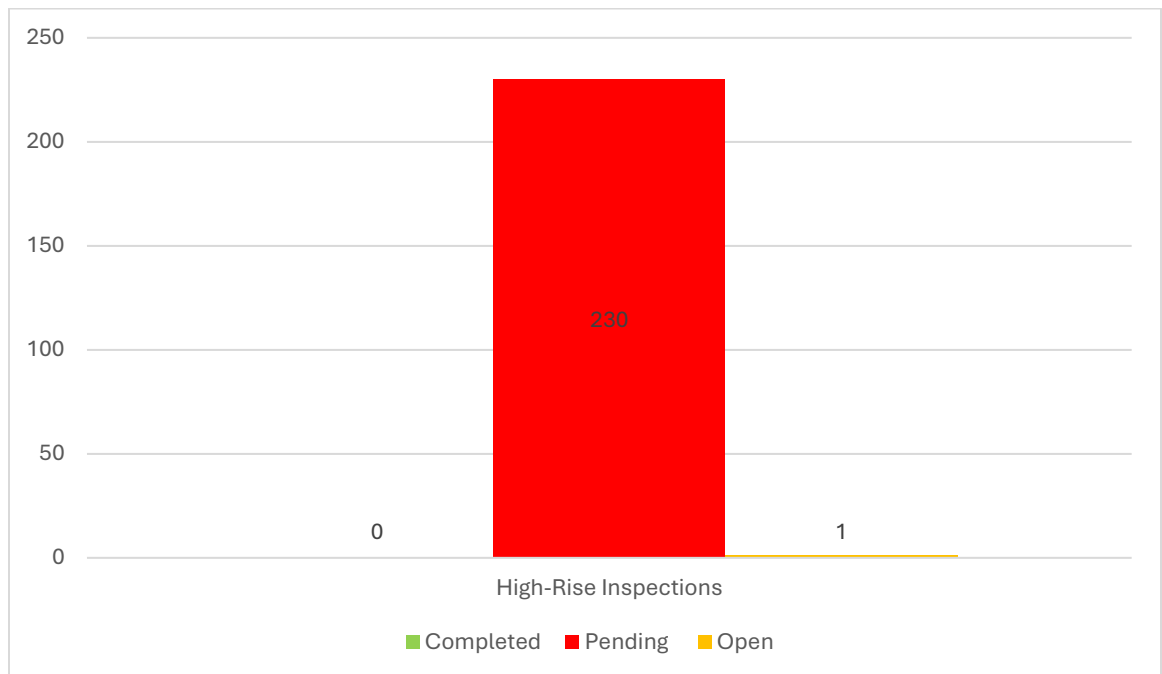

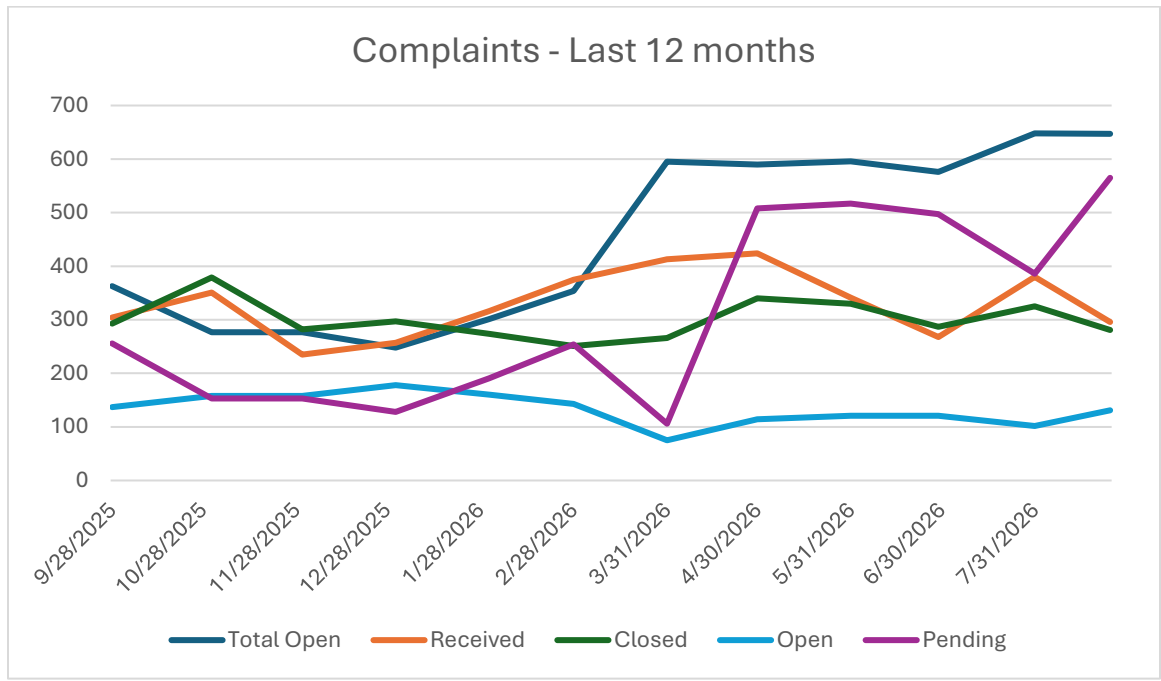

