SAFETY FAIR: 9am-1pm

San Francisco Fire Department's enhanced Fire Prevention and Education Team promotes Fire Safety through Community Outreach and Education. This is an effort to engage the communities we serve with their local Firefighters, EMT's and Paramedics.

MOBILE COMMAND: 9am-4pm

This event is hosted by the San Francisco Fire and Police Departments and supported by the California Fire Chiefs Association Communications Section. Public safety and emergency personnel and volunteers from around Northern California will participate in the 11th Annual California Mobile Command Center Expo (CA MCC Expo, formerly California Mobile Command Center Rally).

This is a free mobile communications/ command vehicle demonstration and educational event for public safety personnel held on Thursday, April 18th 9AM to 4PM. The event is in San Francisco at Oracle Park (formerly AT&T Park), Parking Lot A, 3rd Street @ Mission Rock St, just south of the ballpark.

Field Communicators, remote communications Unit Leaders, Incident Commanders, Patrol Supervisors, incident Dispatchers and Technicians, Emergency Managers, and other public safety professionals and volunteers will be able to tour state-of-the-art command and communications resources that are available in the area and obtain a better understanding of Incident Management for large scale operations and all-risk incidents.

The focus of the year's MCC Expo is on *Disaster Preparedness and Management*. In addition to the apparatus displays, there will also be several classroom

presentations relevant to this focus – as well as numerous technology vendors displaying a wide variety of emergency management equipment.

In recognition of the 113th anniversary of the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake, the MCC Expo is being held on April 18th in conjunction with several other memorial activities, including the annual commemoration ceremony held at 5:12 AM at the historic Lotta's Fountain in downtown San Francisco.

As a public safety sponsored and hosted event, there is no charge for visitors to attend or participate in the MCC Expo.
