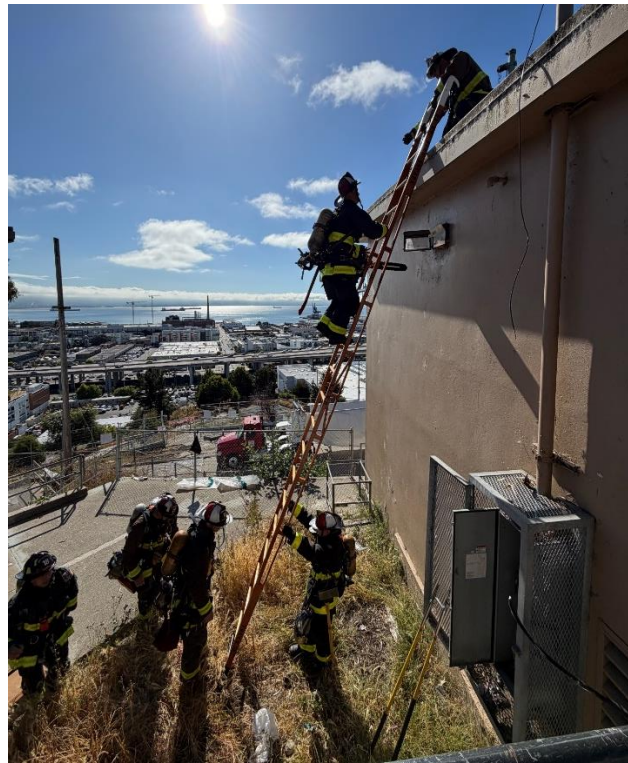

Basement fire prop metal fire rooms are complete; in-service created two separate wooden smoke rooms for the basement prop. The design for the search rooms is complete and being built with an estimated completion time of mid-May. Burn box #1 and #2 were taken out of service for repair and redesign while TITF is being used for other agency training. In service is cleaning and getting ready for the new academy class. PG&E is preparing another disaster drill to be held in July and In Service has been tasked with assisting in the build of large room with transformers, a device that creates “safe” explosions and a gas fire prop. The disaster drill will be on the grounds of TITF with downed power line prop and live burns. Golden Gate Bridge authority went through the burn room again and also trained on auto extrication and electric vehicle fires, SFPD was involved in some burn room, SCBA, and safety training, all training was conducted and supported by In-service training. There was another truck academy, and engine academy, a marine firefighter school, rope rescue class, and arson investigation class all held at TITF.

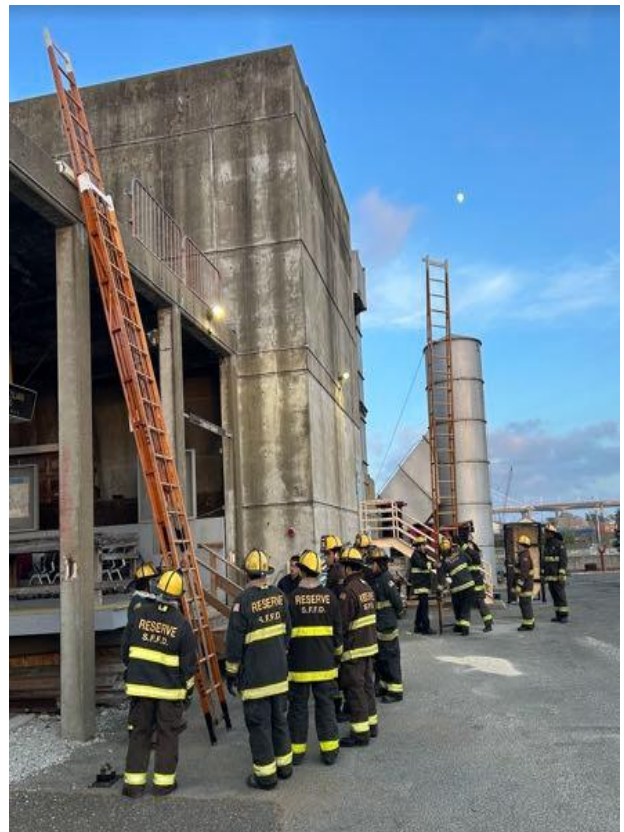