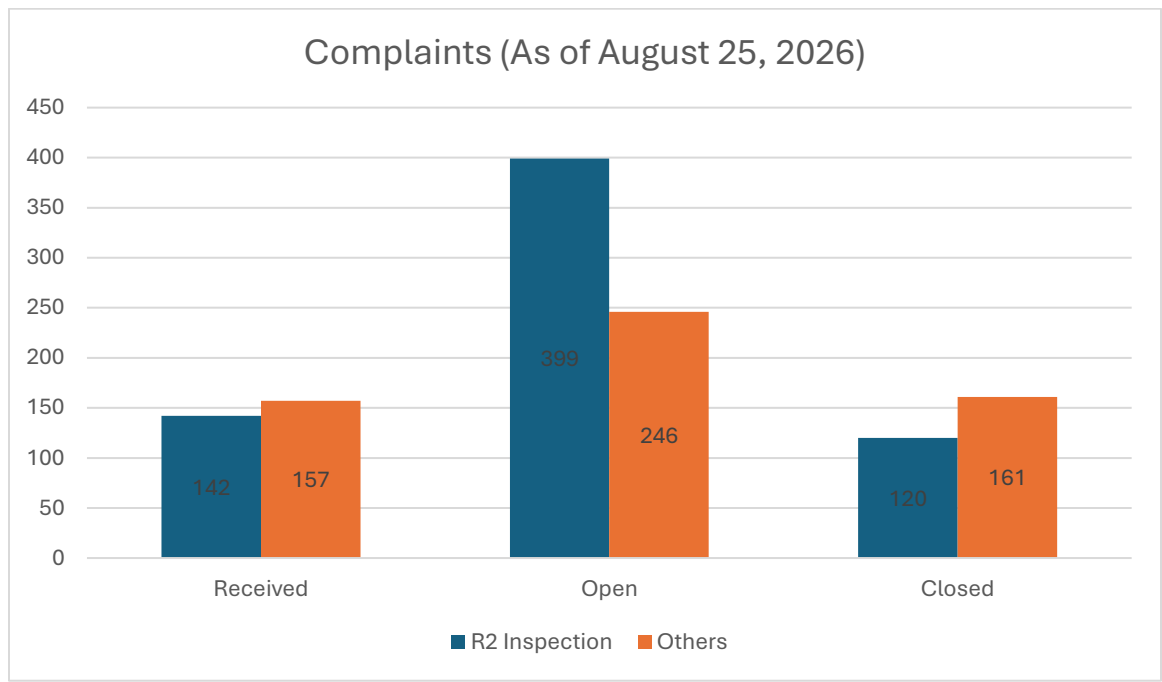

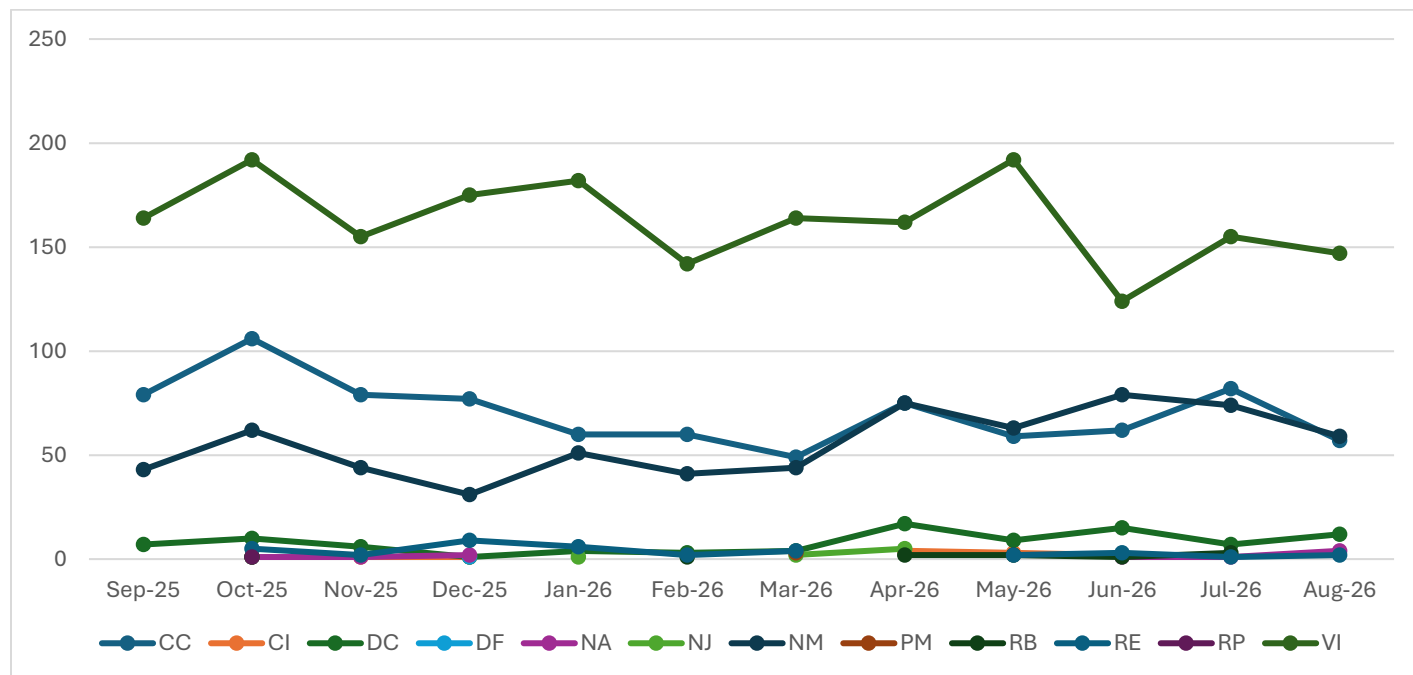

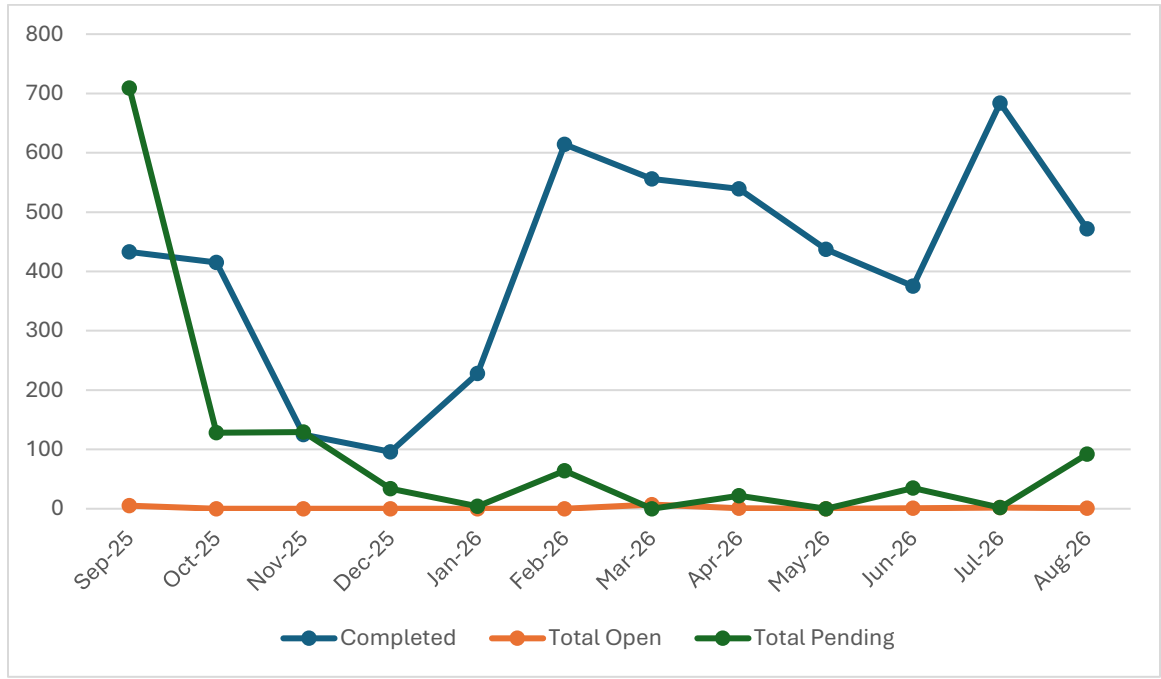

