WHAT is a Battalion Safety Fair?



The San Francisco Fire Department is conducting Community Safety Fairs throughout the year in each of our 10 Battalions.

This is an effort to engage the communities we serve with their local Firefighters, EMT's and Paramedics, to allow local communities to meet the members of their nearby Fire Stations, and to provide them with an overview of what we do.

Why do we do the Battalion Safety Fairs?

To help promote our Fire and Safety Education Programs

To foster a relationship with our local fire station neighbors, and communities.

To bring Safety material to a focused location, rather than having the community go to a stationary location.

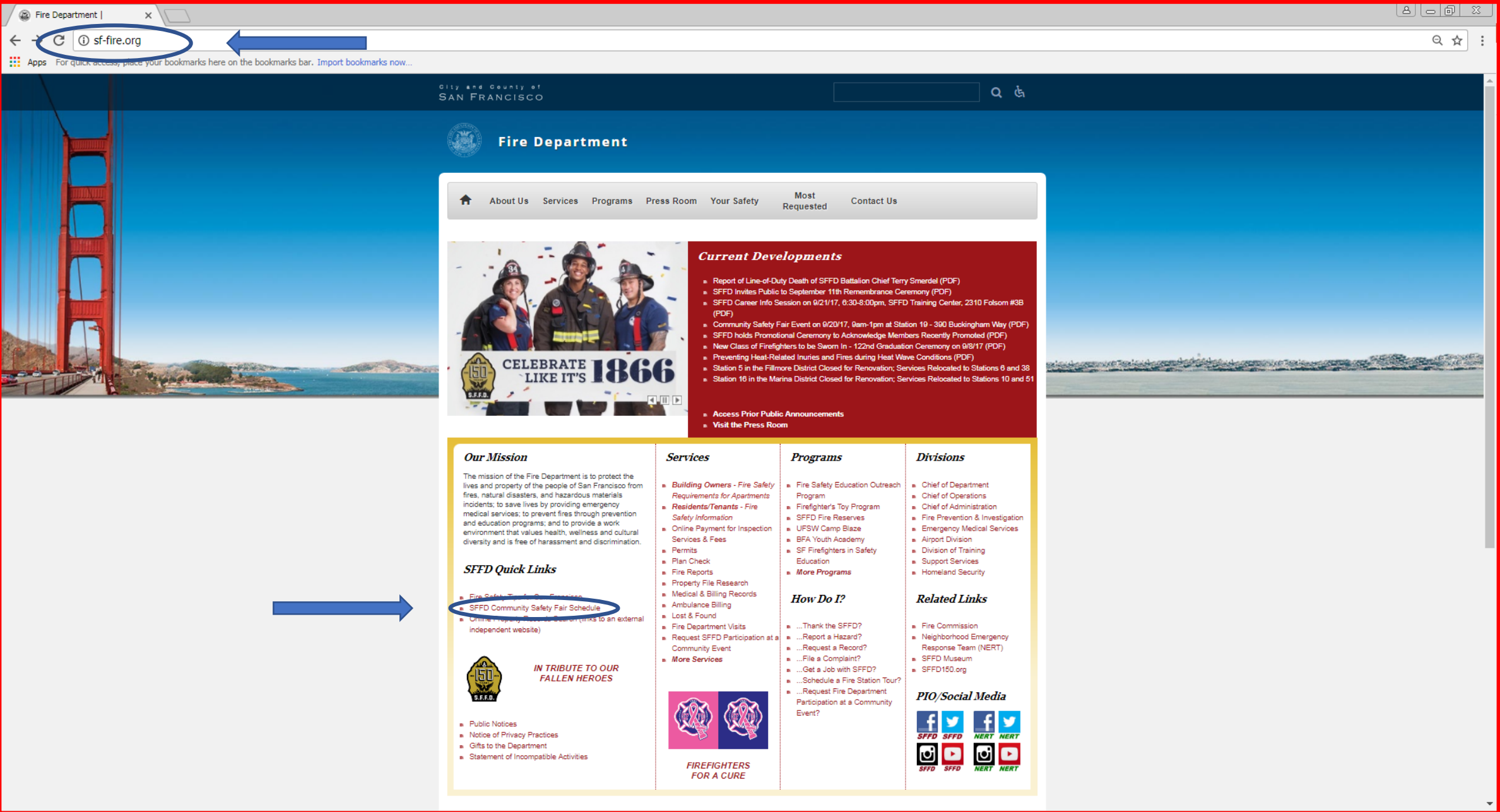

Free Smoke detectors will be available while supplies last to residents of San Francisco. 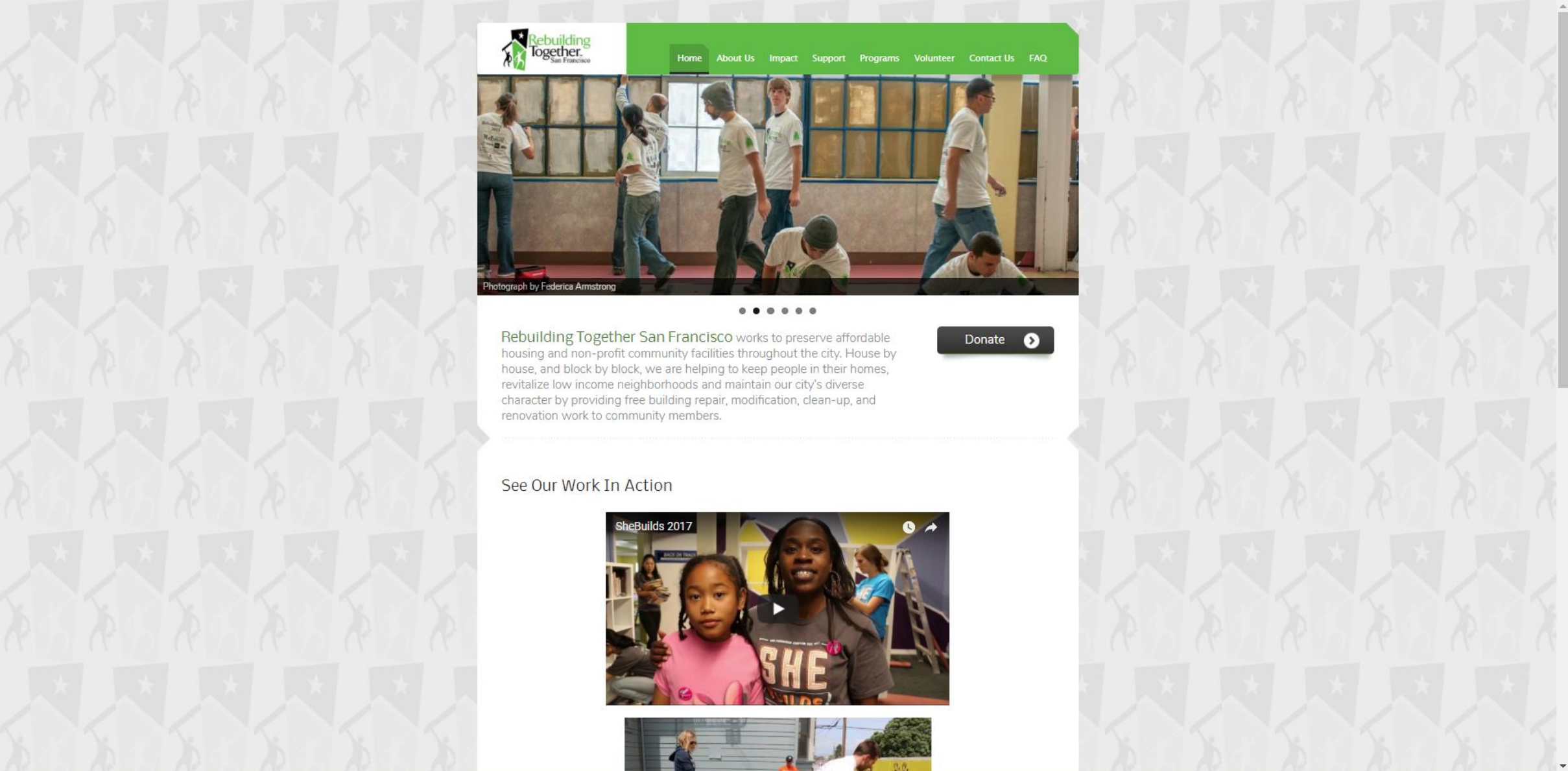
