







Fire Commission & SFFD Oversight

- Fire Auxiliary Reserve created under Section 7.11 of SF Administrative Code (1950)
- Fire Reserve is governed by:
 - SF Fire Commission
 - SFFD regulations
 - All state laws applicable to reserve firefighters
- Within the SFFD, FR is under the control of the Division of Training
 - Assistant Dep. Chief Jeff Columbini

SF Fire Auxiliary Reserve Timeline Highlights

World War II Era

- Nov. 24, 1941: SF Auxiliary Fire Service (AFS) organized by SF Civilian Defense Council
- Dec. 7, 1941: Pearl Harbor & WWII
- Dec. 1943: 6,000 men had received AFS training

Korean War Era

 Aug. 14, 1950: Fire Auxiliary Reserve reorganized under SF Disaster Council as part of Civil Defense efforts

Post War Era

- Apr. 1, 1981: Fire Auxiliary Reserve transferred to the supervision of SFFD Bureau of Training (now DOT)
- Nov. 3, 1986: Proposition A bond issue to improve SF firefighting capabilities, including PWSS, passed with FR promotional help
- Oct. 7, 1989: Loma Prieta Earthquake Emergency
- Aug. 23, 2016: SF Fire & Police Reserve 75th Anniversary



















Supporting SFFD & Community for more than 75 years

At full strength with 52 members, FR provides SFFD with staffing equivalent of an additional 8 Engine and 4 Truck Companies (equal to approximately 2 Battalions)

Support SFFD at Greater Alarms and large scale incidents, including:

- Loma Prieta Earthquake (1989)
- Mission Bay 5th Alarm (2014)

FR also supports SFFD at community events, including:

- NERT
- SFFF Toy Program
- Guardians of the City
- Kimochi Elder Service
- Habitat for Humanity
- EMT support at Giants' parades

- Fire Reserve trains every Thursday from 7-9 pm at SFFD Training Center on T.I.
- Fire Reserve Academy began Feb. 2, 2017 and scheduled for completion July 20, 2017
- 52-hour FR academy follows abridged curriculum of SFFD H2 Academy
- Reservists required to have EMT license, CPR card, CA Driver's license, SF Residency






Final Thoughts