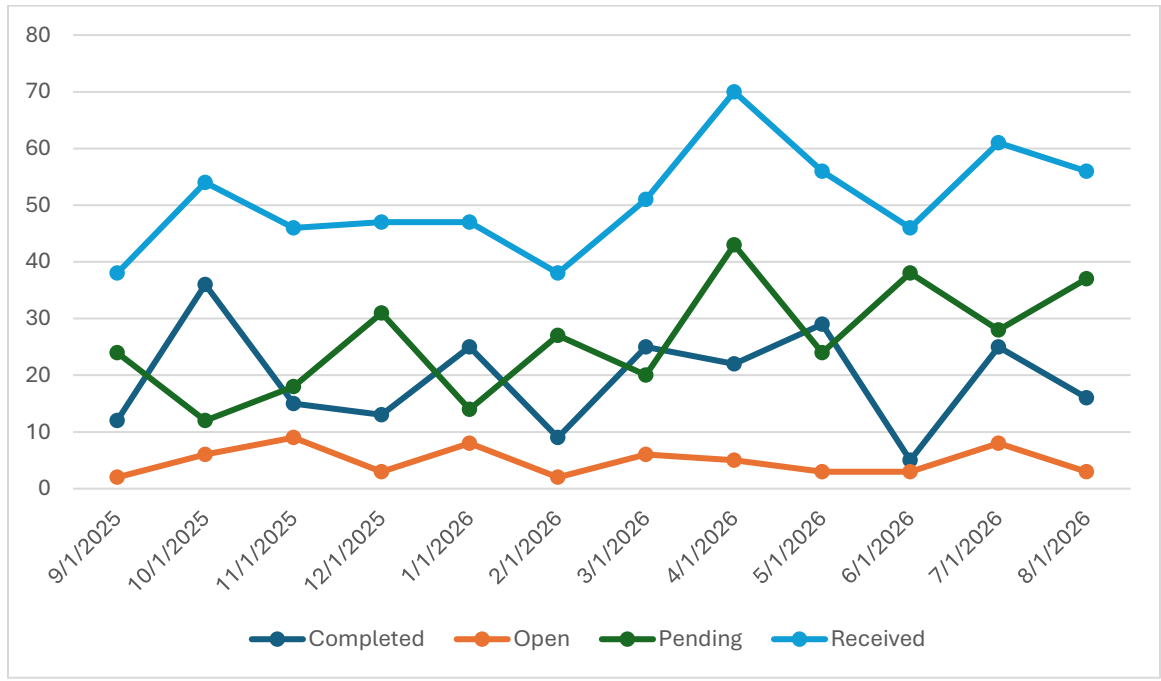
Overall Annual R1/R2 Inspections (2026)

Residential Buildings w/ 9+ units for last 12 months



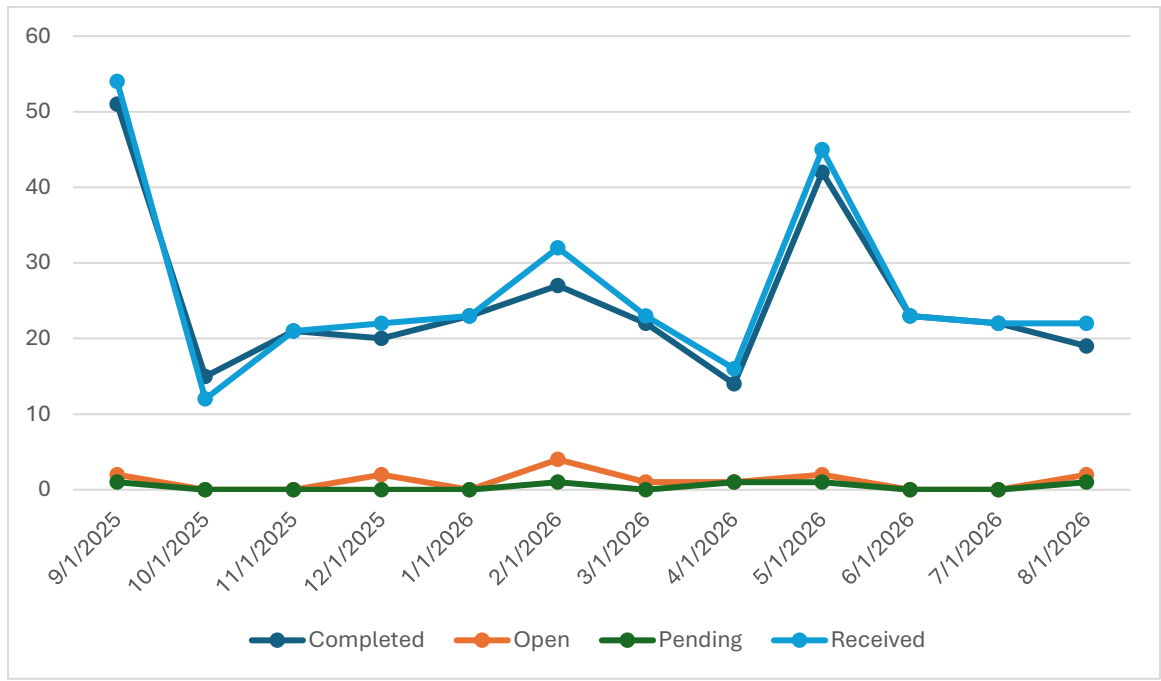

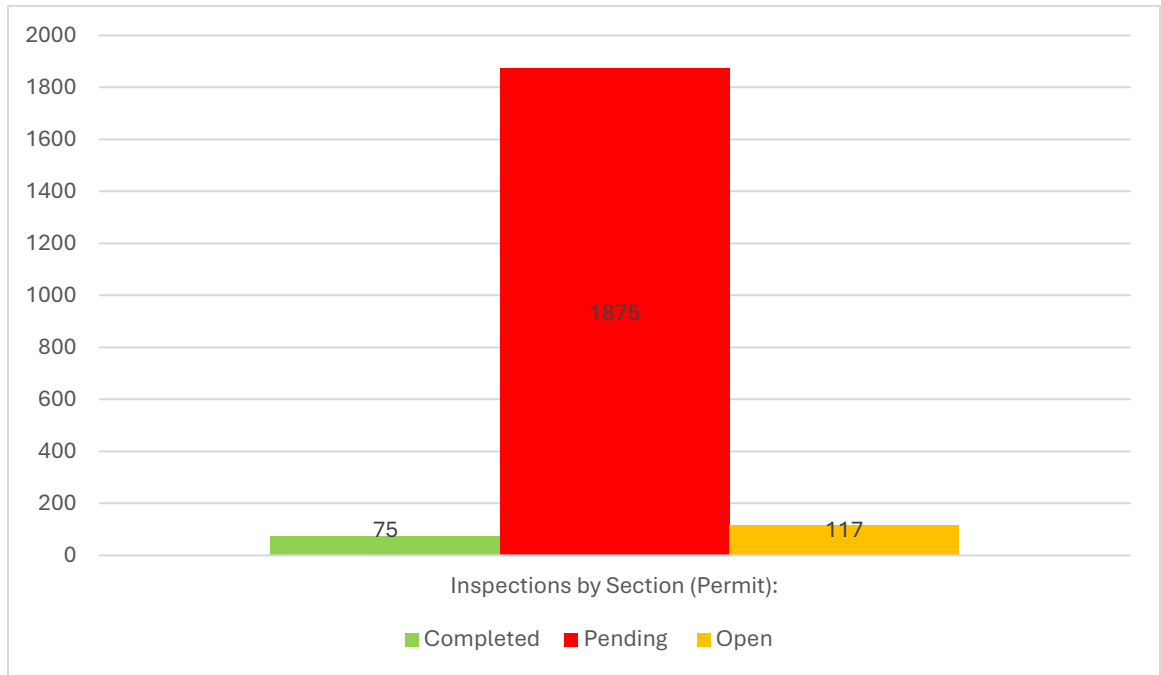

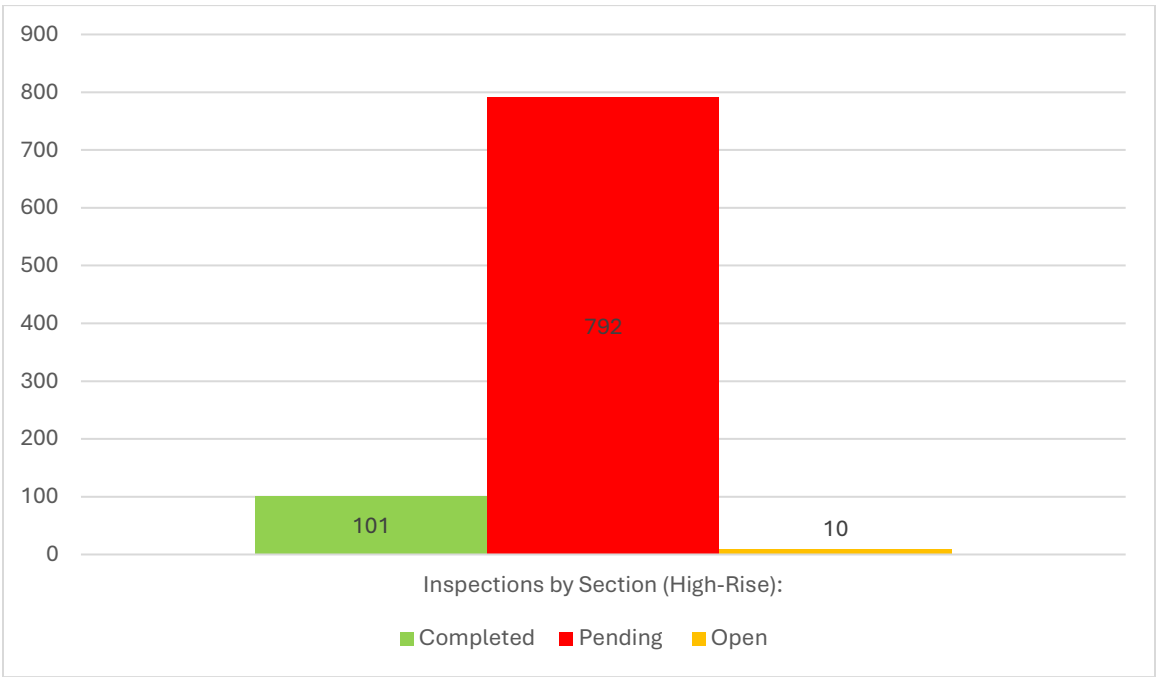

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Permits Section)



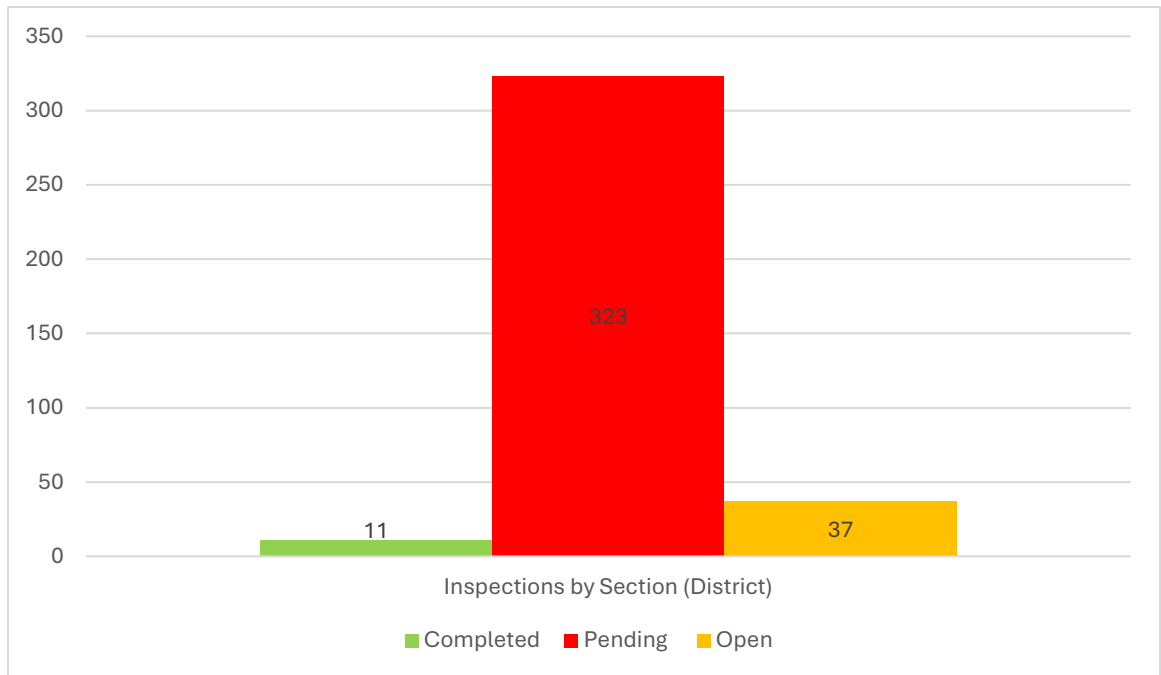

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (High-Rise)



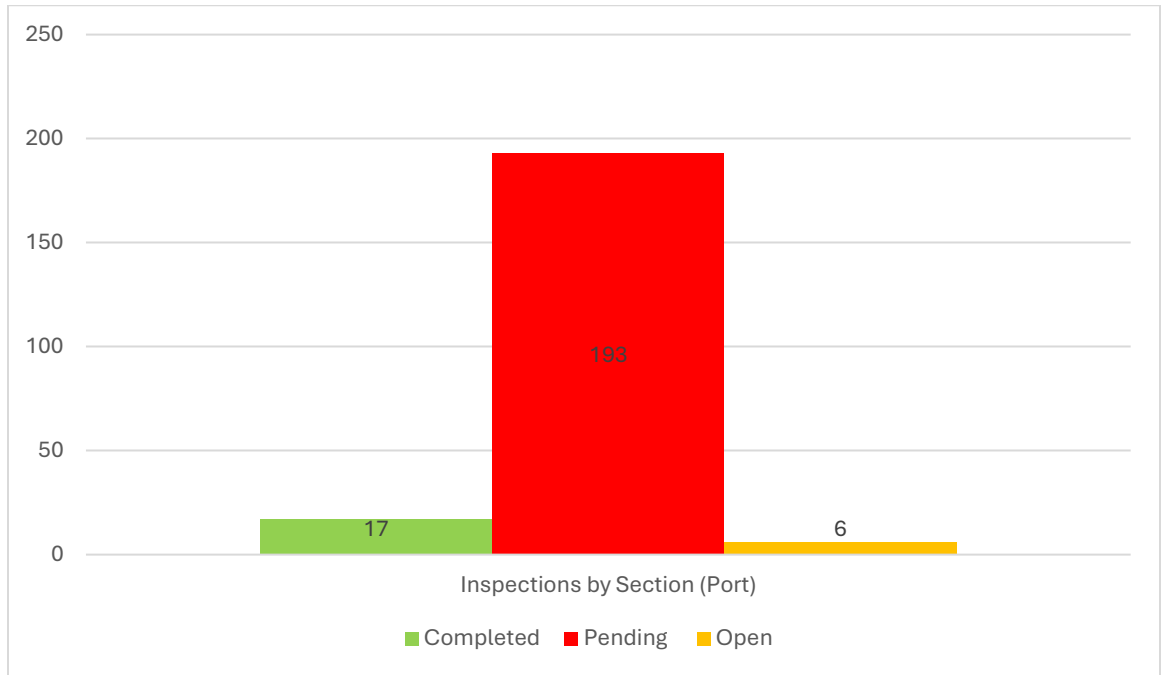

Permit Annual Inspections by Section (Districts Section)



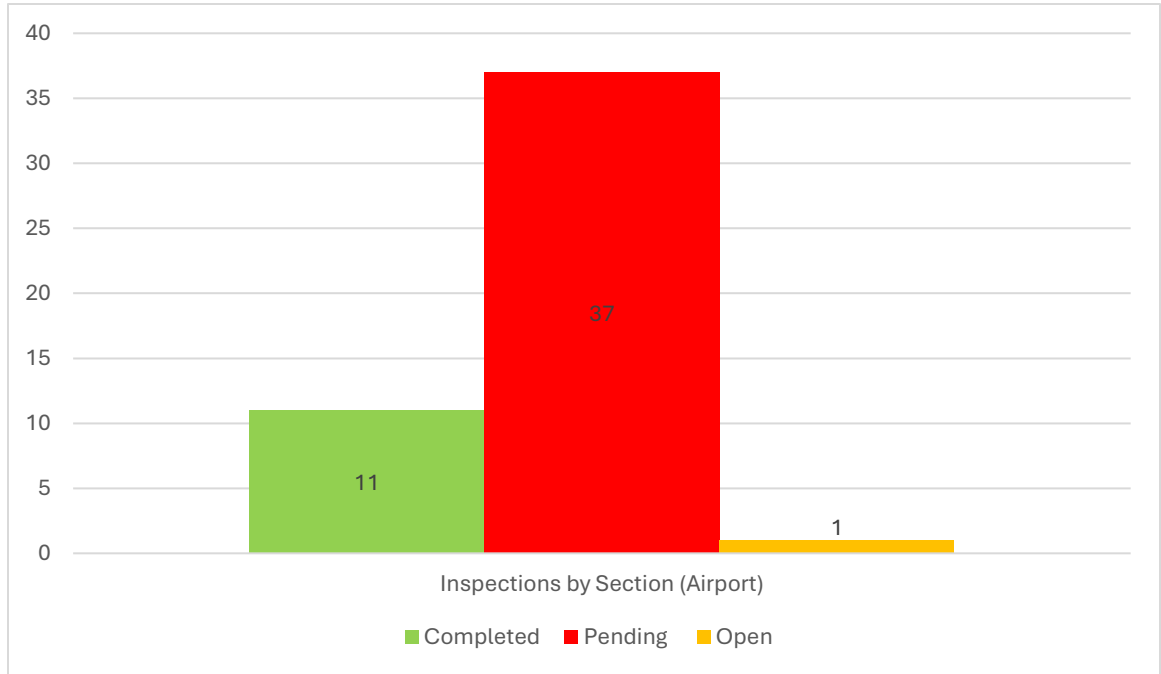

Activities and Projects:

- The 138th is in full swing. We currently have 50 recruits.
- Special Ops are conducting several drills throughout the city. Currently, they are preparing for Advanced Rope Operations at the Dry Docks with our Rescue Squads. They just completed Large Area Search at 77 Beale St which was very successful. The building used was acquired through our collaboration with SFPD.
- We had several PG & E Substation Drills and various sites through the city and trained the district companies at those sites.
- We are continuing to work with City College to develop a course for our members to be enrolled in their entire career. This will generate \$3.50 per hour of training, and I estimate will bring in funds over 1 Million dollars per year for training. This is moving forward fast and City College is fully invested in this program. The class should be “accepted” in August / September. It is estimated to take a year to be processed after that.
- H16 Neal Narayan has been creating training videos and rebuilding our Vector Solutions online training. These videos generate CJAC funds from our members. We will be releasing videos on alternate ladder raises very soon.
- The DOT is hosting several classes utilizing our own experienced members and using CJAC Funds to support this. This includes RRAO, Fire Investigation for managers, another Fire prevention Series, Public Safety Diver, Instructor 1 and 2, and Incident Safety Officer. We recently had Thermal Imaging, and we are in the process of putting together Elevator Rescue Training. These will be paid for with CJAC Funds.
- In-Service staff is gearing up for a training module that starts 9/8. This will be basement fires where a state of the art simulator was built which will have heavy smoke, low heat, and live fire. We will integrate victim rescue and Thermal Imaging into this module.
- In Service Training has been having multiple live burns.
- The CJAC funds continue to fund lumber, Props, and classes for the excessive training ongoing in the field.
- We had a commemorative plaque placed on the Folsom Tower to rename it the Jason A. Cortez Training Tower honoring his dedication and service to our fire department. We will honor him on 10/7 which is the anniversary of his accident and death.
- The DOT and the field have continued to increase their support for the Fire Reserves. We are detailing companies to assist them on Thursday training nights. Several officers have volunteered to assist with this. The Recruit Staff has worked hard to bring a “Academy Culture” with discipline and organization to our program, while maintaining respect for the great work they give to us at our Greater Alarms and events. This framework will prepare them to be successful if they choose to become full time members of SFFD. They completed AWSS Training in July with front line crews and Hose Tenders.
- The Division of Training has started the process of preparing for 6 months of In Service Training after graduation of the 138th. It is imperative the planning process begins now to ensure we implement an excellent, realistic program to bring advanced training to our members.
- DOT Folsom Ventilation Training Props have been reimaged and enhanced to bring more options and efficiency. We are currently making a video to inform the field of the changes. Special thanks to the members of Station 7 for their assistance and ingenuity. We will continue to enhance the training options at the Folsom Tower.

- I am currently working with BC Alba to start a fitness program for our field members. This will bring in many CJAC hours. Several members in the field have offered assistance to make monthly fitness programs specialized for firefighting and EMS operation in collaboration with the Physician's Office.
- The Vehicle Extrication Cadre has had several exercises at DOT Folsom and is continuing as we move forward.

Special Operations Training
Division Update July / August 2026

July was a month to build, repair and prepare our props for the drills to come. A portable Vent Enter Search prop was built off the back of the DOT pick up truck. This prop will be used to train ladder rescue, VES operations, and FF Emergency bailout procedures. There were four additional mannequins created for upcoming large area search where expect to have a mass casualty simulated event.

Special Operations made contacts with the managers of the Oakland Arena, PG&E high rise facility on 77 Beale Street, Sutro Tower, and the Presidio Trust to arrange future collaborative training.

Truck companies continue to participate in the Auto Extrication 101 instruction every Friday from 0900-1200 hours.

Both Rescue Squads made dive entries into the bay practicing search patterns. The dive committee is also bringing newer rescue squad members up to speed with the current Public Safety Diver requirements.

On 7/28, our Hazmat team (E36 and B02) participated in a multi-agency (FBI, 96th civil support team, US Army, Southern Marin Fire) at the lighthouse in Marin Headlands.

Special Operations also worked with the Transit committee to cross train the members of T11, T15, and T19 for the BART elevated platform fire and rescue scenario.

All Rope Rescue Awareness and Operations equipment caches were reorganized and cleaned.

In **August**, Special Operation focused on Hazmat operations. For three consecutive days, companies came to the DOT yard to investigate, assess, investigate, and mitigate a simulated hazmat emergency. Battalion Chiefs had the opportunity to command all aspects of this technical rescue operations from initial call to the decontamination phase.

Special Operations were also involved with the safety walk through of the hazardous materials storage and water treatment plan facility at the Presidio Trust. The pre-plan included the Captain of E51, the crew, and B03.

Our biggest training days happened on 8/19 through 8/21 with successful results. Over 3 days, Special Operations facilitated 12 high rise large area search drills with 48 rigs and 180 members. Units were to rescue and evacuate over 12 victims from a zero visibility smoke filled environment. BC's were in command. The rescue squad and trucks deployed ropes as anchors and the engine companies supported with man power. General feedback for this search drill has been positive as we do not get the opportunity to practice these skills due to site accessibility and conditions.

Lastly, Special Operations assisted with the TJPA Salesforce Transit Center Full Scale Exercise on the night from 8/26 to the morning of 8/27. We secured 12 victims (dummies) and a smoke machine for the event. Captain Yee was on the 3rd floor as a safety/evaluator and observed as our units interacted with a simulated burning EV bus with casualties.

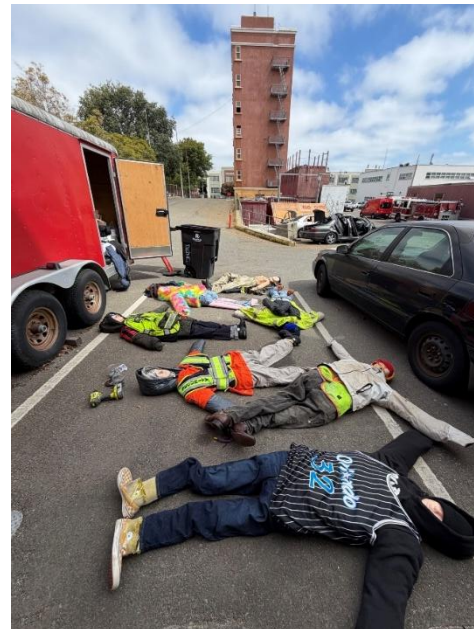

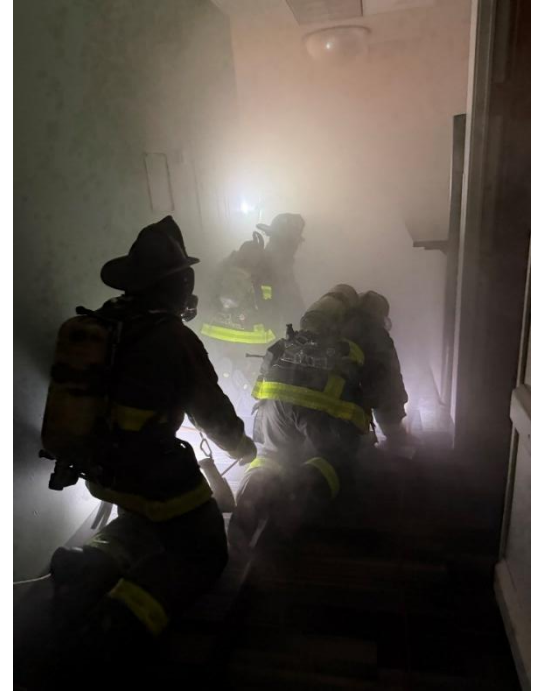

Basement fire prop metal fire rooms are being tested; in-service created two separate wooden rooms for the basement prop which will be staged as bedrooms with rescues. The search rooms are complete, one as a residence the other as a wide area search. Burn box #1 and #2 are back in service and live fire training has resumed. In service is cleaning and maintaining the grounds for the current academy class. PG&E's disaster drill in July was a huge success and In Service supported the build of large room with transformers with a device that creates "safe" explosions and a gas fire prop. The disaster drill props on the grounds of TITF with downed power line prop and live burns were left in place for the SFFD so that we may continue training. In service is preparing for another truck academy, engine academy, rope rescue class, and arson investigation class are all held at TITF.

We have installed a speaker system to enhance the training on the fire ground, generating "sounds of a fire scene".

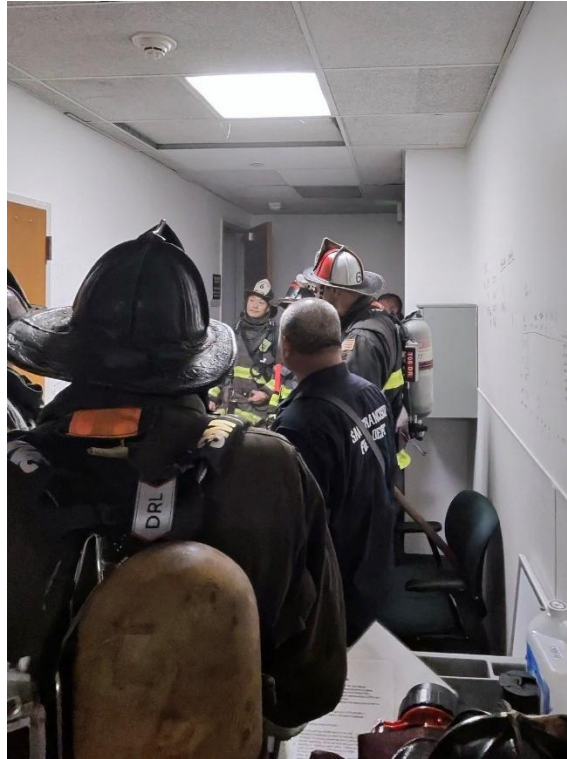
